## BASKETBALL

Although the Spartan cagers managed to list only nine wins against 12 losses during the past season, they gave their fans many thrilling moments during frequent "cliff-hangers." Actually, a total of eight points accounted for six Salida losses, as the Spartans dropped 4 games by one point and lost a pair of other games by two points. Had these eight points gone in favor of the Spartans, the local cagers would have finished the season 15-6.

Five seniors were on the squad: Steve Scott, Dave McCarl, Steve McFadden, Larry Larcom, and Mike Rush. Four juniors, Steve Kane, Ron Wilkins, John Tafoya and Brian Smith, and two sophomores, Dave Salvi and Artie Gentile, will return next year. Several members of coach Joe Hergert's junlor varsity should also be a big help to the 1970-71 forces. The JV's, composed entirely of sophomores except for freshman Rick Myers, had an impressive 15-4 wonlost record.

Steve McFadden was named to the all-conference team, Steve Scott got the nod for second string all-conference, and Mike Rush, Dave Salvi and Dave McCarl received honorable mention. Steve Scott hit 77.5\% of his free throws for a new school record, while the team had a 63\% free throw mark, also a new record.

For the second consecutive year, Coach Jim Gentile's Spartan wrestling squad won the Pikes Peak League Championship. In fact, the Spartans had their best year ever, as they won every dual meet on their schedule, qualified eight wrestlers for state, and placed 15 th at the state tournament.
