Providing another example of a stamped metal facade, this two story brick commercial structure originally housed a grocery and clothing store with furnished rooms on the second floor. (See resource no. 5CF267 for history of metal facades)

This metal facade (the name of the distributor was not found) features a richly decorated, bracketed cornice, pilasters separating the nine second story bays, and metal supports at the ground level. Two storefronts with recessed entrances and large display windows and a central entrance to the second floor dominate the lower facade.
