One-story rectangular log building with side gable roof with composition roofing and overhanging eaves. Tall red brick chimney on façade. Walls composed of round logs laid horizontally with flattened tops and bottoms. Corners are unnotched. Gable ends clad with diagonal boards. Raised foundation is stuccoed and has two-light basement windows with window wells. Façade (south) has center entrance with double flush panel doors facing concrete stoop and steps with metal pipe railings. Four sets of paired 1/1-light double-hung sash windows and single window on façade with plain wood surrounds. Full-height brick chimney. Plaque on building reads, "In memory of Jack

Hamilton & Roman Fisher 1949."

35. Historical Background:

Salida's first Boy Scoutmaster was a blacksmith named Fred Granger, according to local historian Cynthia Pasquale. In about 1911, the Scouts met in the town hall. In the early years of the organization in Salida as many as 74 members participated in Scouting activities. The Salida Elks were very active supporters of the Boy Scouts and were responsible for construction of the Scout Hut. A plaque on the building records the date 1949, although Pasquale reports that construction took place during the period 1947-50. She notes that key people involved in the construction project included Doc Hoover, Ed Touber, Fred Paquette, Walt Burlson, and Roman Fisher, "who built the structure nail by nail." Today, the building continues to serve as a Scout hut, as well as a community hall.

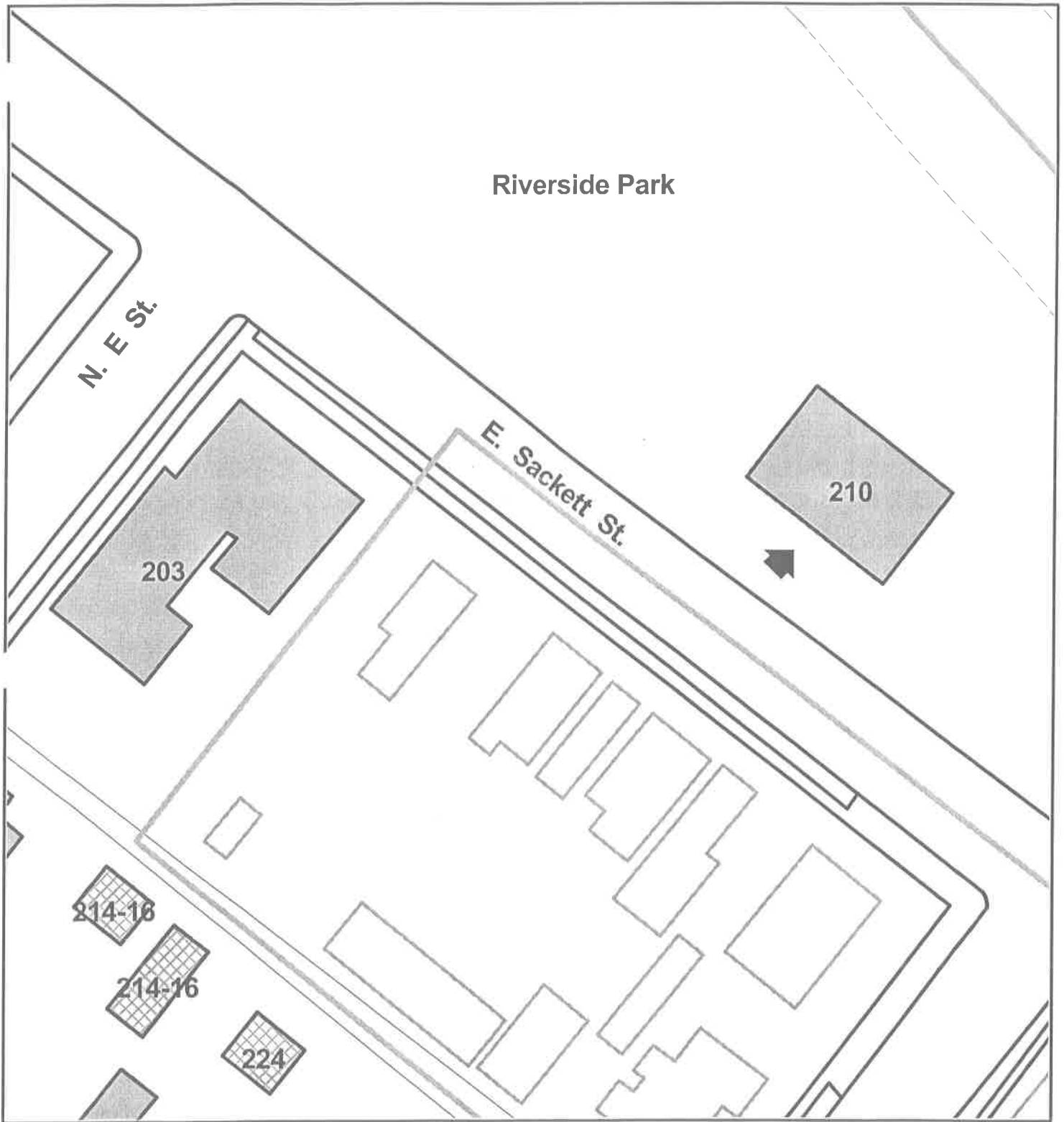

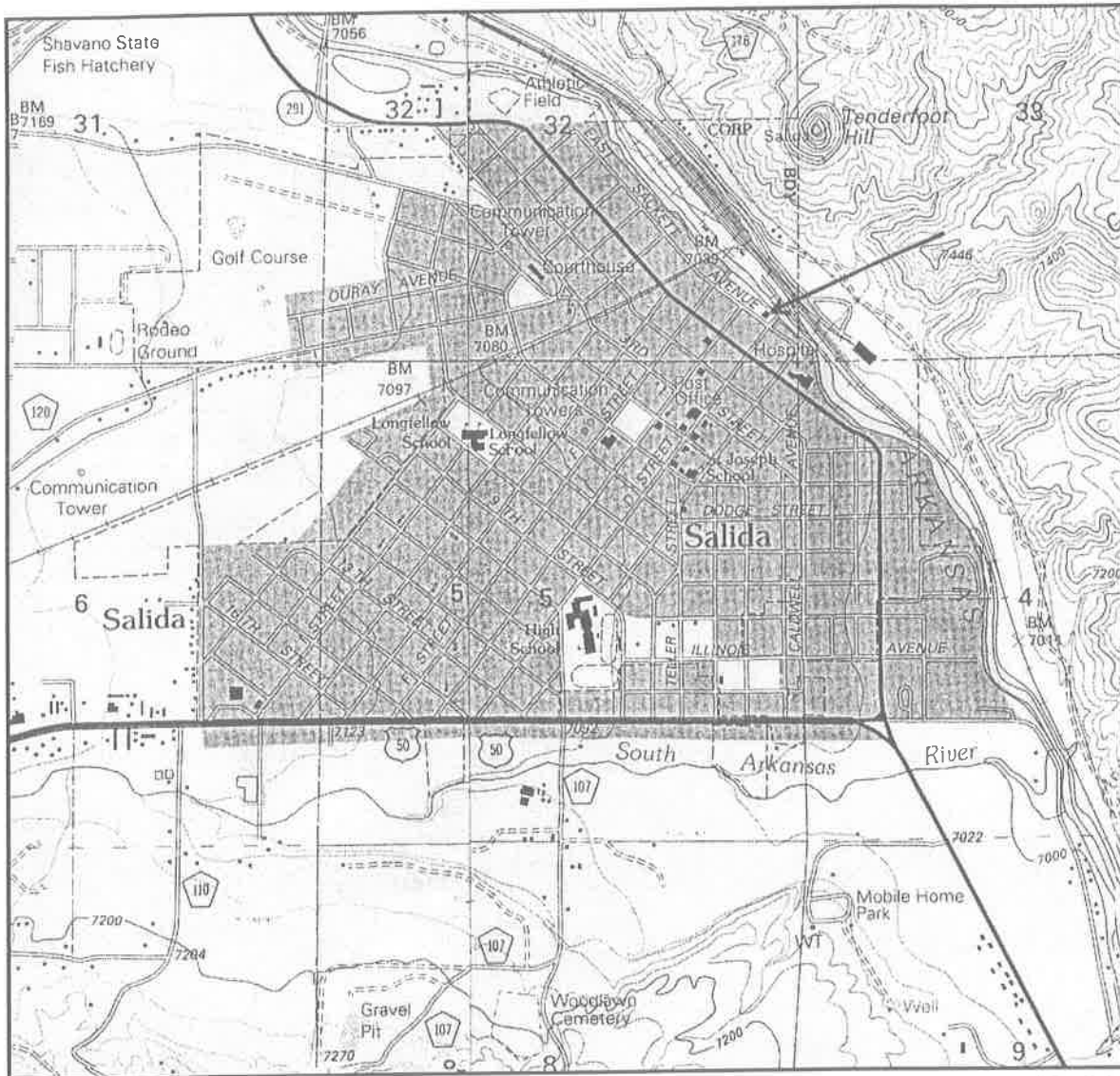
