This one story brick structure (its neighbor, resource no. 5CF236 is an identical building) features a metal cornice accented by dentils, a transom window (some of the panels are missing and it is evident that the transom is not used to light the interior for insulation can be seen in the open sections), and a large display area which has been modernized.

In 1914 the building housed the Crews Beggs Mercantile Co., which was originally located at 207 F Street, resource no. 5CF252.
