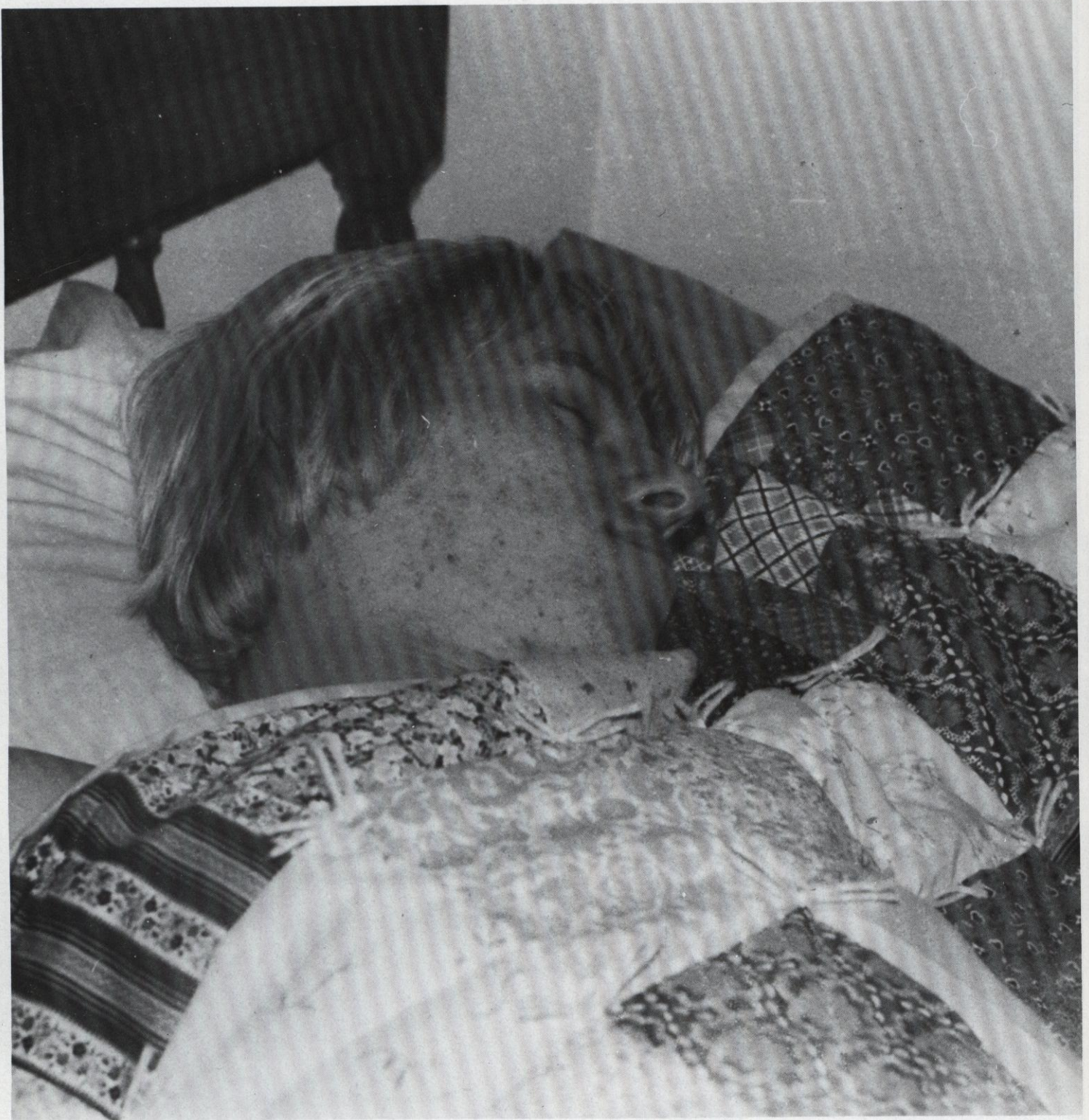

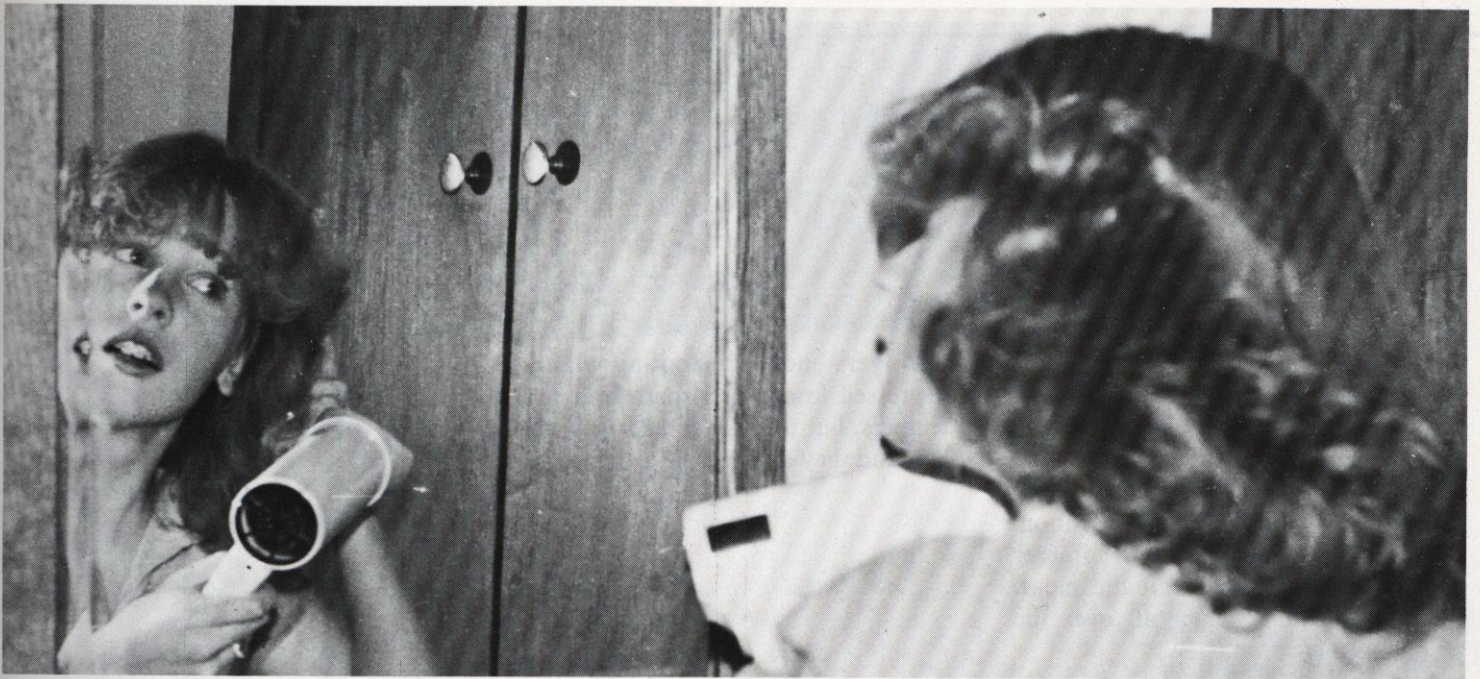




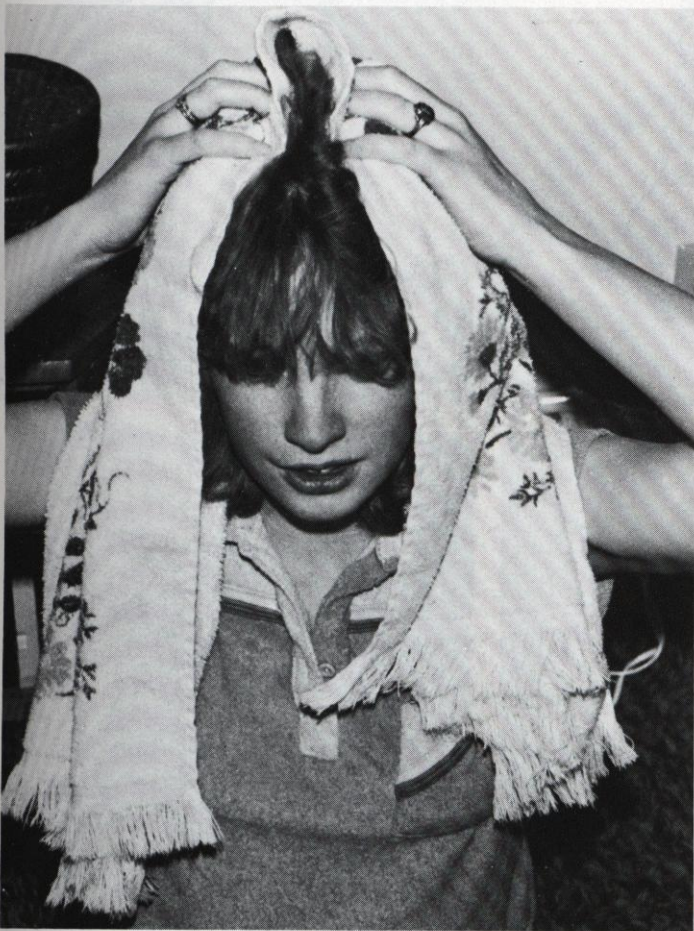
The Morning Routine

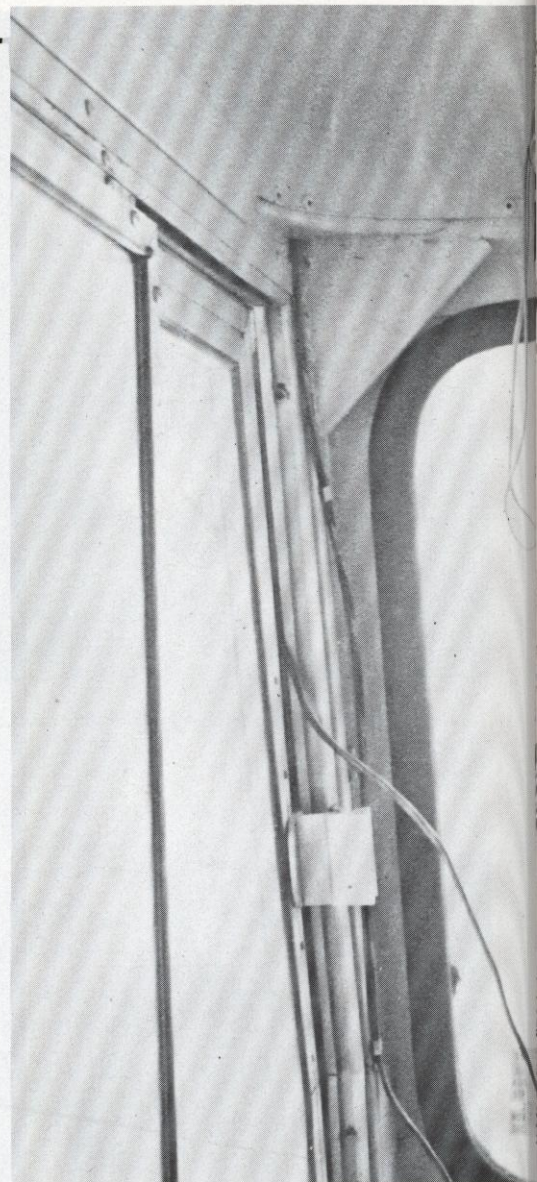
Even after all the trouble, head cook, Mary Kimberlin, told the student newspaper that she "loved working with kids." It makes her feel younger.

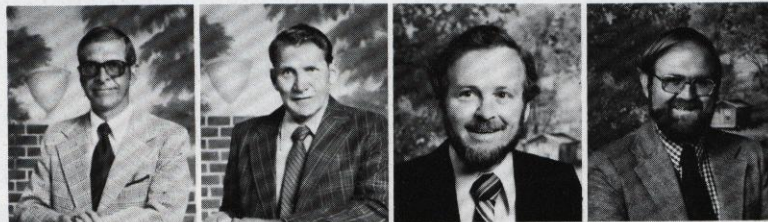
Drivers endured shouting winners, depressed losers, bad roads and short tempers, but they all agreed they liked kids and they enjoyed their job.

Sherry Turley said she was planning on getting married and then was going to go to school.

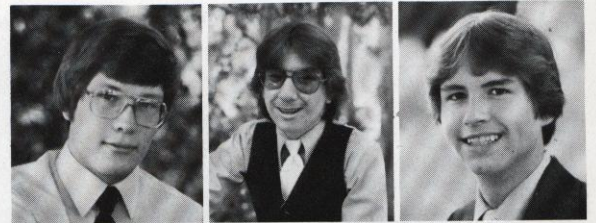
Miss Turley also said she thought that most of the seniors would stick around for the summer before leaving home or going to school.

Although they didn't become state champs, Salida won the Pikes Peak League crown for the tenth consecutive year. In 1978-79 Salida shared the title

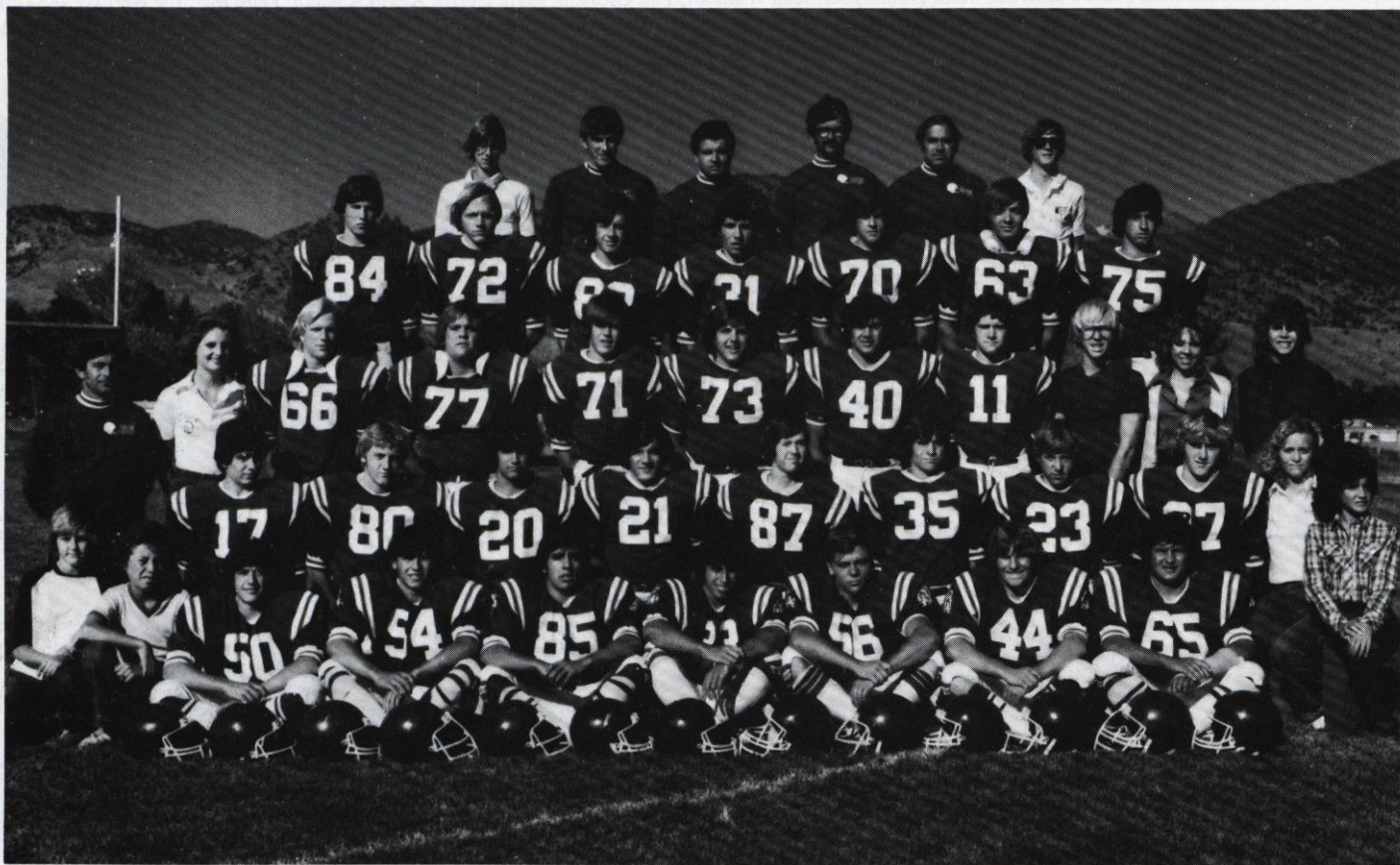
with the Buena Vista Demons but this year like the other years, the Spartans were the only team to hold the league title.

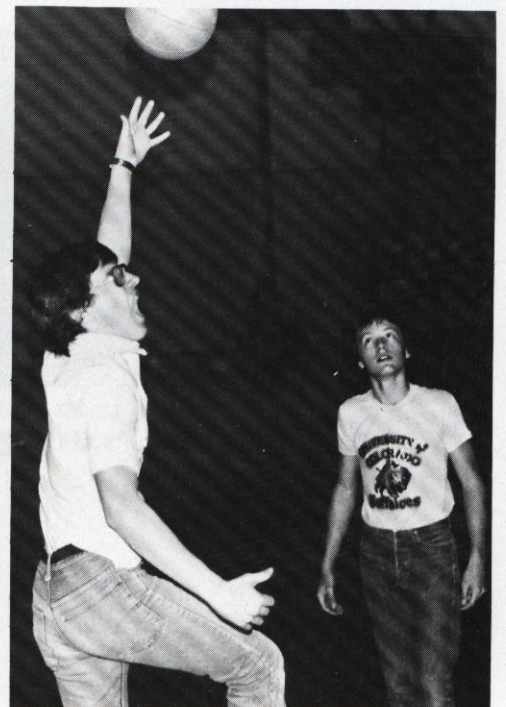
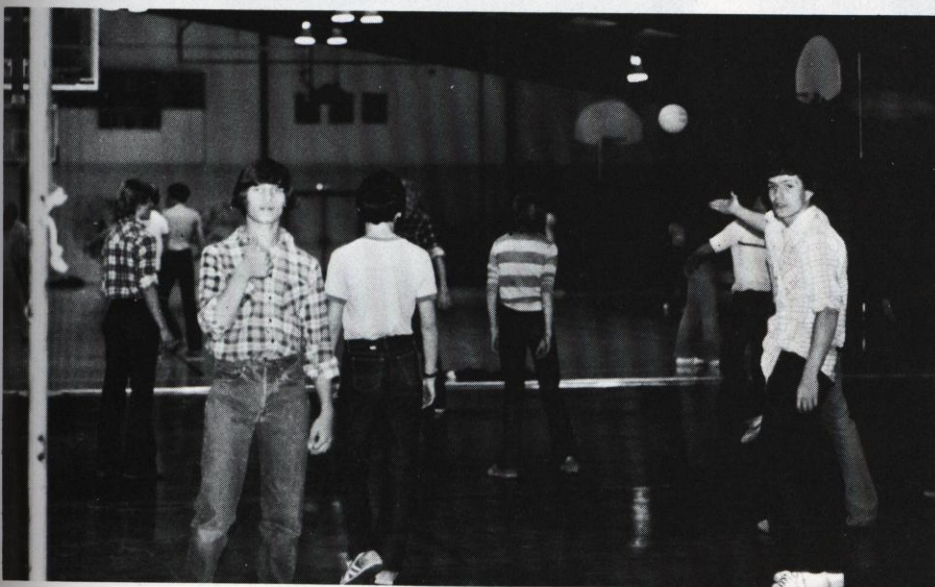

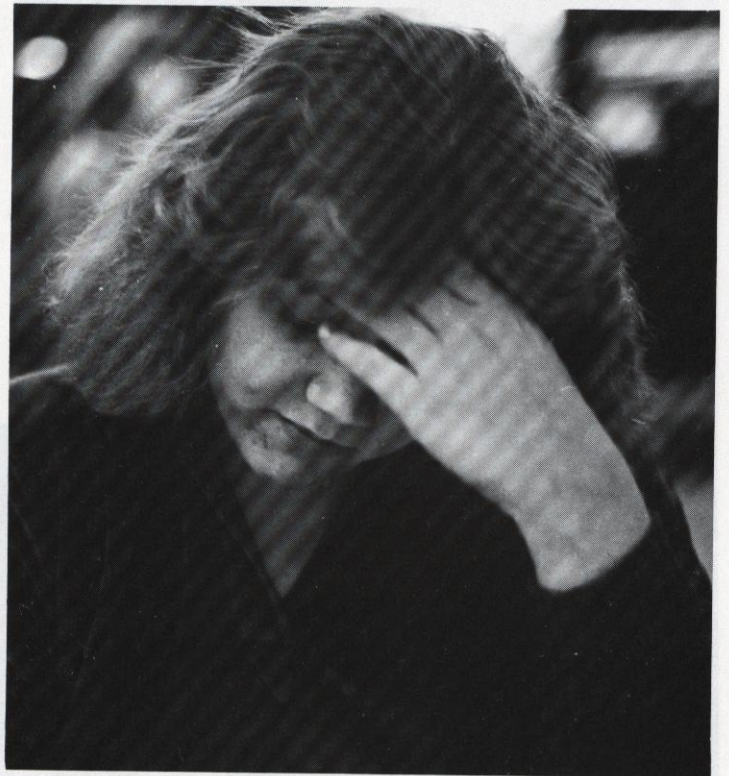

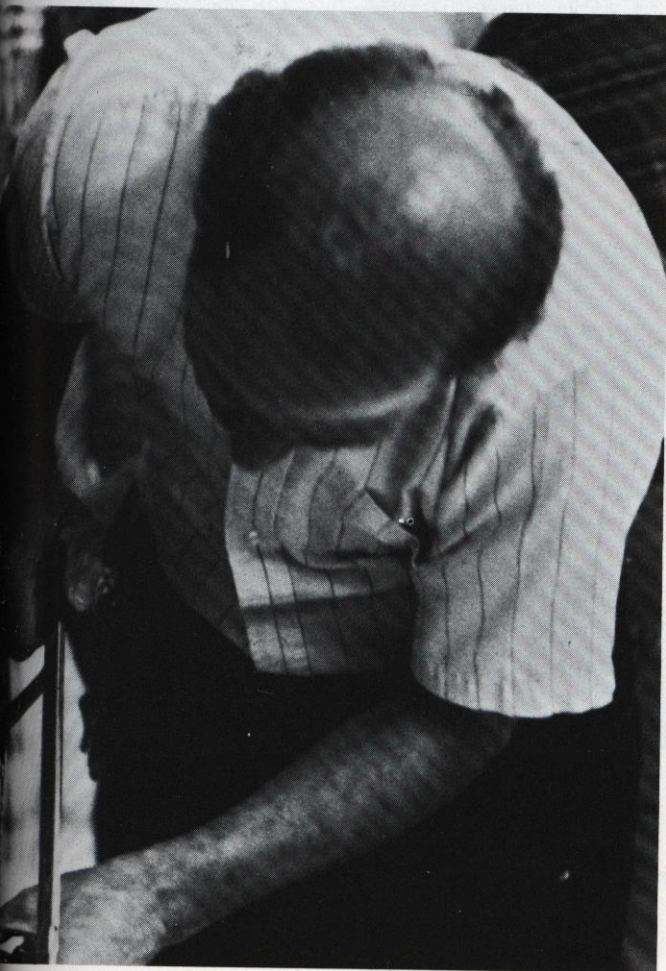

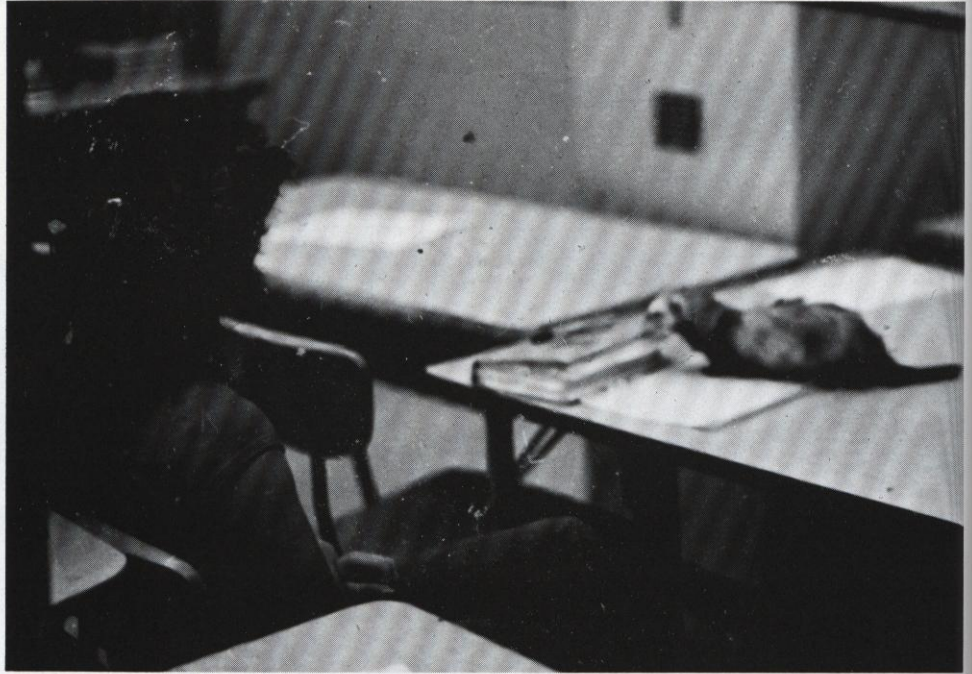

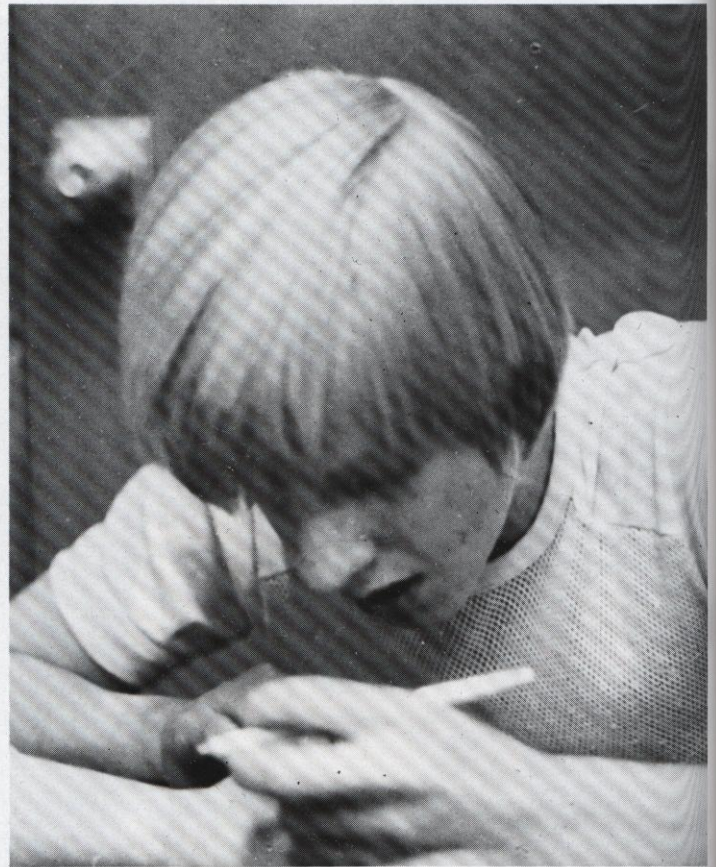



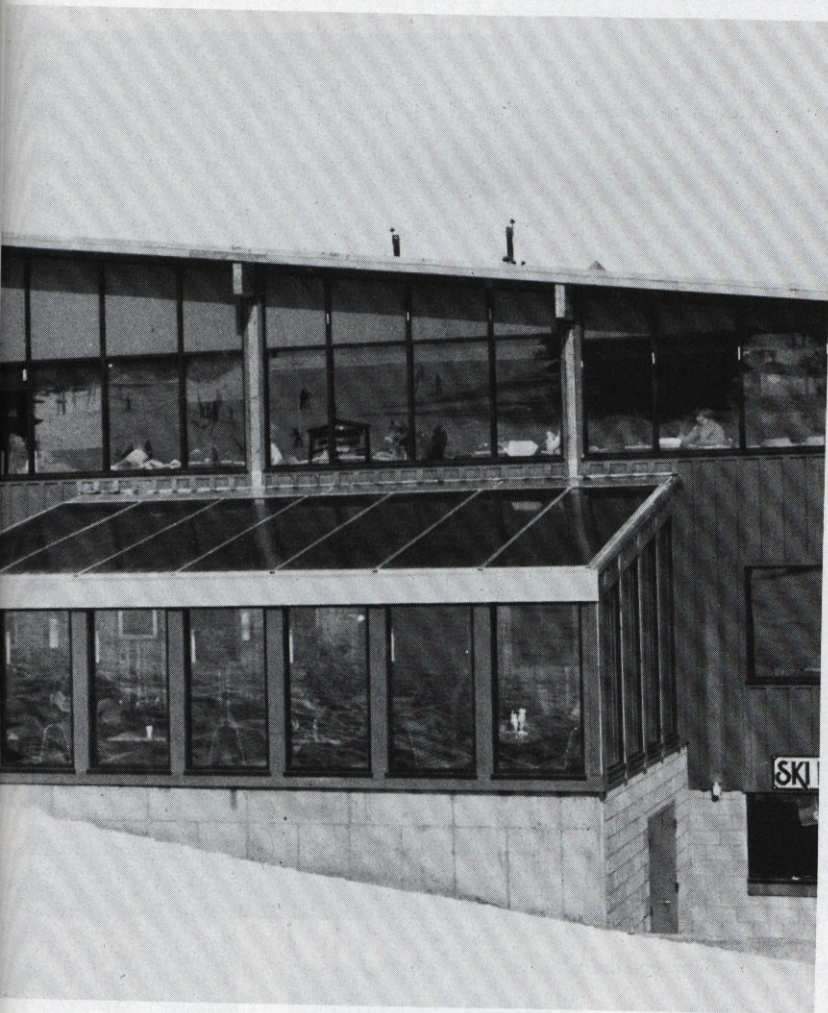
The voting machine was borrowed from Jasper Cortese at the courthouse. The machine was here by the high school office for three days before the elections in Nov.

Late Snows Hurt Early Season



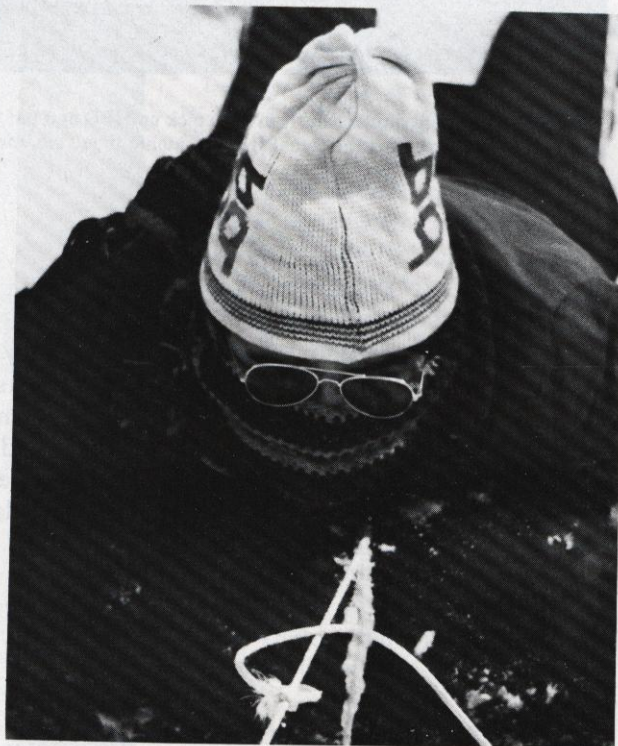
The new addition to the Monarch Ski Area which was built last summer also added the Ski Shop.

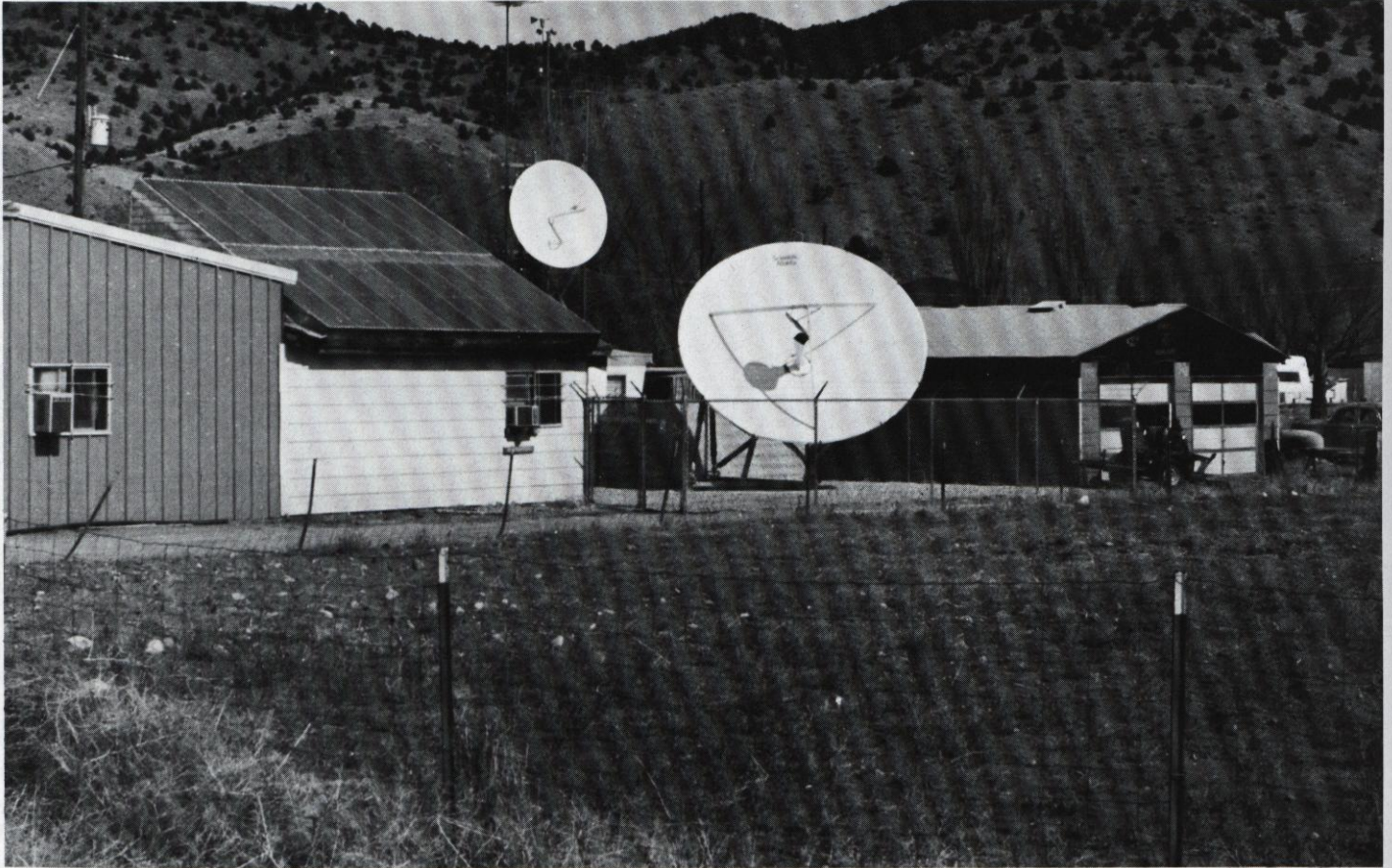

HBO Comes to Salida



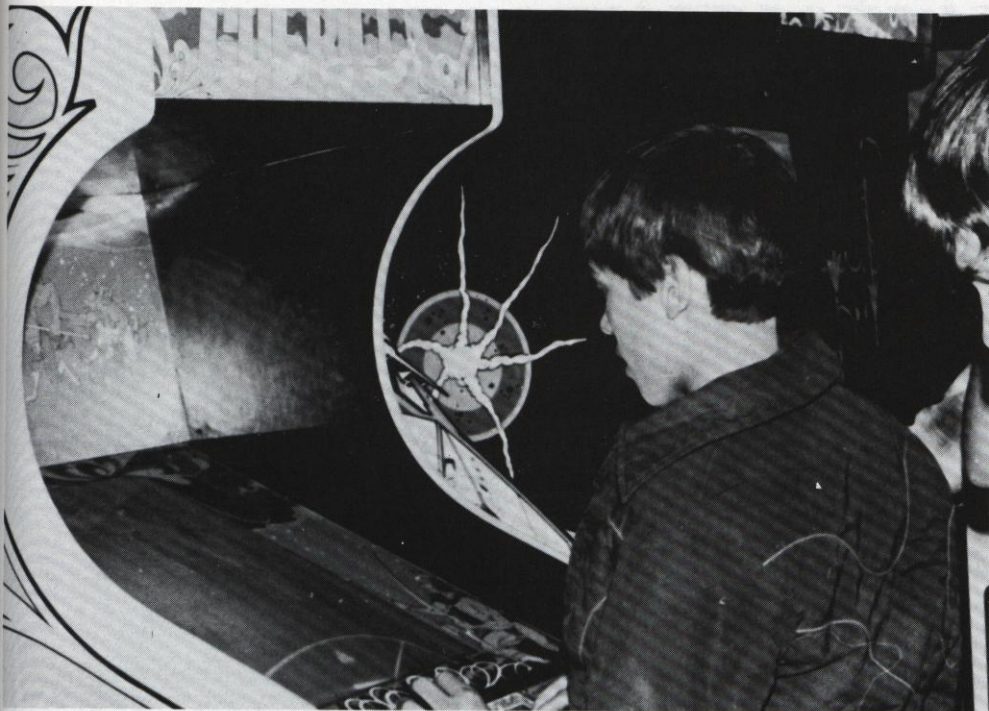
The receiving dish, shown here, is used to pick up HBO and the Atlanta station. The dish receives the signal from a satellite then runs the signal

Excitement Rises Over Facelift for Pool

Work on re-roofing and remodeling the Salida Hot Springs Swimming Pool was "way ahead of schedule" as Bassi Construction Co. workers proceeded in almost springlike weather.

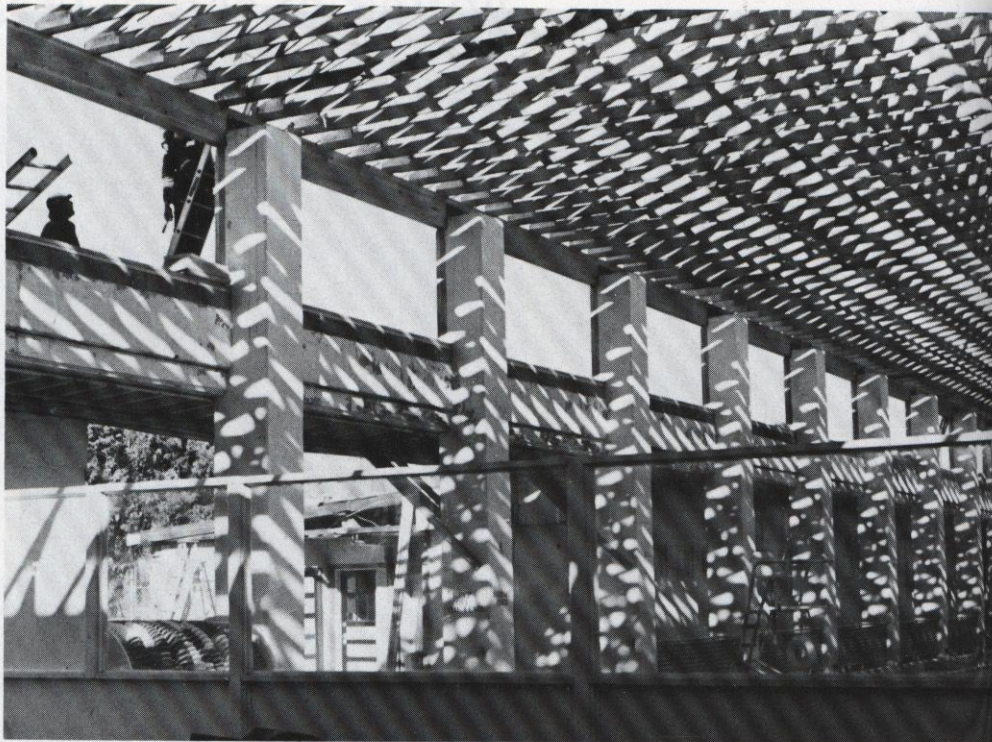
The pool, which has been roofless for several years, got a new covering as the major portion of a \$290,000 bond issue passed by voters here more than a year ago. Tom Breunich, a member of the Heart of the Rockies Chamber of Commerce Pool Committee, said plans originally called for a flat, concrete roof, but because prices started at \$400,000, the idea had to be scrapped.

Breunich said there were "lots of complaints" about lack of temperature regulation, lack of water flow, and unsanitary conditions. He said part of the present project will be re-plumbing to solve these problems.

On the outside, Breunich said the overall plans called for improvements which would cost "well over \$1 million" but most needed portions will be worked on first. Priority items, he said, include a parking lot, a camping and picnic area and eventually basketball and tennis courts, children's play area, an outdoor theater and an exercise track.

Charles Melien, noted recently that the Salida Rotary Club donated \$15,000 toward improvements in the park.

In mid-January, about five Bassi Construction workers were placing roof decking on the trusses which were set in place a short time earlier. Work was progressing on installation of heating and ventilation ducting.



Newly installed trusses cast a myriad of angular light patterns on decking and rippling water in the pool, creating a kaleidoscope of sparkling light shimmers as workmen proceeded to add decking to the roof.

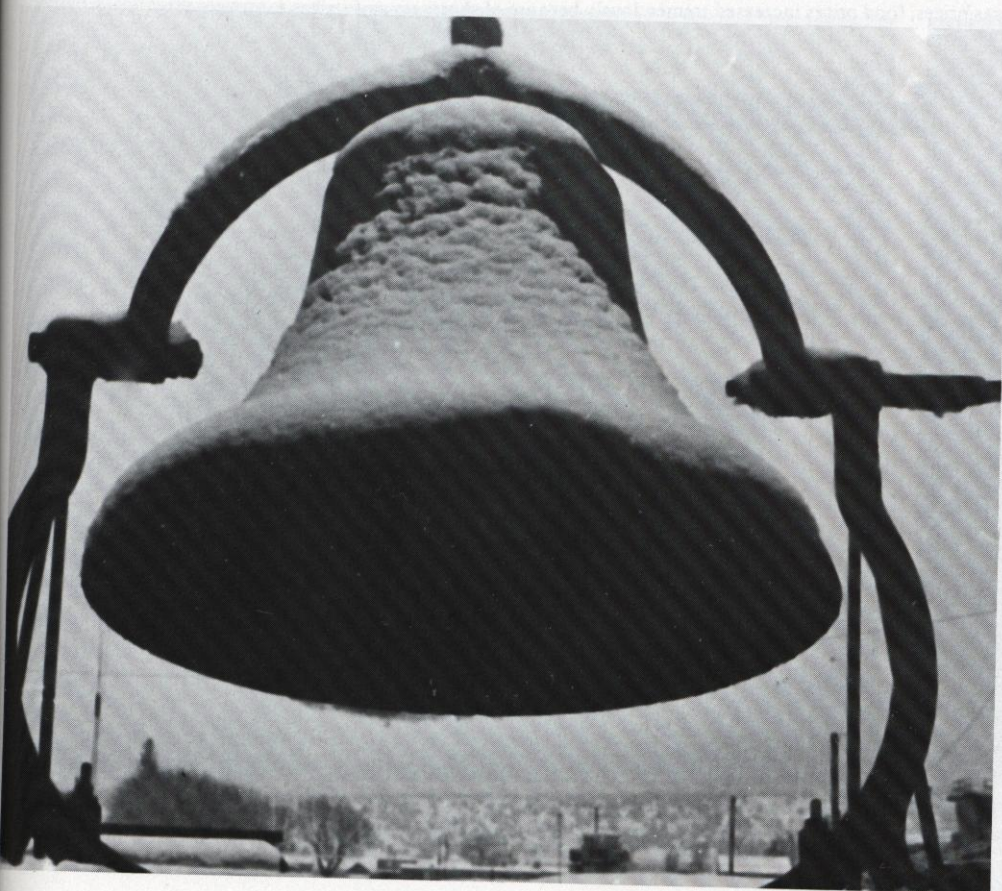

Lack of Snow Causes Potential Water Shortage



The lack of snow last year made the Arkansas River run low causing a threat to the water supply in the valley.



The snowfall this winter was the least amount of snow that we had in more than 10 years, and could cause shortages of water, which then could lead to shortages of food produced in the Arkansas Valley.

But, most of the snows were wet and sticky which helped a lot because they supplied more water abundance than a dry snow would. Hope for a lot of rain last summer was on the minds of every resident of Salida.

Most of the snows last year were wet snows, like the one above, and they stuck to everything and sometimes causing power outages due to the weight of them.

Inflation Cuts Down on Spending



Along with gas prices, food prices increased tremendously because of shortages and strikes.

With gas prices going higher and higher many students were car pooling when they went cruising and when they went to school. Many students said they wanted to buy economy cars rather than fast ones. The motorists in this area paid 8.88 cents per mile for gasoline, oil, tires, and repairs, whereas the nation average was 8.13 cents per mile. In addition, the insurance and taxes on cars were higher in the west. At the end of last year gas prices ranged from \$1.19 to 1.34 and was still increasing because President Reagan took the "ceiling" off of the prices.



In the last three years gas prices have doubled, usually more than 10¢ per gallon a year. If the prices keep going the way they are, they will be more than \$2.00 per gallon by the summer of 1982.

Russians Visit Salida



Soviet sights are a little different than American ones as Lance Rundle, Senior, finds out.

Russians landed in Salida in February when the Fourth Opposing Forces Group sent Jack Thompson and Sherman Barton to explain the aspects of the United Soviet Socialist Republic including military, political and social considerations.

Both men said they spent much time in and around the USSR and used one-hour intervals here giving accounts of their experiences. In addition, they brought a number of weapons from the USSR which were on display.

Barton said that when young people turn sixteen, they are required to join the services in order to serve the country. He said the only exceptions are for those who are exceptionally talented and can serve the country in some other manner.

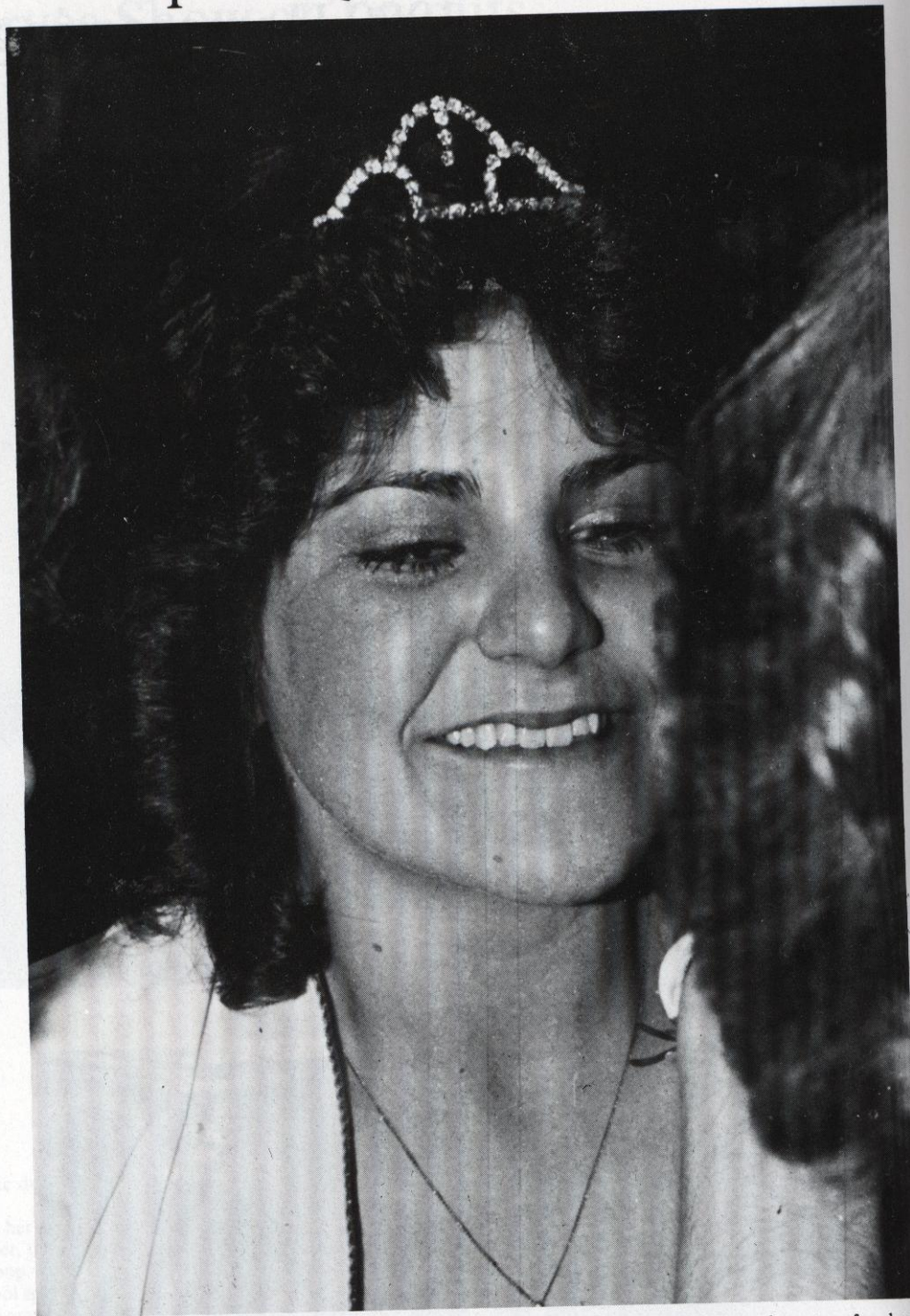

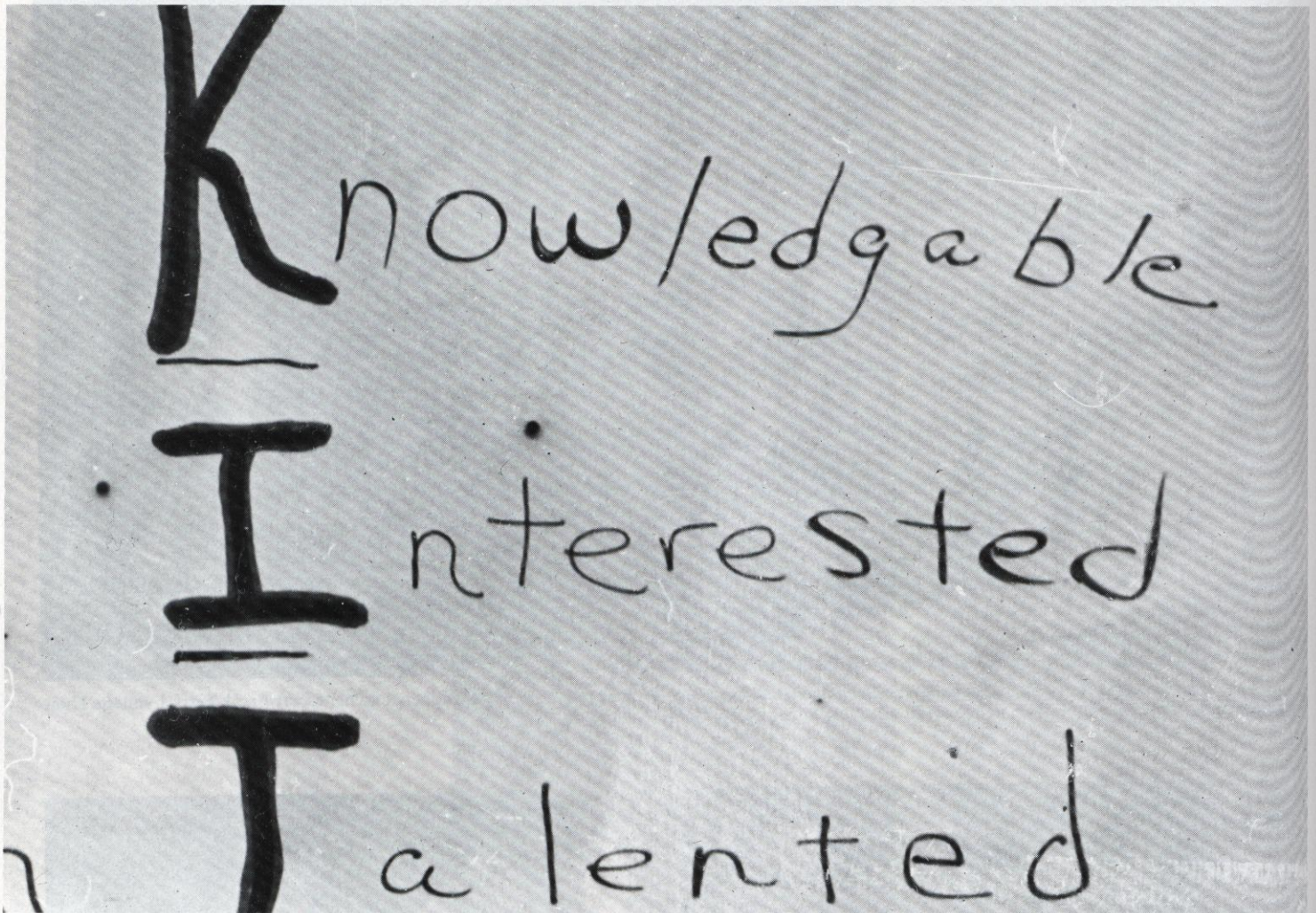

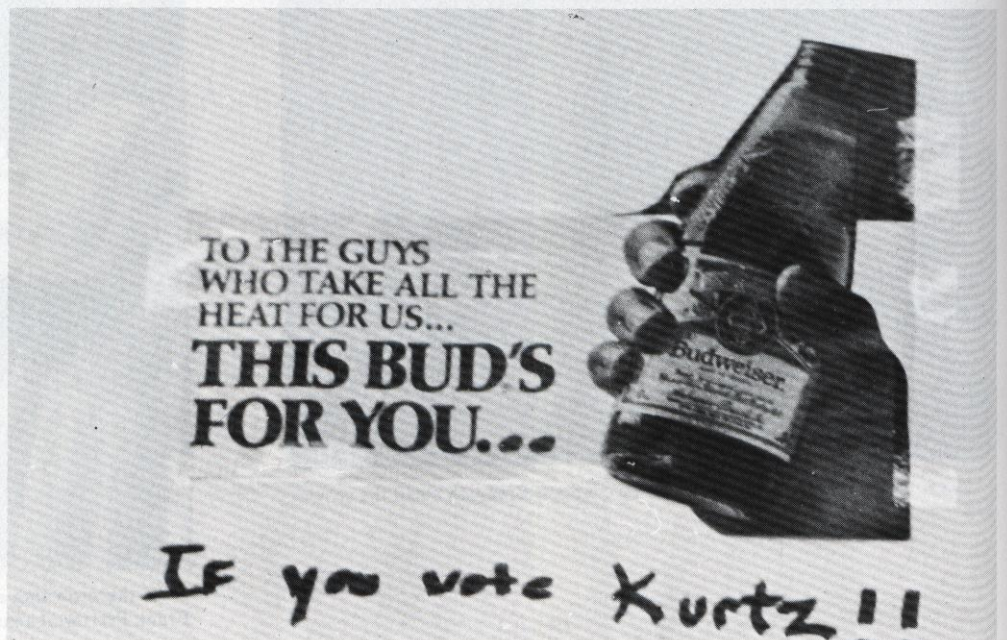

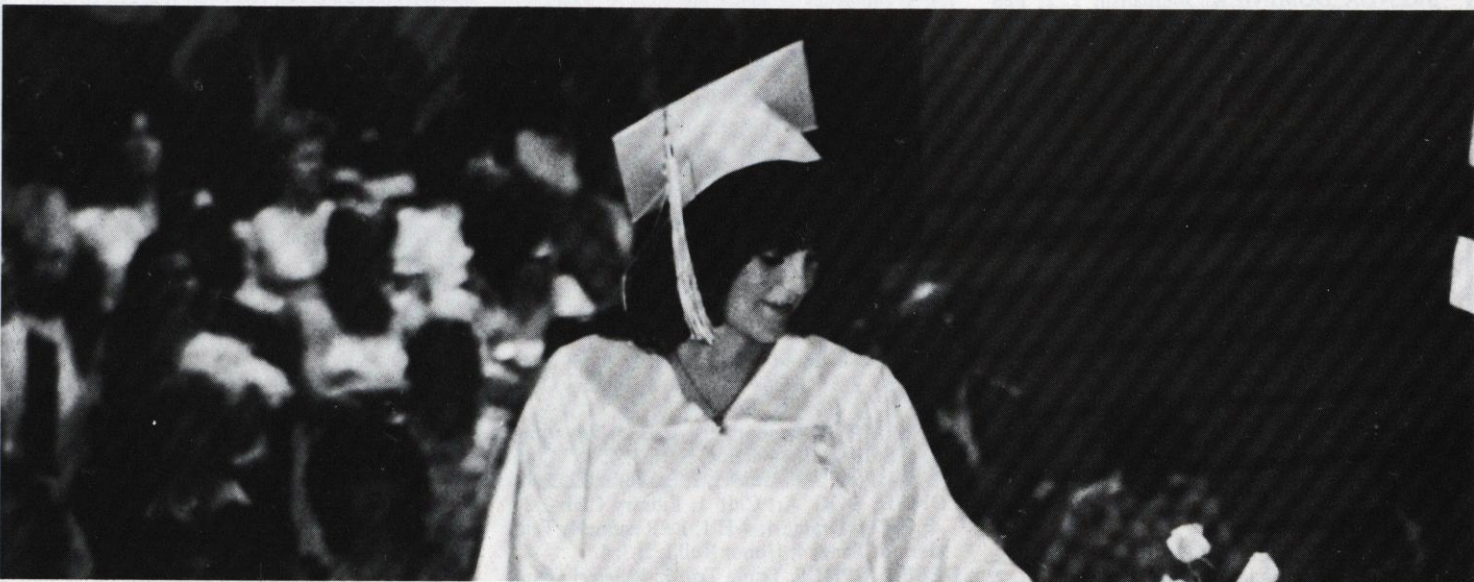
