



Within Salida, this one story brick building provides a fine intact example of late nineteenth century commercial architecture. A very simple structure, it is distinguished by a brickwork pattern at the cornice line, and a storefront area dominated by a central recessed entrance flanked by large display windows which, previous to the extensive use of indoor lighting, allowed sufficient amounts of natural light into the building. The storefront is framed in wood.

In 1904 the structure housed a harness shop; in 1909, the Christian Science Hall, in 1914, a cobbler shop; and in 1926, a wallpaper and paints establishment.
