This two story brick commercial structure features very simple brickwork patterns at the cornice, four segmental arch bays accented by brick window caps, and a storefront area distinguished by a continuous transom, a double recessed entrance, and flanking display windows. This building and its neighbor (resource No. 5CF249) are the oldest structures on the east side of the block.

In 1890 the building was vacant. A laundry (1893), furniture storage area (1898), and a grocery (1904) followed as occupants.
