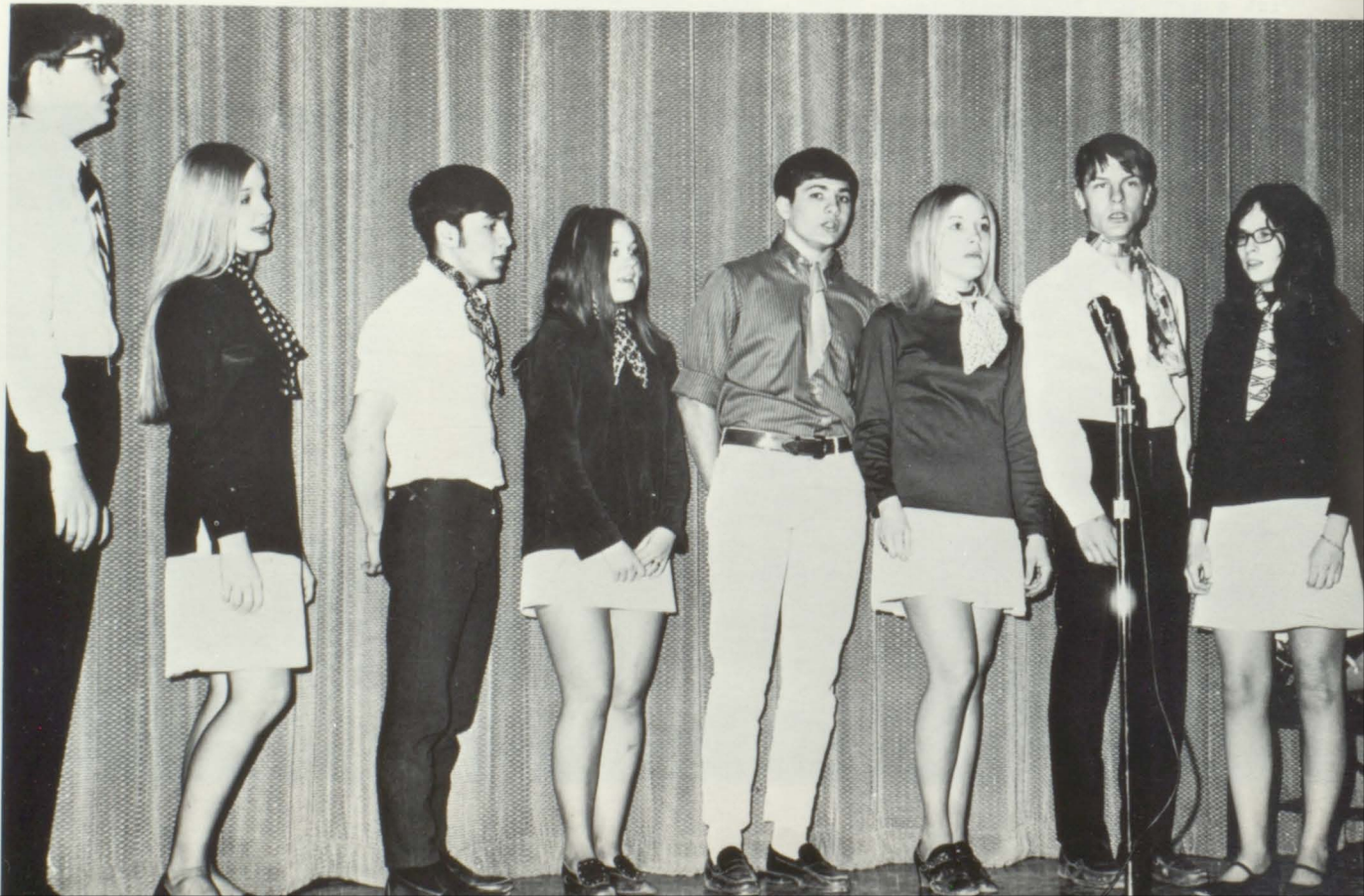

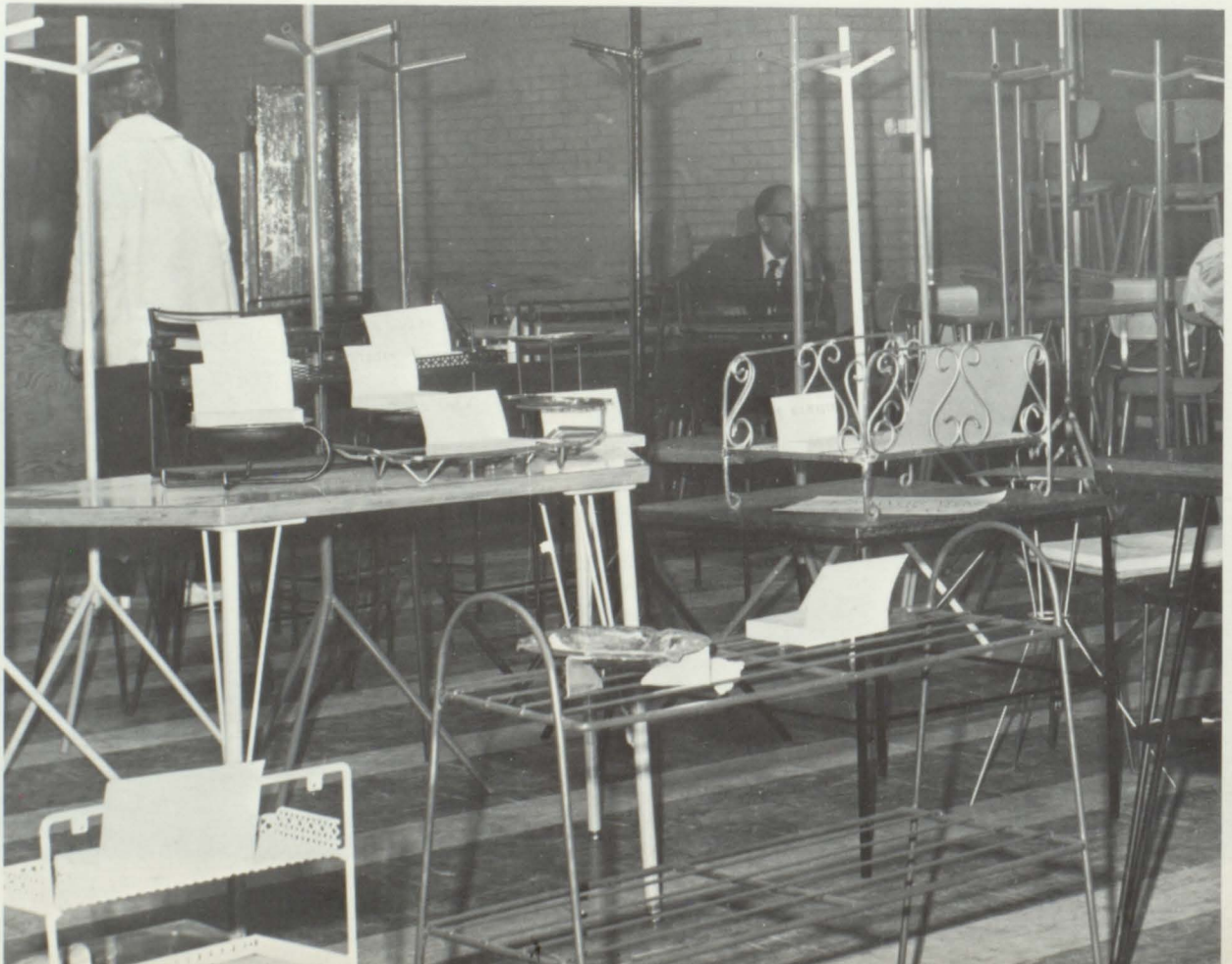
ALL - SCHOOL EXHIBIT

INTERNATION
