The McKenna Building, characterized by an all brick facade, is a two story commercial structure, erected in 1902. The building exudes a medieval feeling through the corbel table at the cornice line and a raised center portion highlighted by turret-like stone projections. Below the raised portion are the building's name, date of construction, and a large round headed bay. Flanking this central bay are six transomed openings. Stone lintels and sills, as well as a brickwork pattern, accent these openings. On the ground floor metal siding and new brick obscure the original facade.

In 1904 a grocery store occupied the first floor of this building. The Elks Hall was located on the second floor.
