Listed as housing a grocery store in 1883, this two story brick structure is identified by a brick corbel table below the cornice and a pair of paired bays with accenting brick caps. A continuous lintel separates the upper floor from the original storefront area which has been altered.

The building remained a grocery store until at least 1898 when it is listed as containing a saloon.
