


The class of 2006 is finally here, and what a blast it has been. Even though our first day may have been a little scary, we realize now that it really is everything we hoped for.





Overall the players had a fun season and they became a very close-knit team. This group of players will always remember the friendships that were forged while on the soccer field!








Blakeley pre-qualified for state in 400 meter dash














Above Right: Soph Kyle Kuester works hard to gain the upper hand in this wrestling match




















































