Identified as the Union Block on the 1890 Sanborn map, this two story brick commercial structure is characterized by a bracketed metal cornice and twelve segmental arch openings accented by brick window hoods (one window flanked by pilasters has been removed). The middle portion of the building has been stuccoed (see resource nos. 5CF280-281) and various alterations to the original storefront areas are visible.

A grocery store, meat market, and billiards hall occupied the building in 1890. Rented rooms were available on the second floor. By 1898 the building was listed as the Union Hotel. A photo of the Union Hotel is available in the Salida Centennial Committee Photo Collection at the Salida Public Library.
