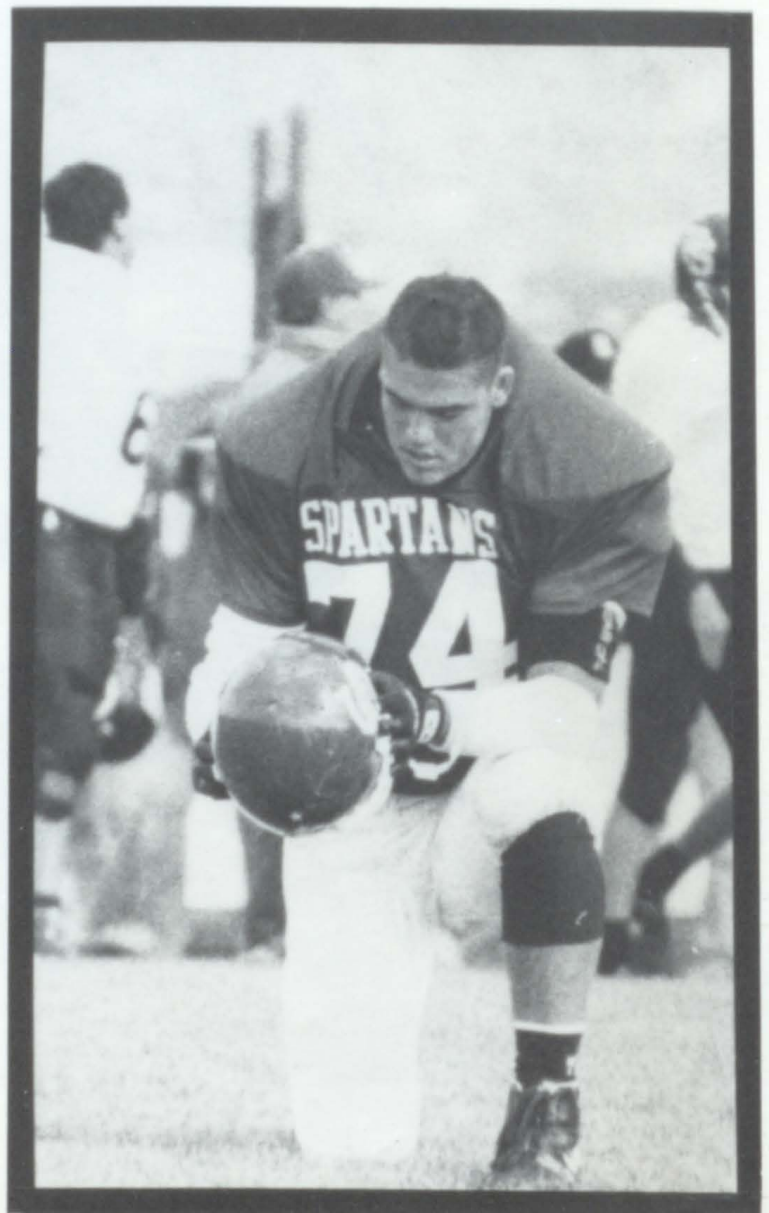

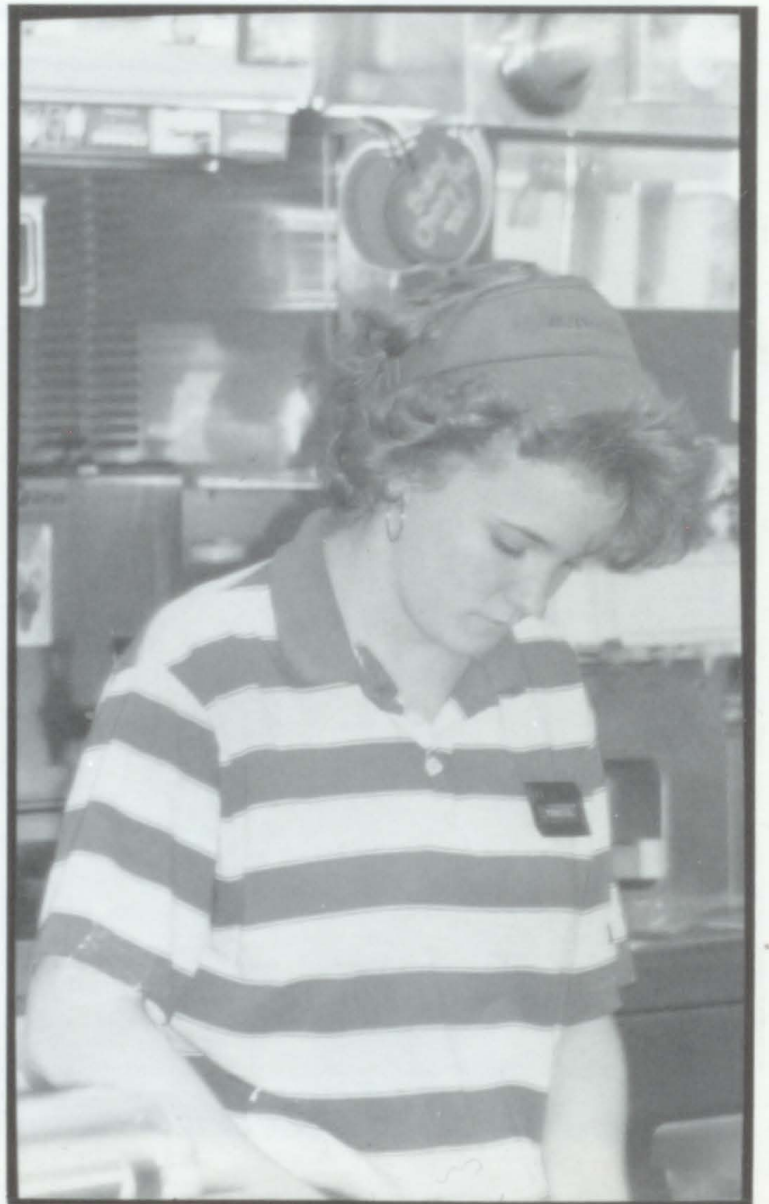

Student council also had their regular duties of filling pop and candy machines all year. The money was used to help decorate for dances.

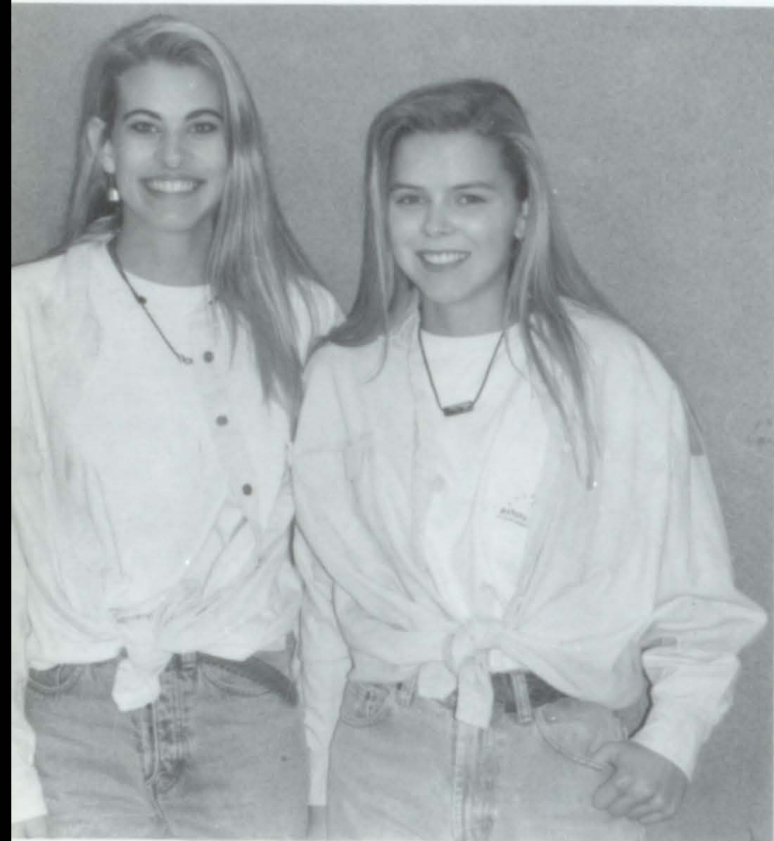

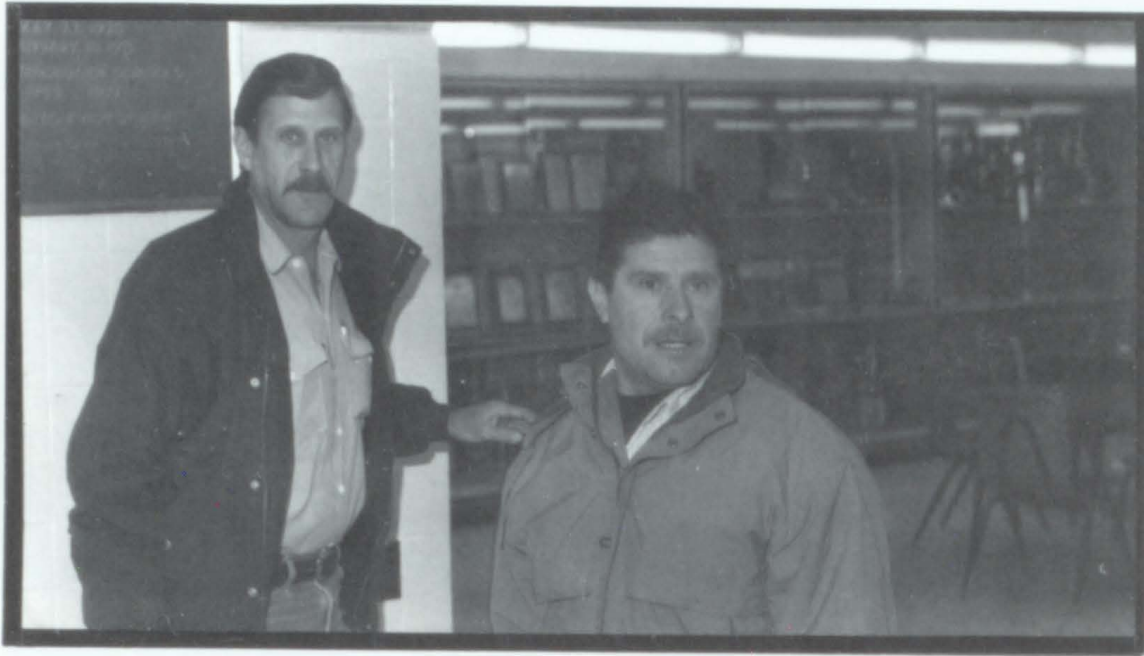

The co-organizers were Dr. Grantham and Mr. Woody Liswood.

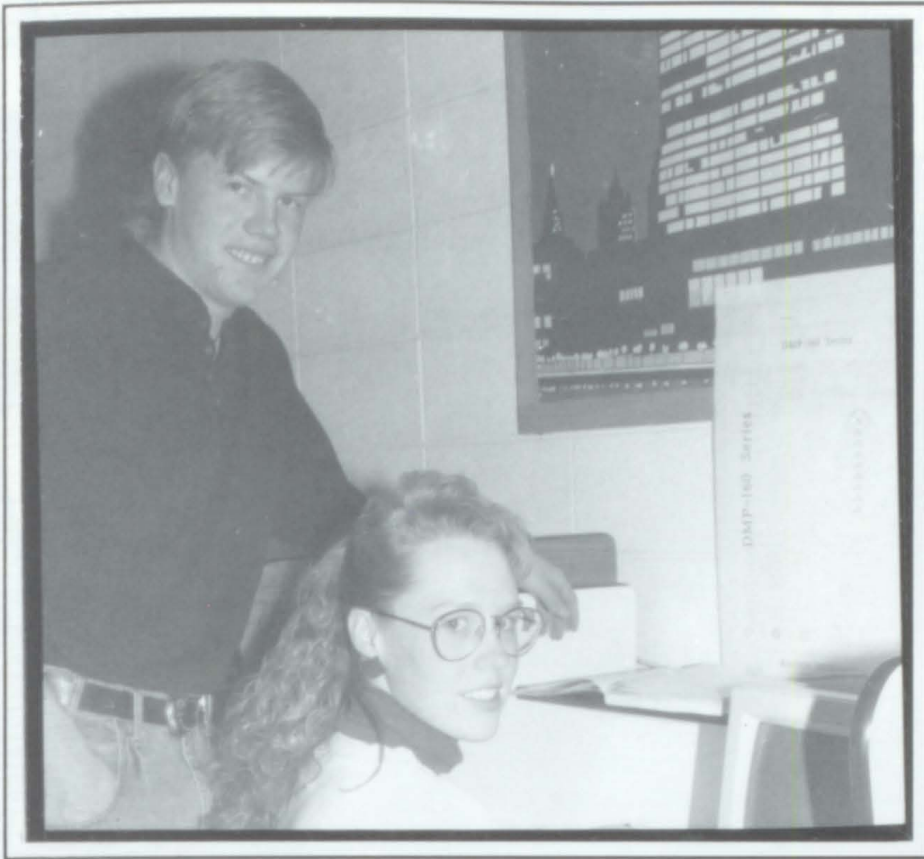

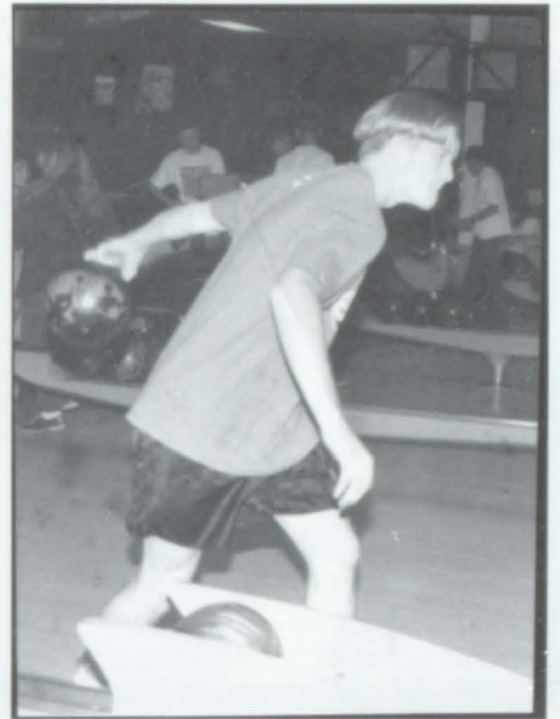

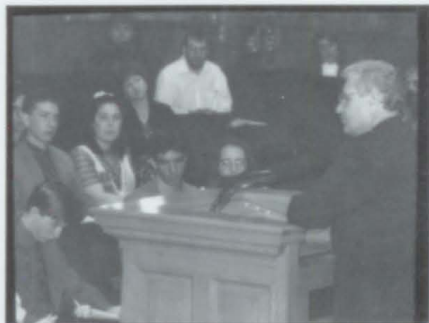

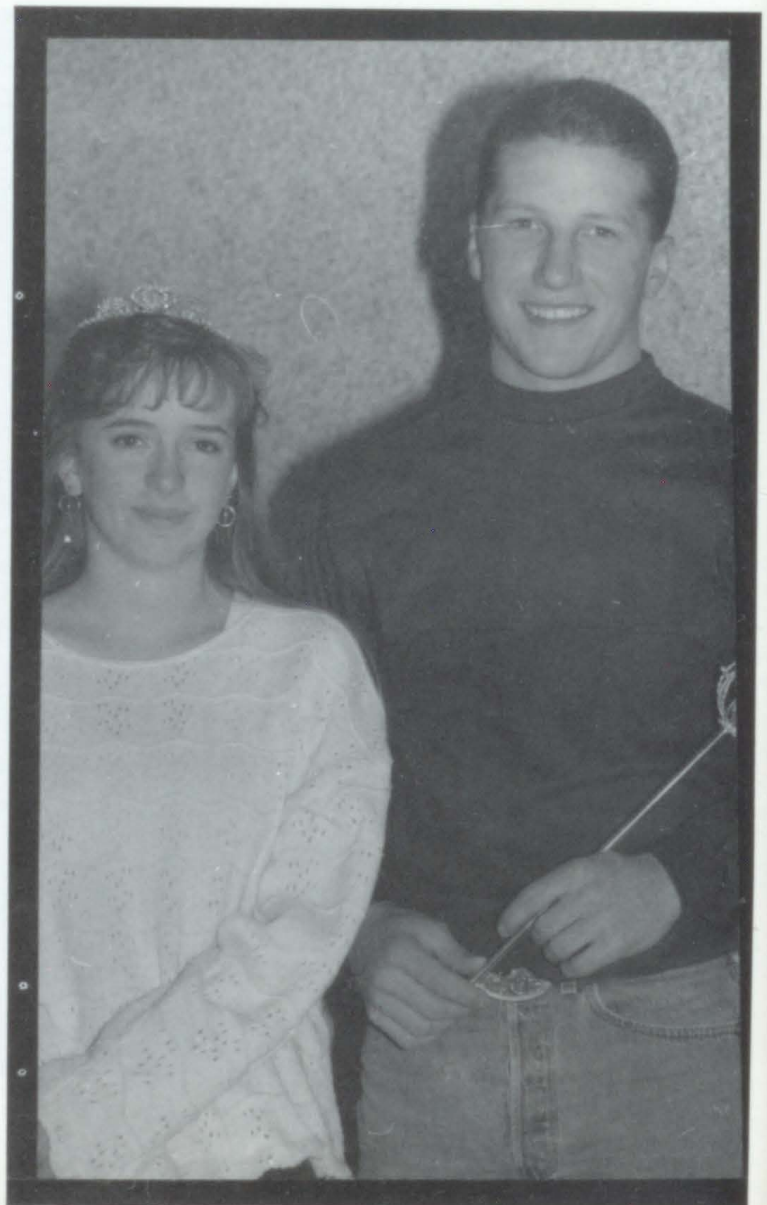

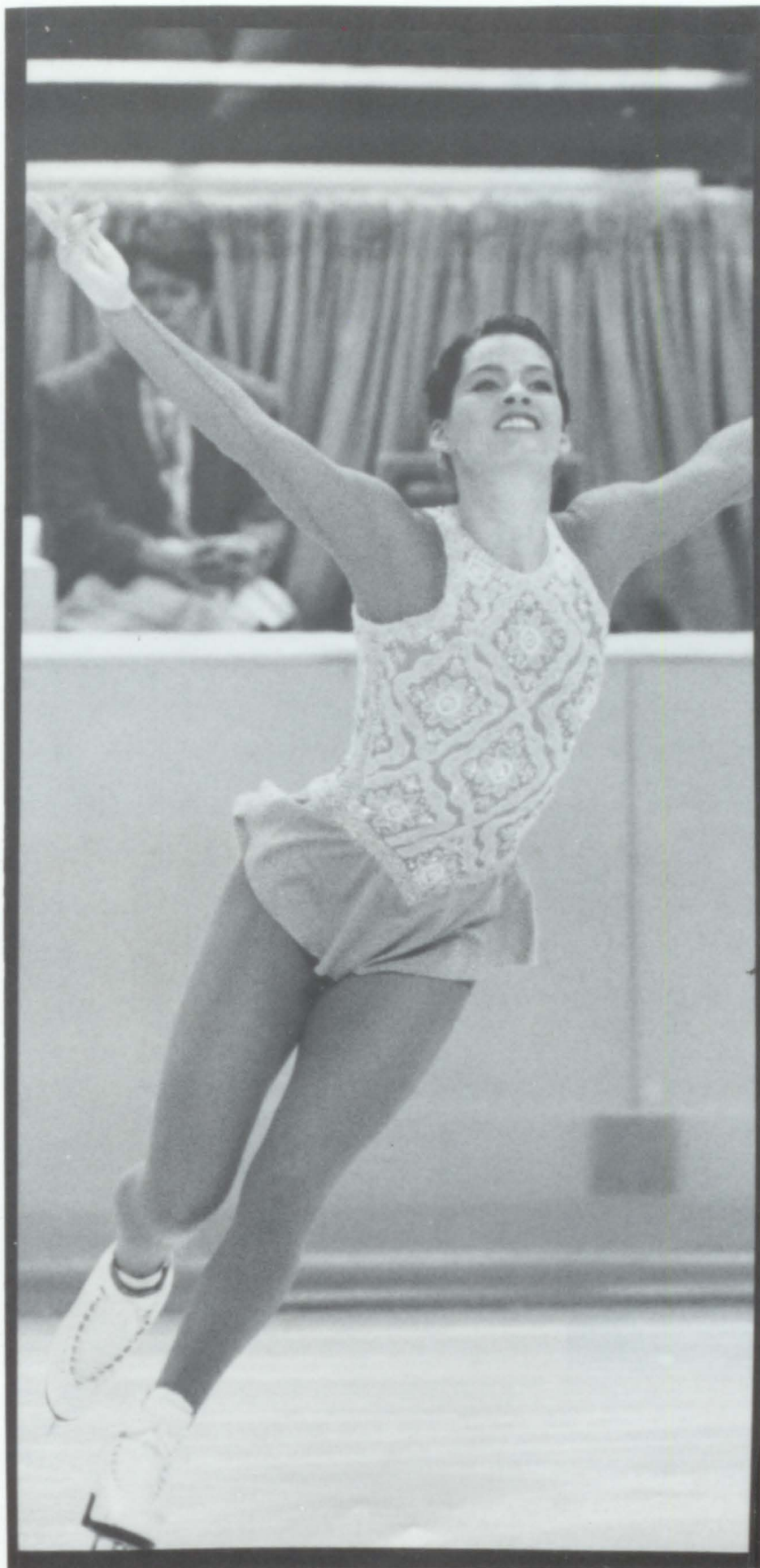
The floods of the mid-west damaged many crops for the year. The main form of transportation was by boat, if the people could even leave their homes.

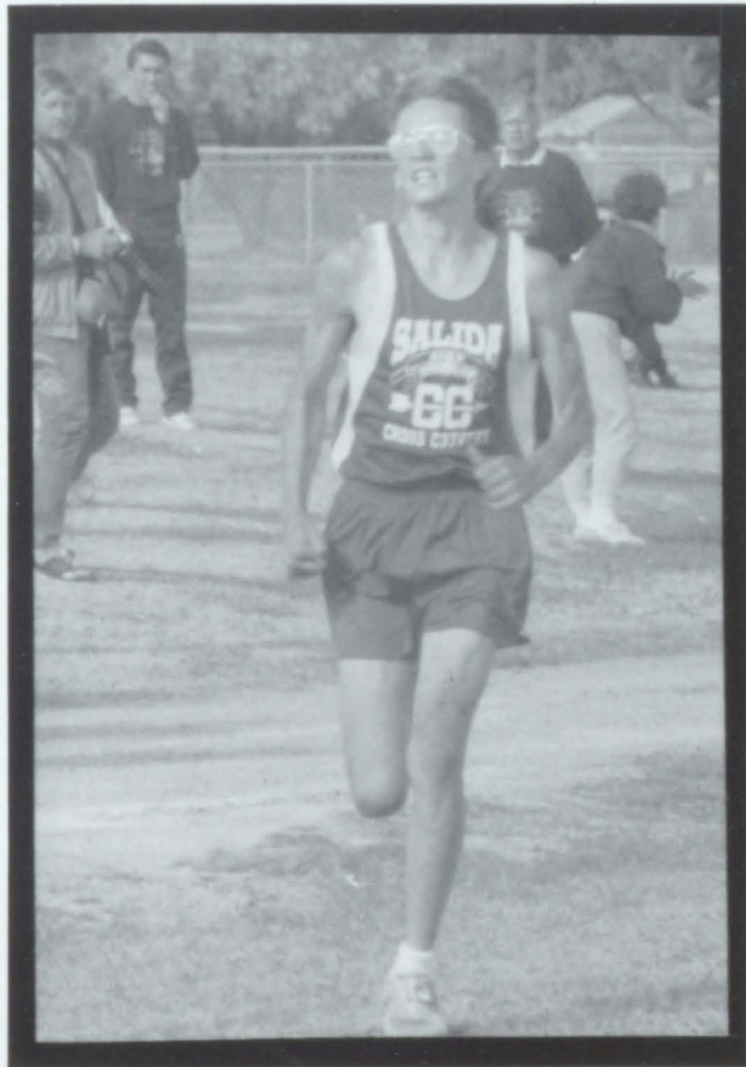

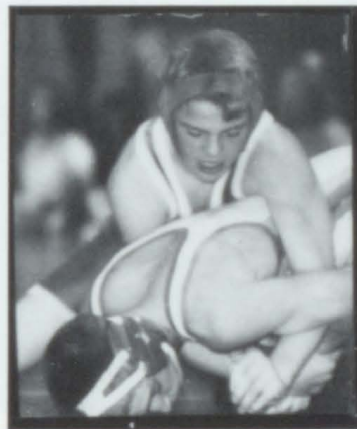

Their record was 5-3 in the Intermountain League standings, and 9-10 in the regular overall season.

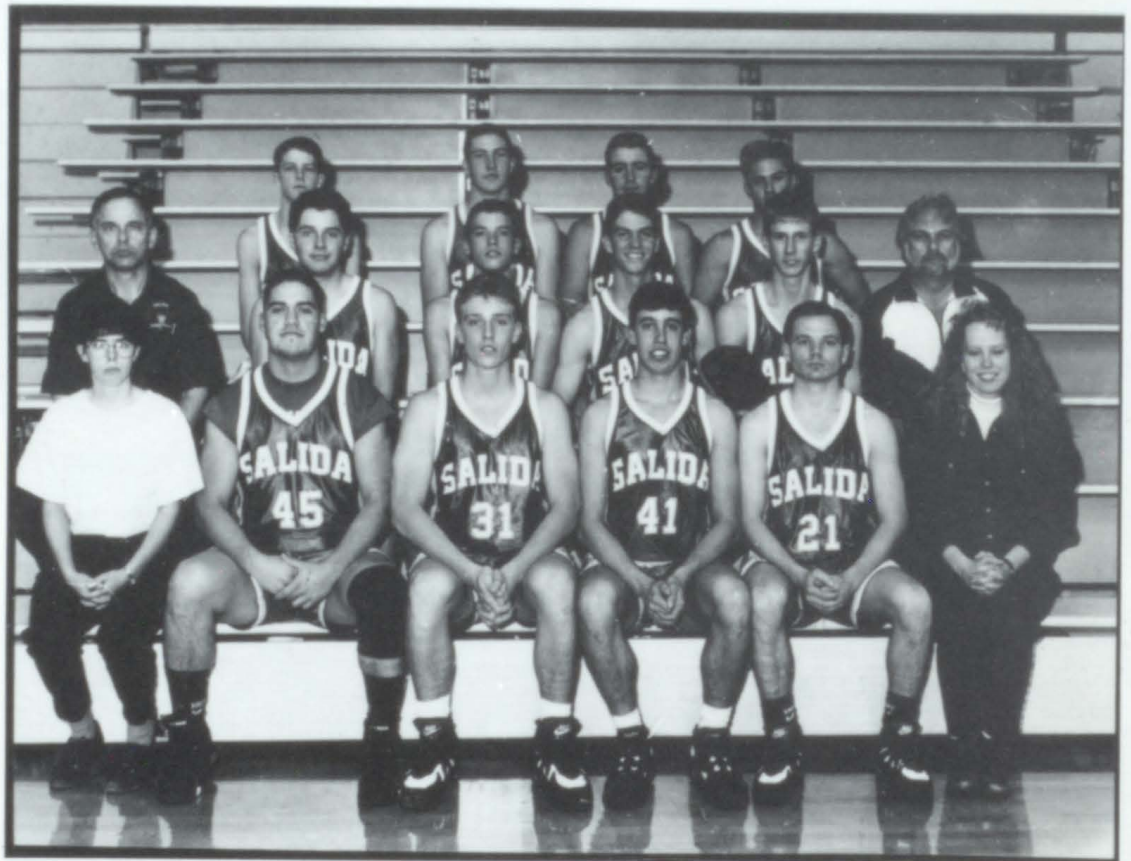
Salida started the season at the Buena Vista Tournament where they lost to Gunnison in the first game and defeated Mountain Valley in the second game.

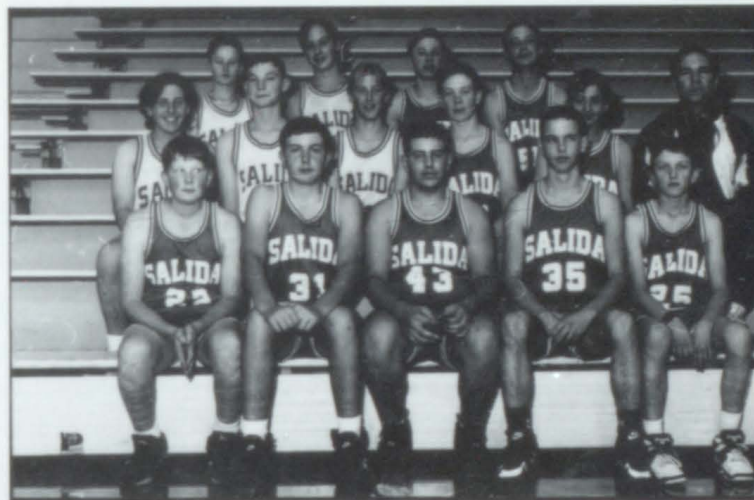

Barr continued, "The kids played hard all year. Almost everyone will be coming back next year. Eight out of 9 batters we played at Regionals will be back."

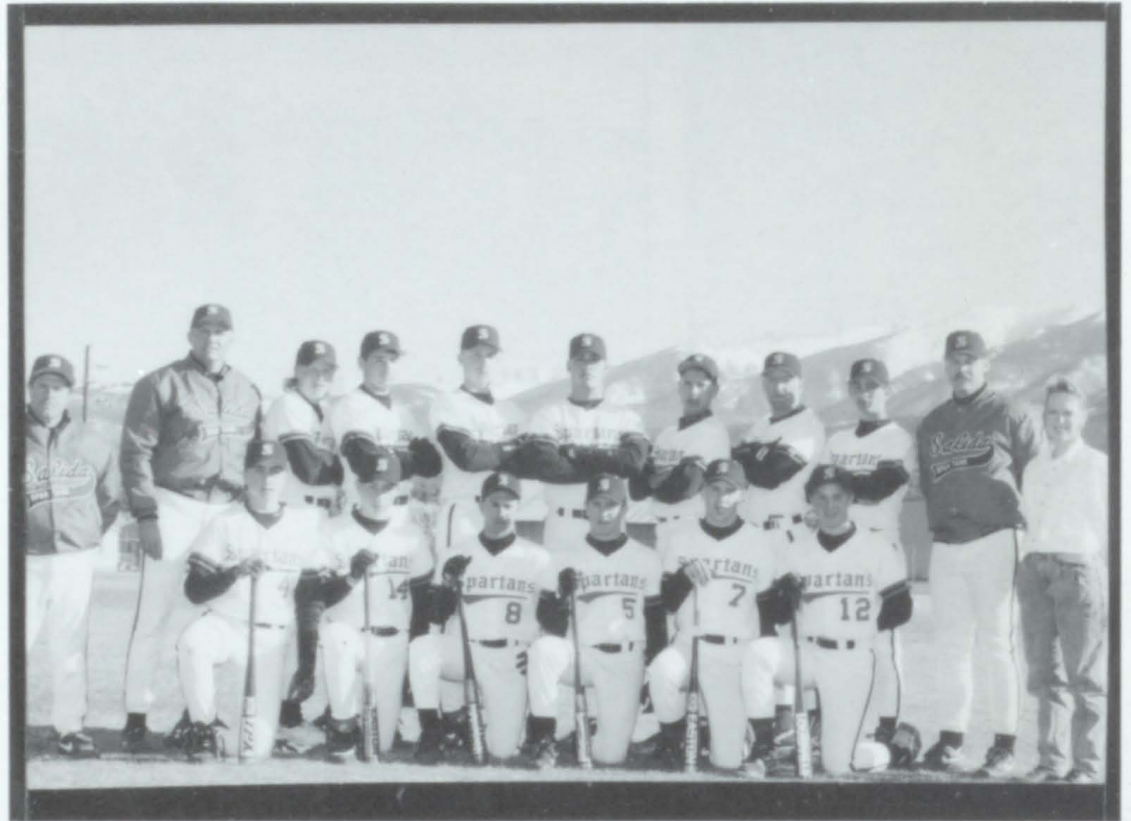

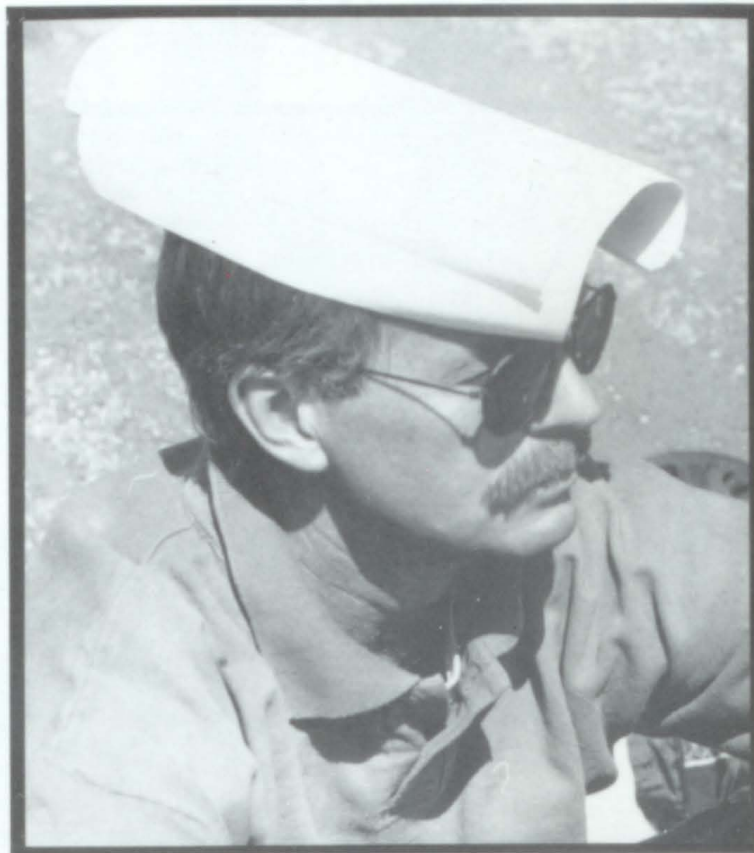
The Salida High girls' tennis program had a young team in 1994. The team consisted of mainly freshmen and sophomores. The team had twenty-six players, however.

The season record was 0-9, but many were lost by one match.



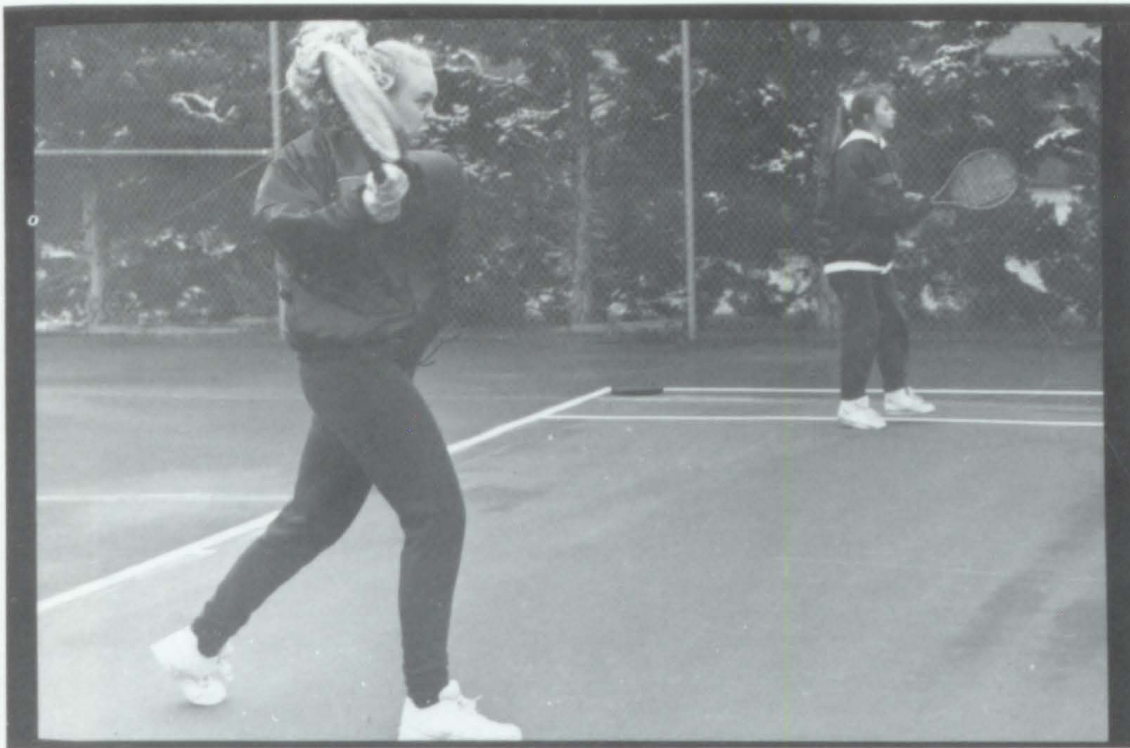

**A**uto shop, Metals, Wood shop and, Drafting are all industrial arts classes at Salida

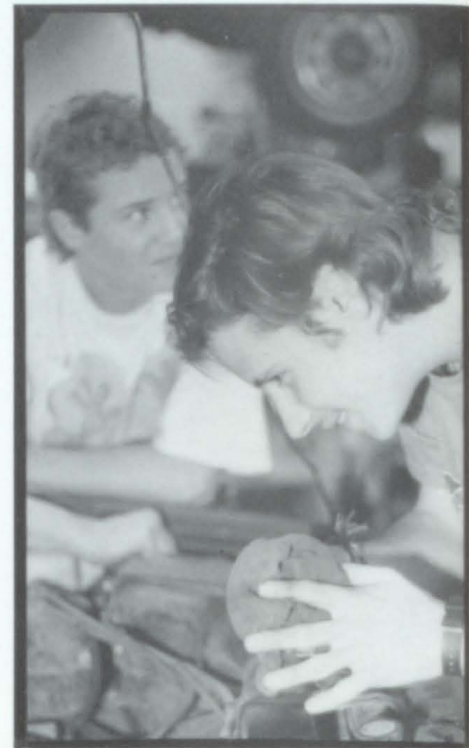
High School. Steve Best and Dave Bauldauf were the instructors and supervisors of these classes. In all of these classes students got the opportunity to work with their hands.

used a lot of hand on participation. Physics was taught by Thorgesen, students studied light, atoms, and laws of motion and force.

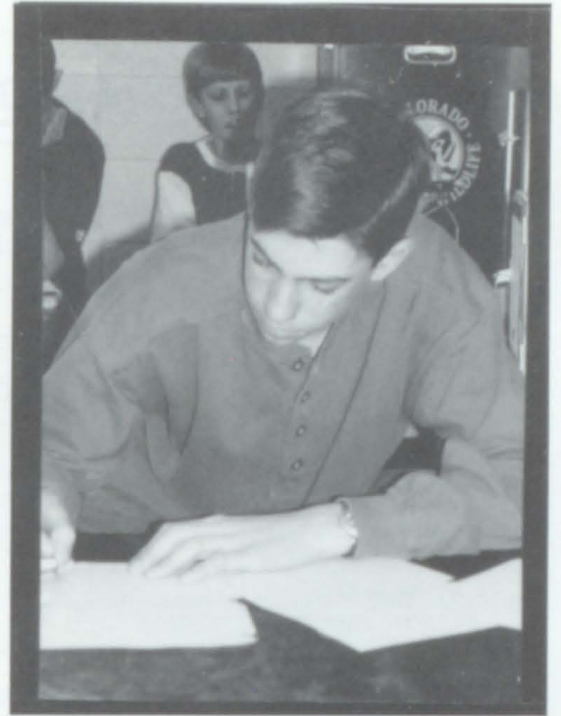

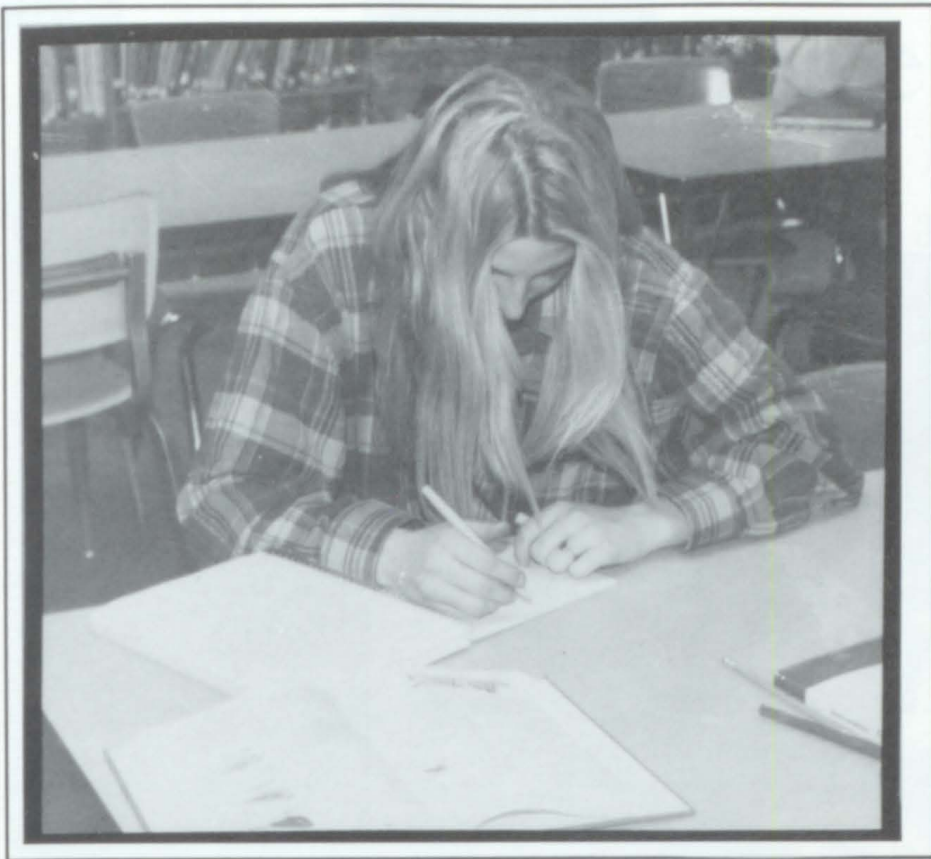

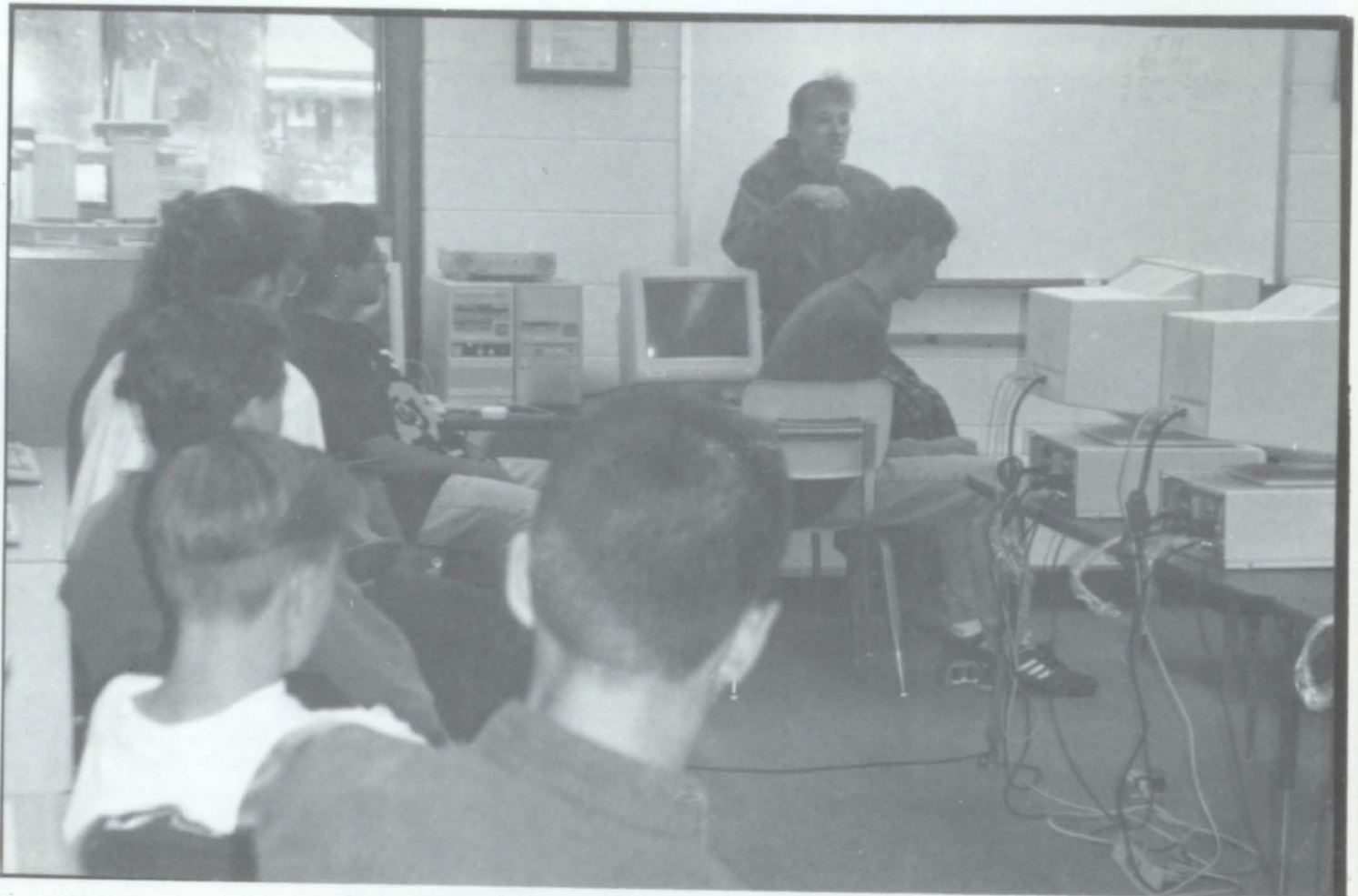
"The business department is growing and expanding, and classes that I teach, which are primarily keyboarding, and word processing,

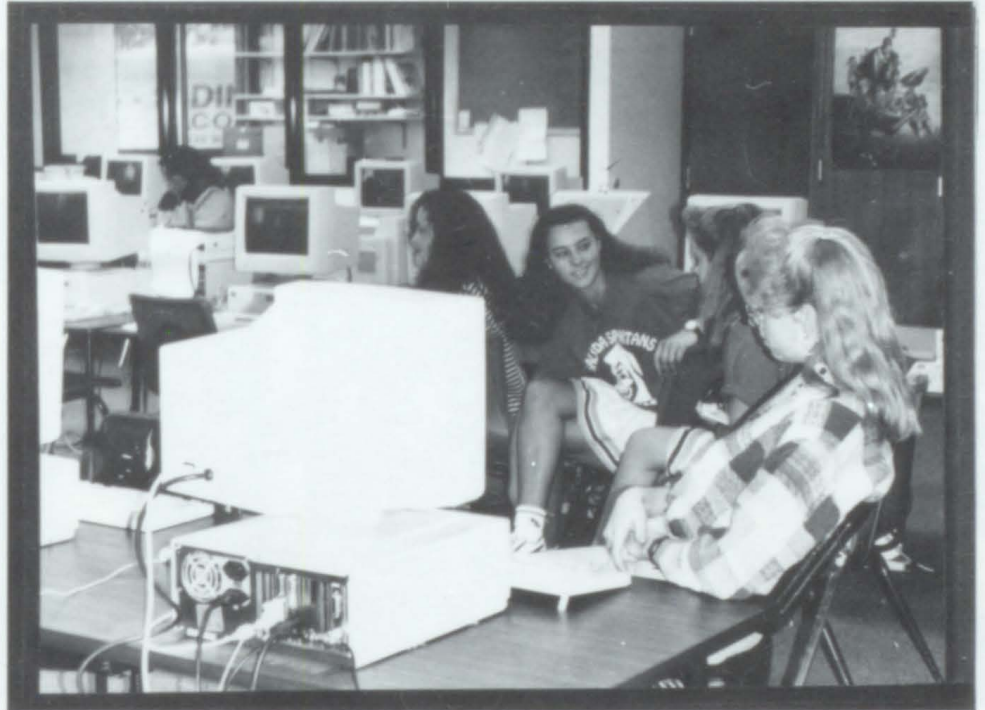

A very talked about article this year was a series on inhalents used by high school students around the nation. The series was written by Times Editor Mike Mansheim.

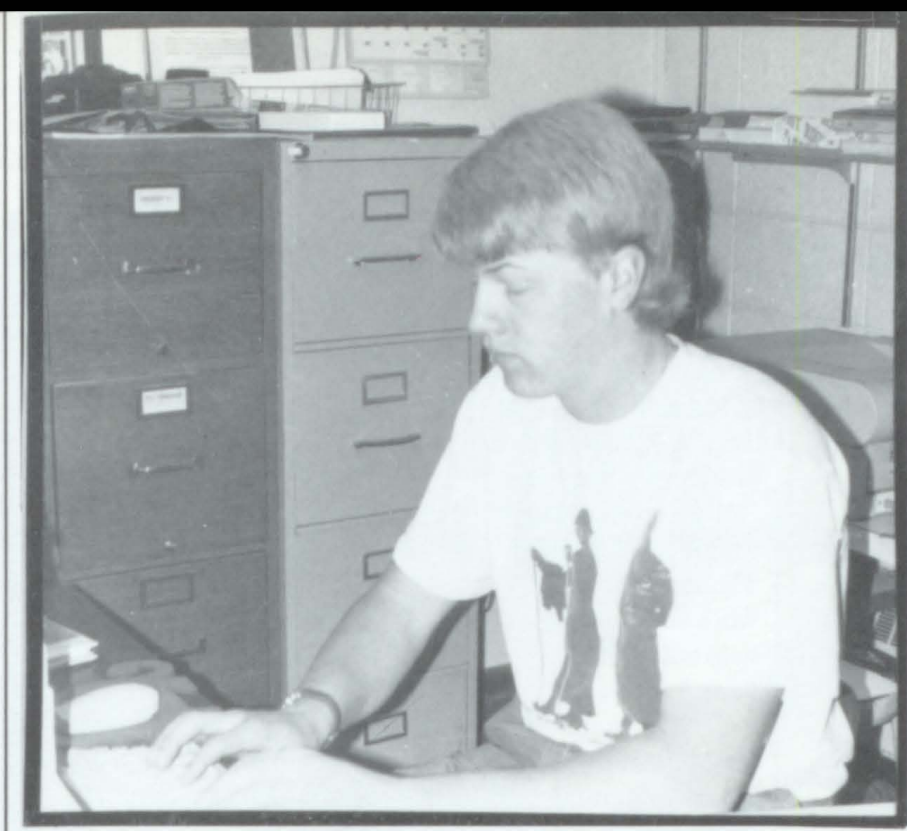

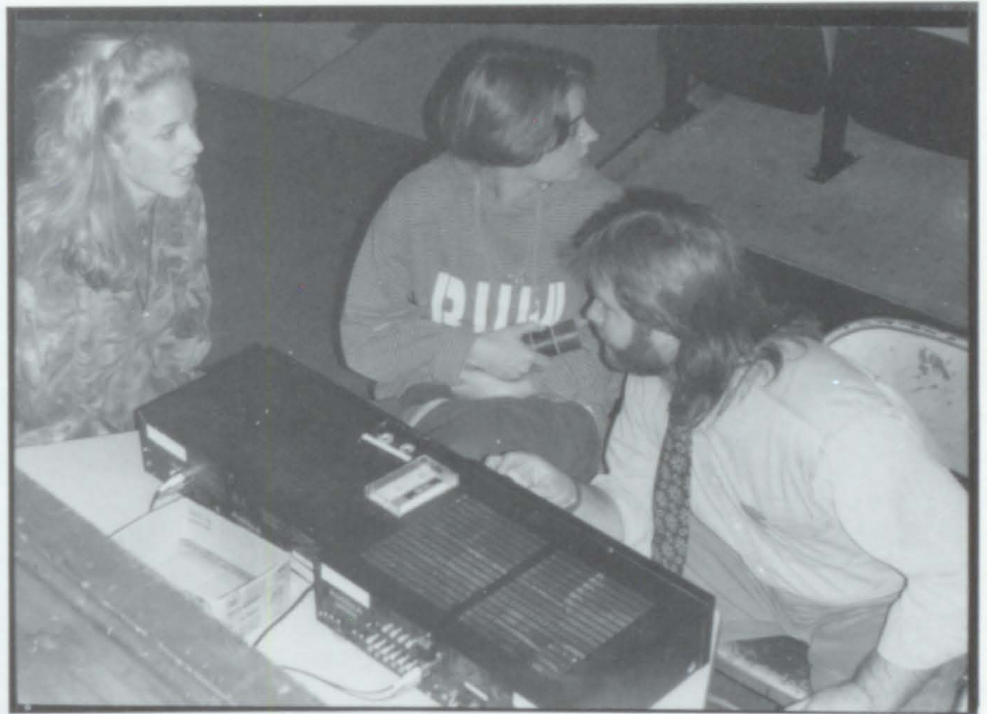

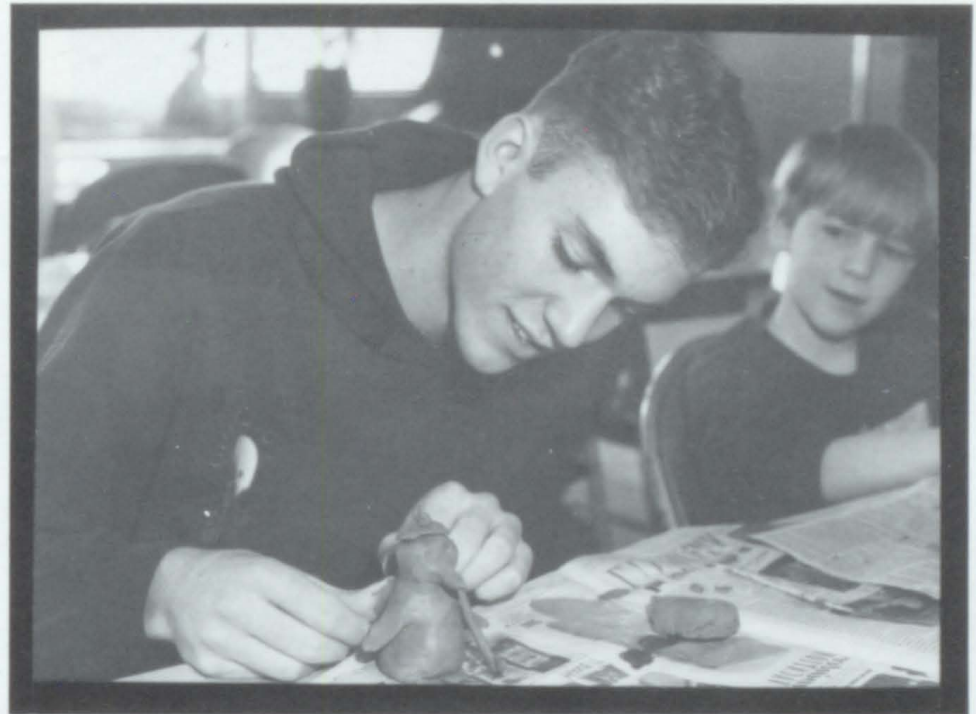

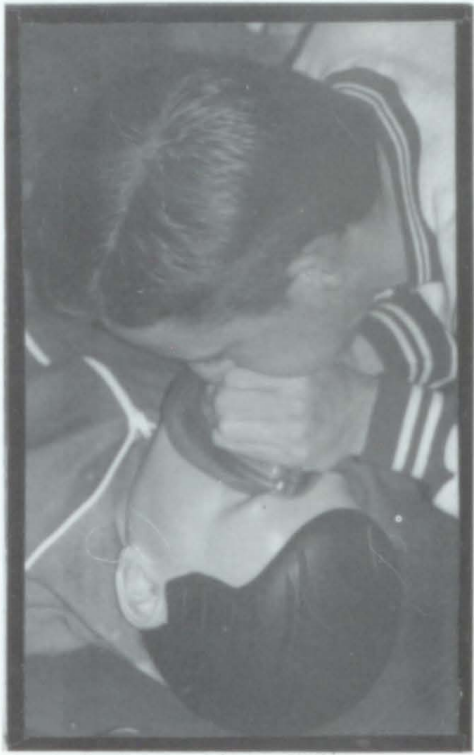
**S**alida High got a new P.E. teacher this year, Mr. Doug Cogan. Students have commented that he has really worked to improve the weightlifting program.

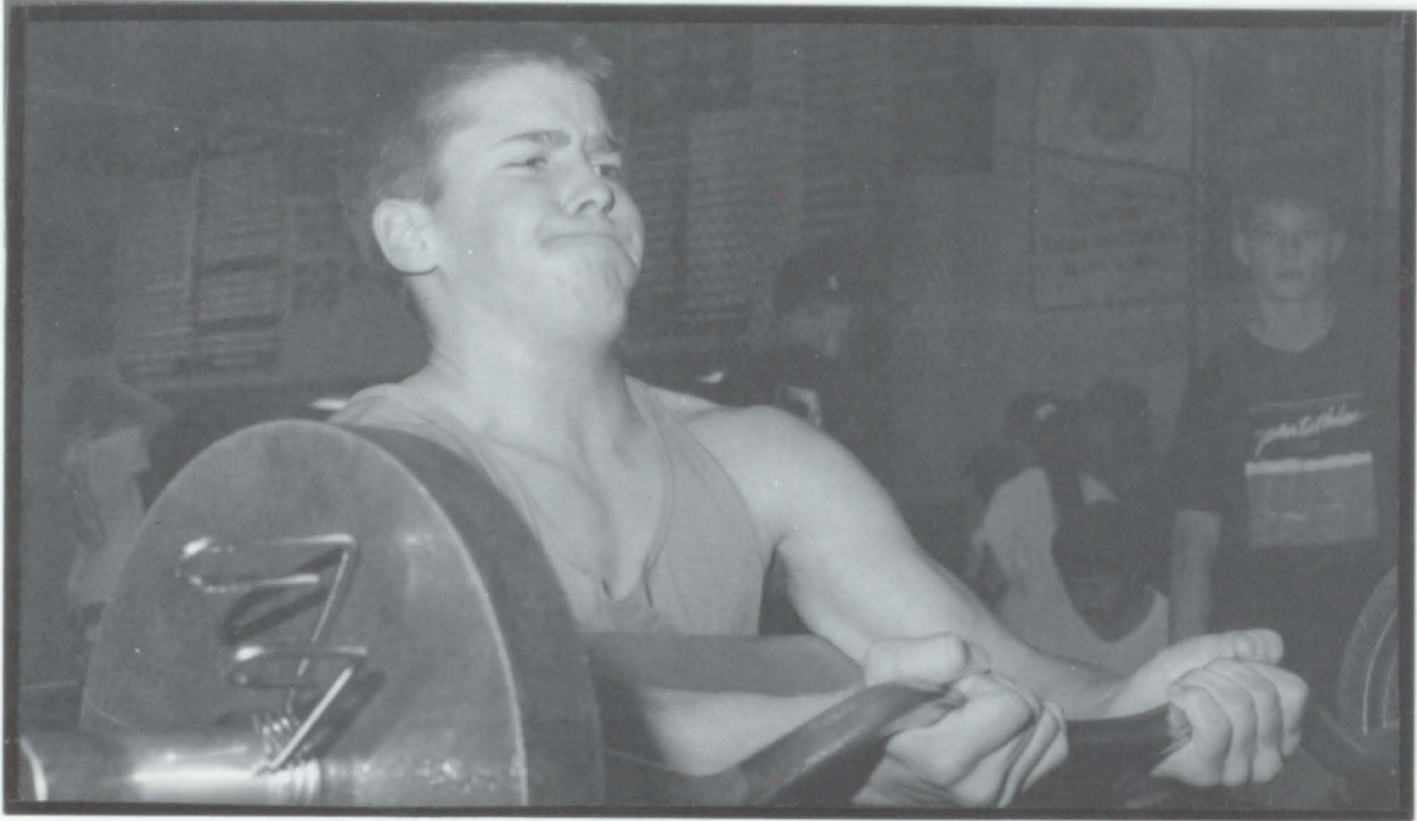

We asked Mr. Thorgeson

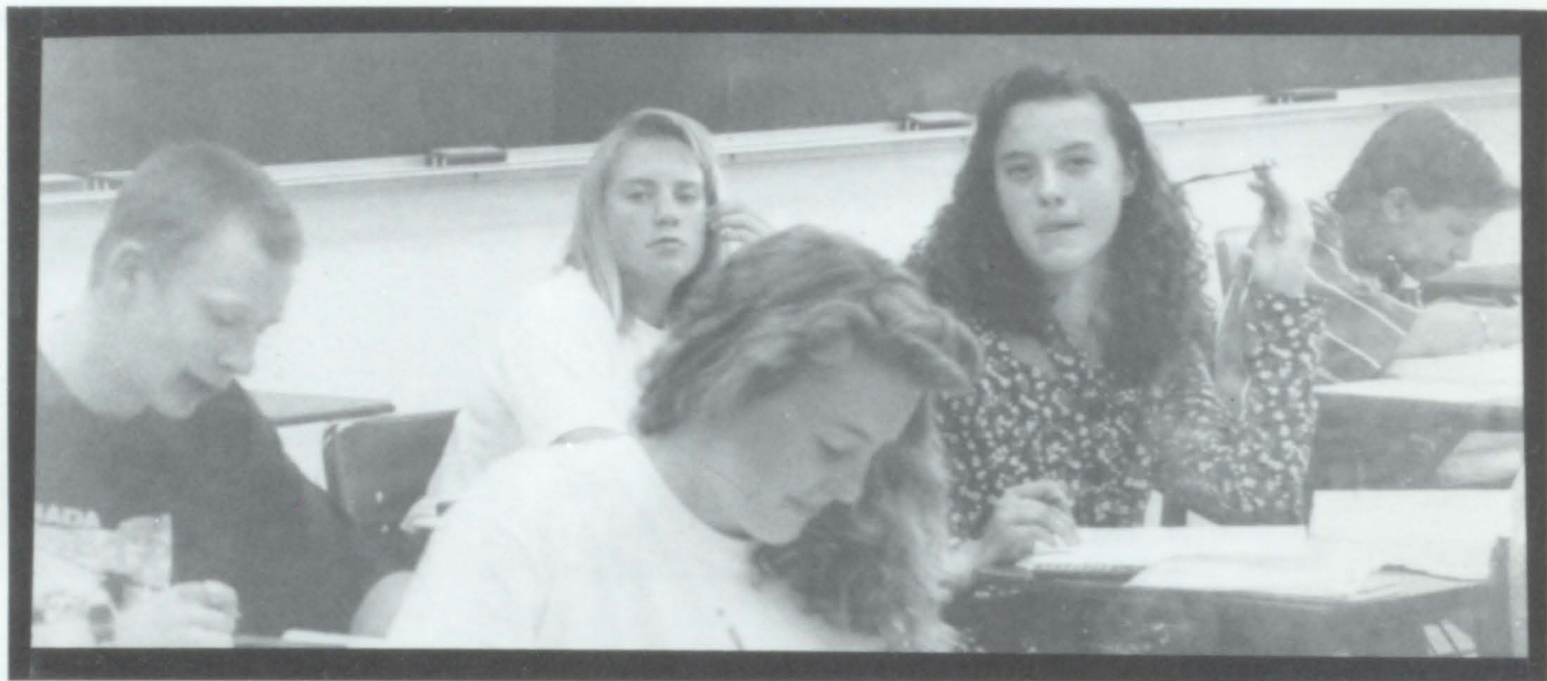
