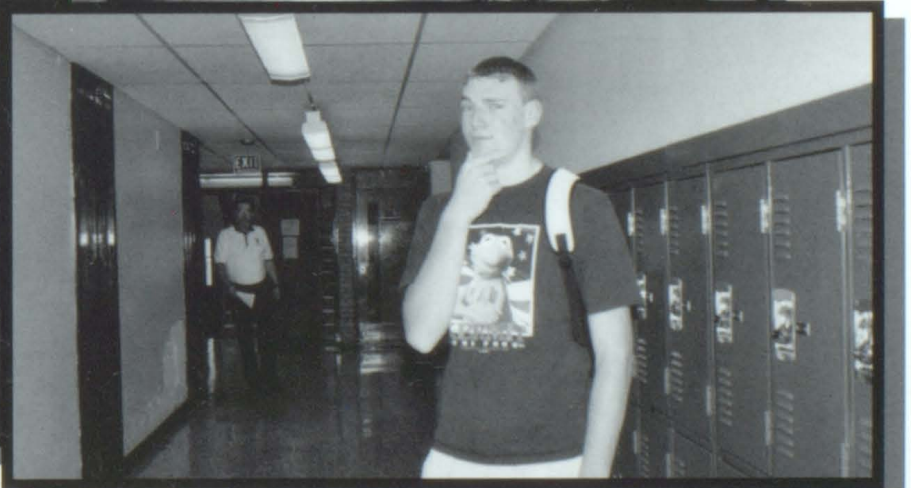

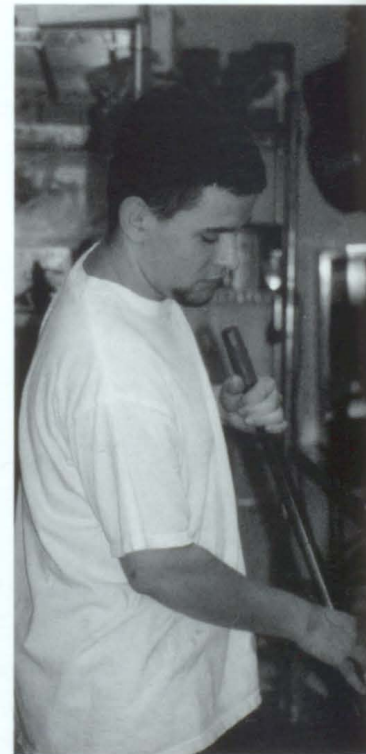

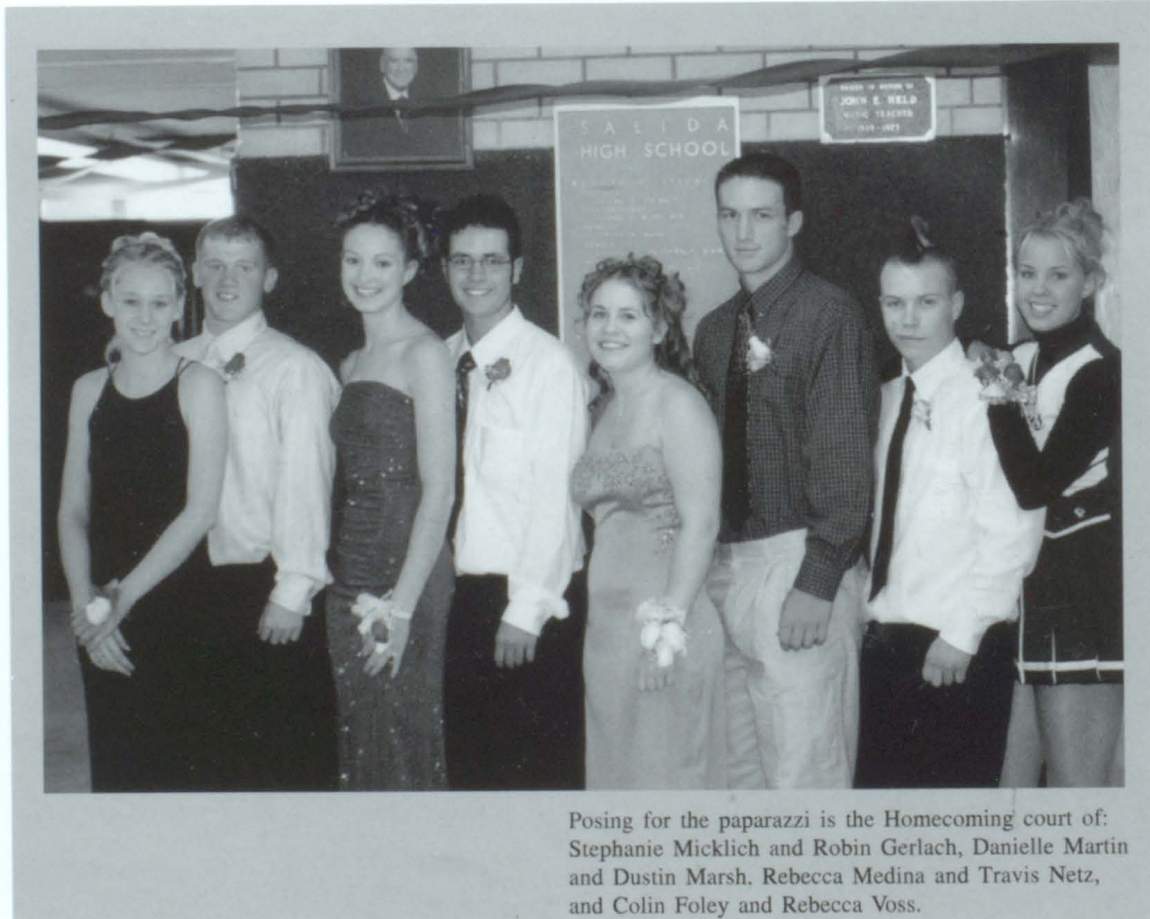

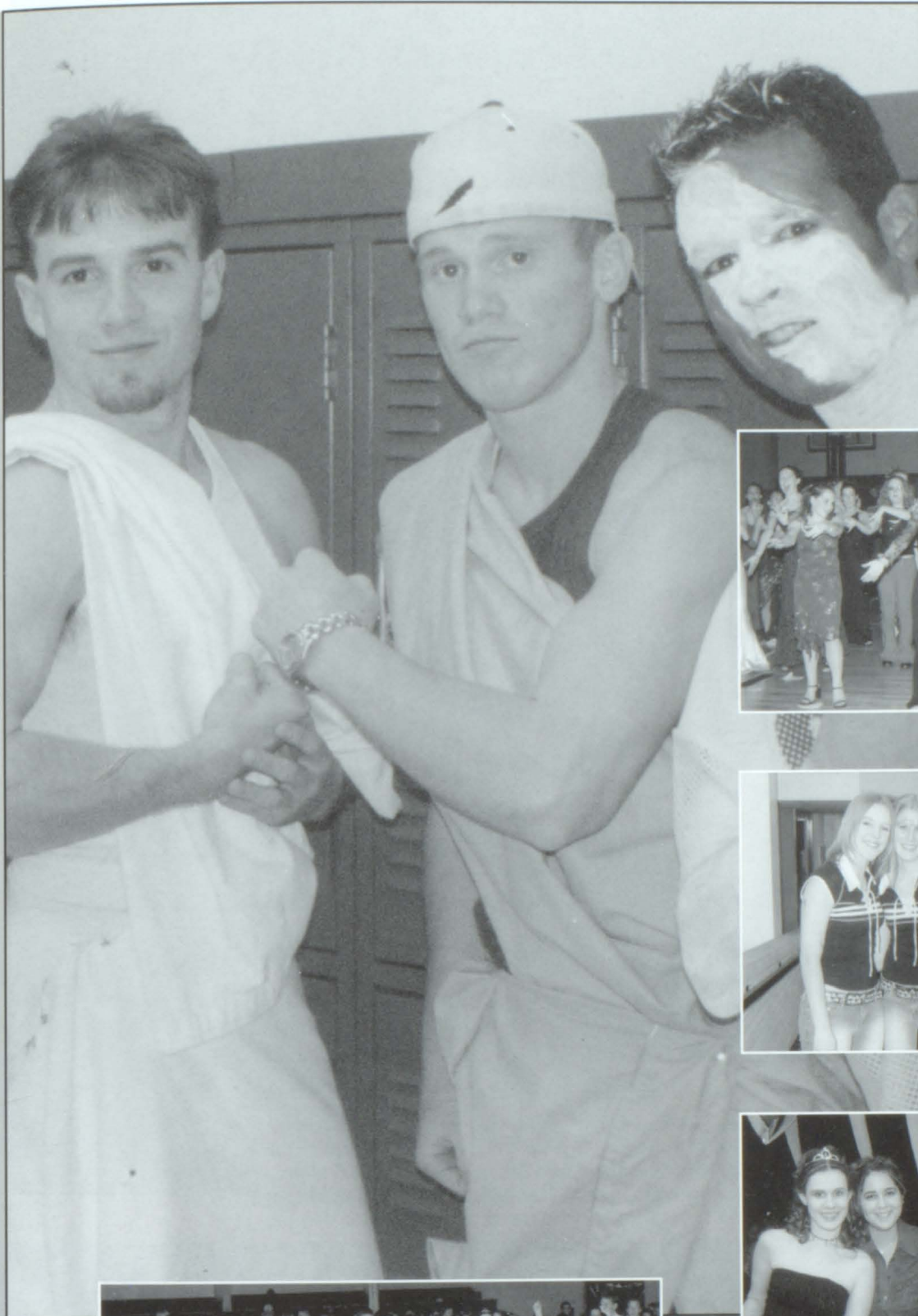

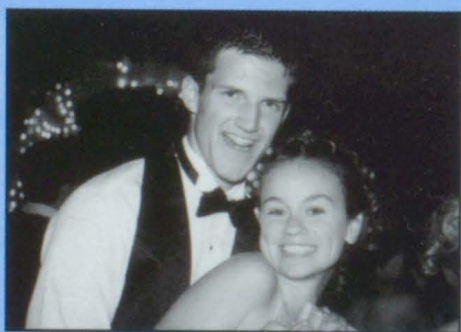

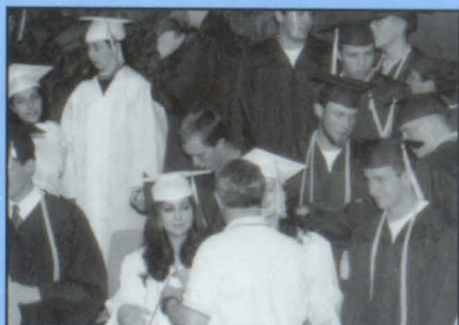

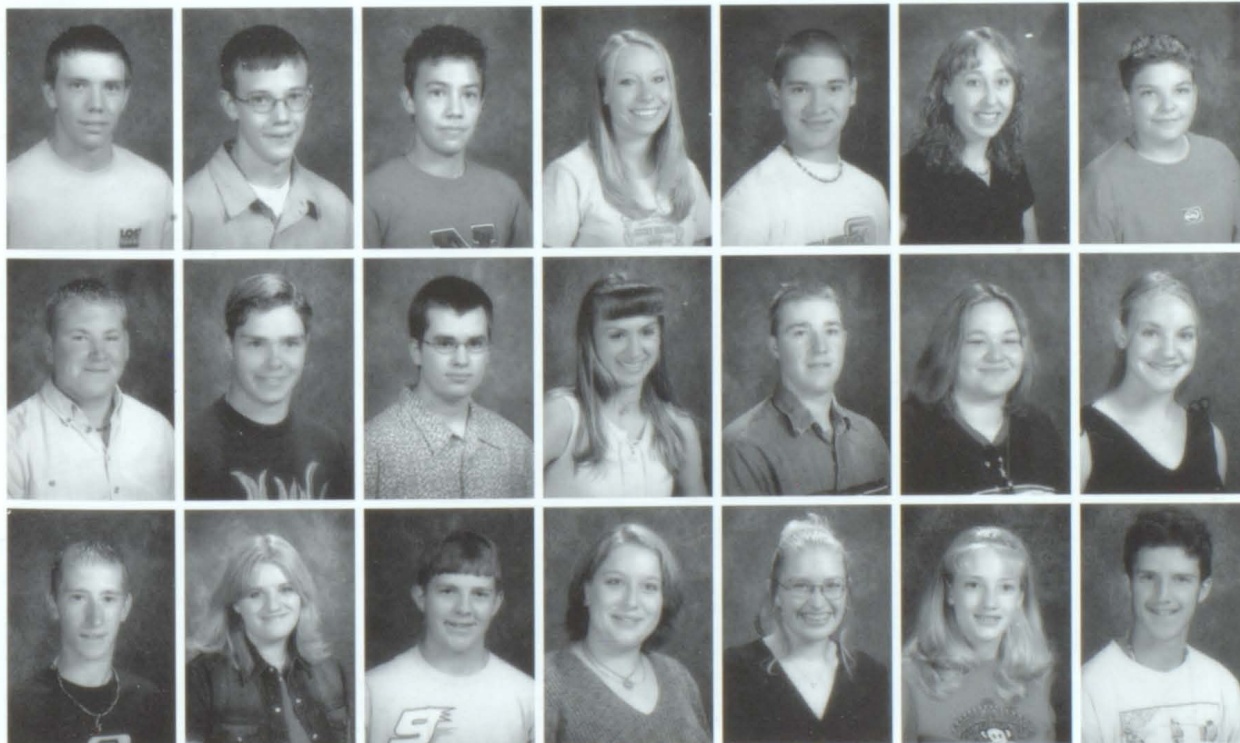


Yesterday we made our memories...The junior class has had many memorable moments throughout their high school career. Michelle Ertl recalled, "I'll never forget all of those times at the dances."

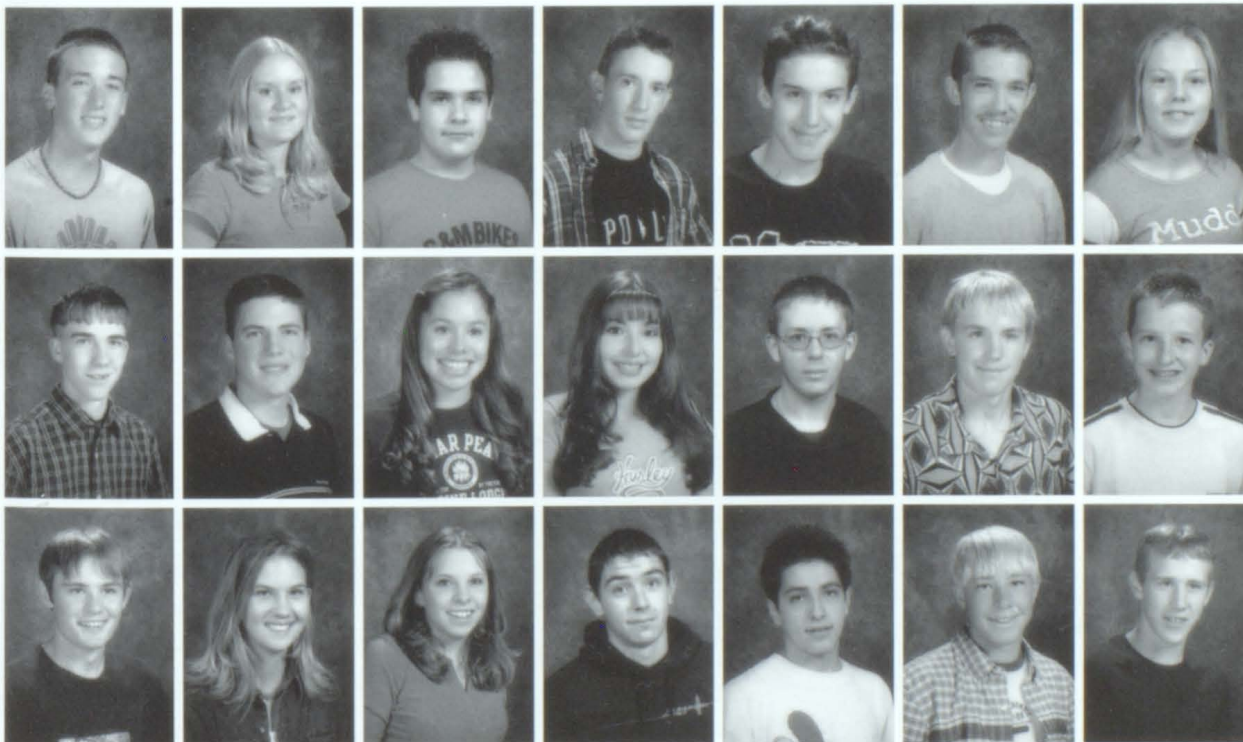
One Year Down...Three to Go

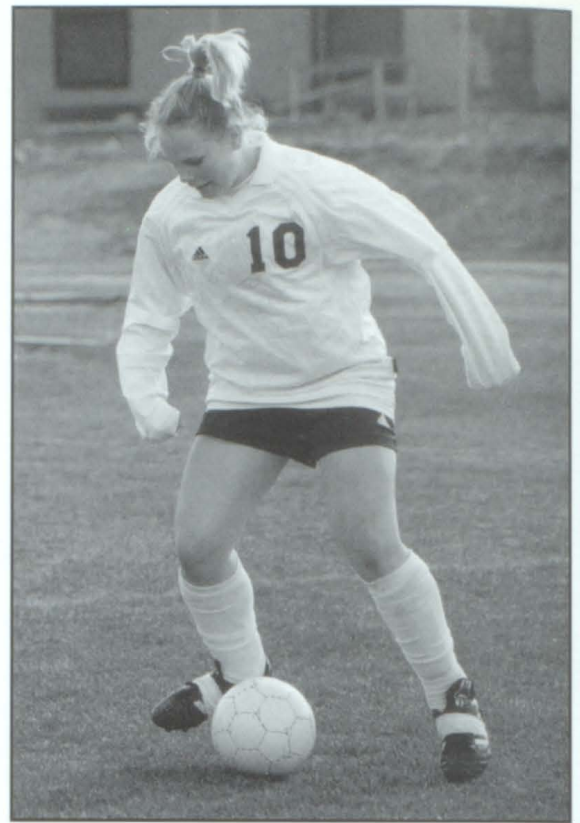

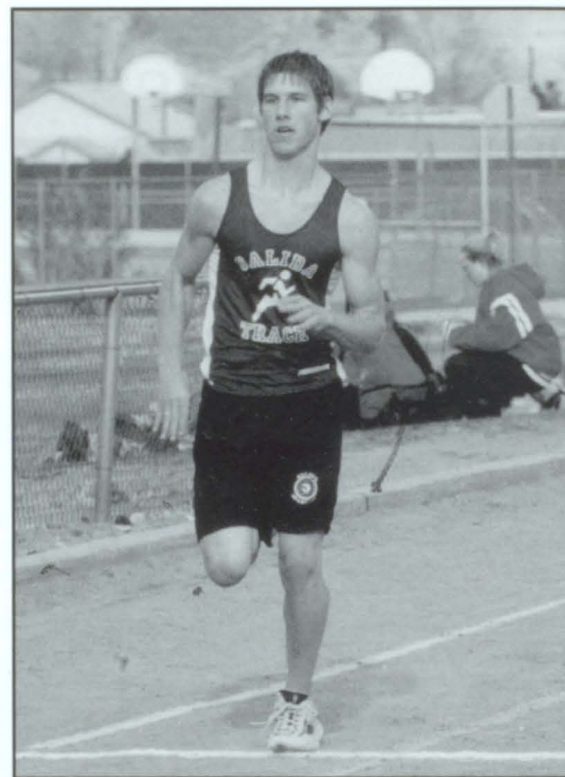

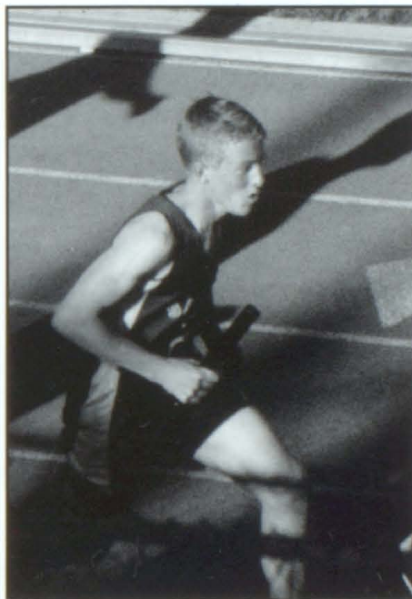

To go to state, a girl must achieve a score of at least under 100. Most courses have had a double par rule, which means once they have double of what the par is on the hole, they must pick up their ball.

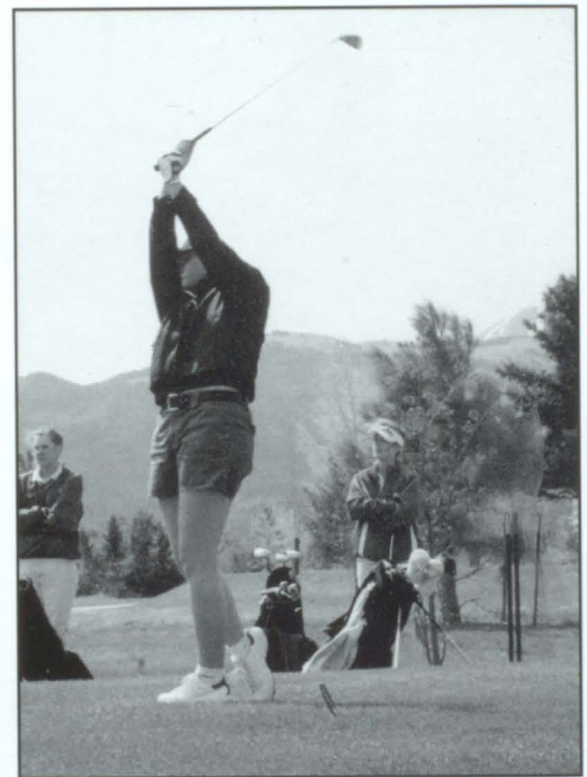

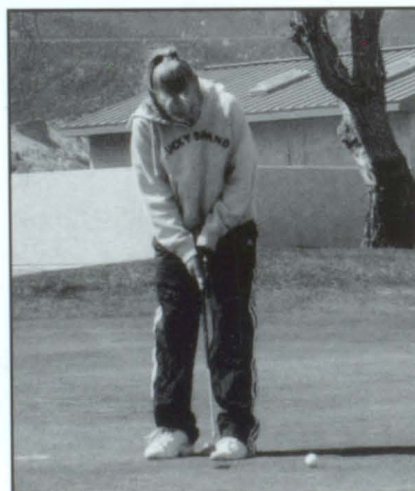

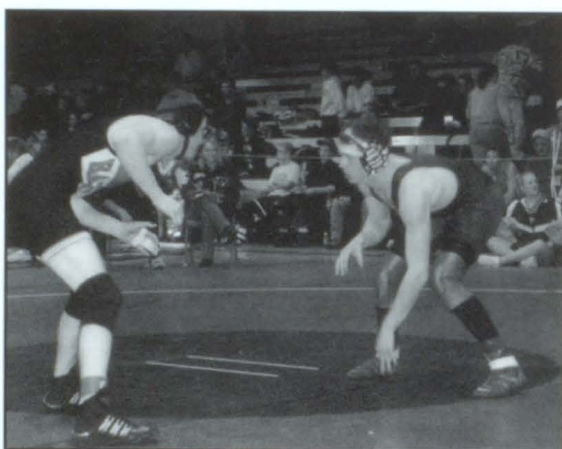

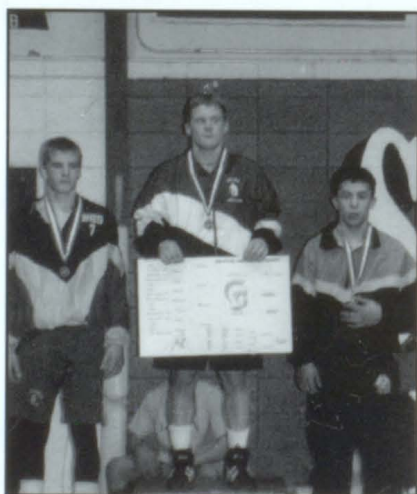

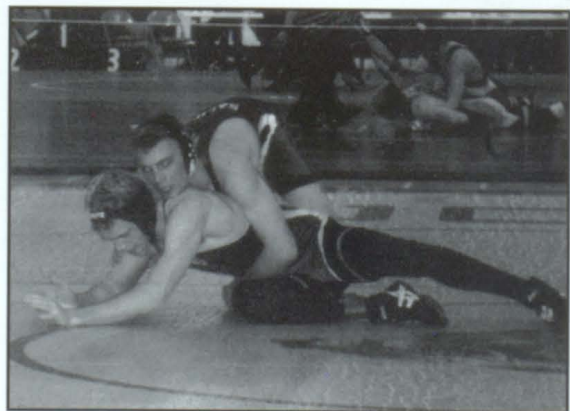

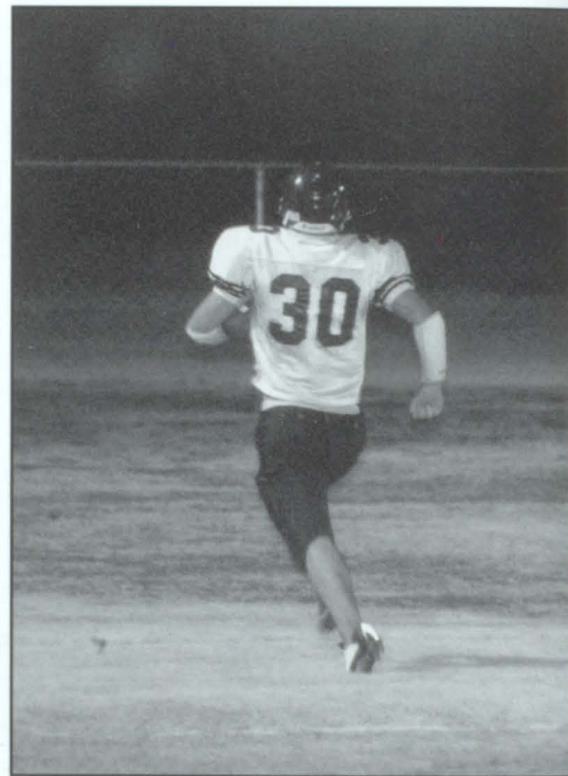

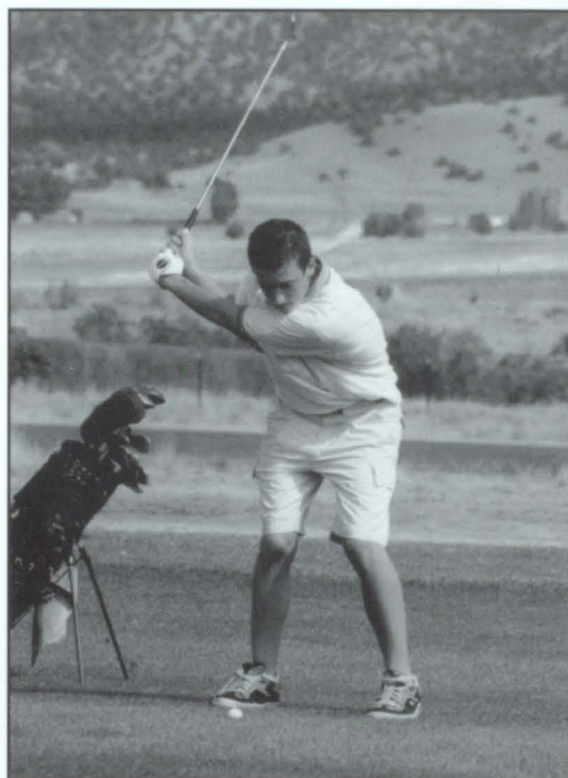

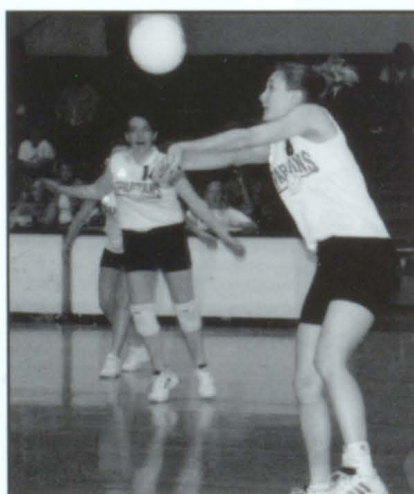

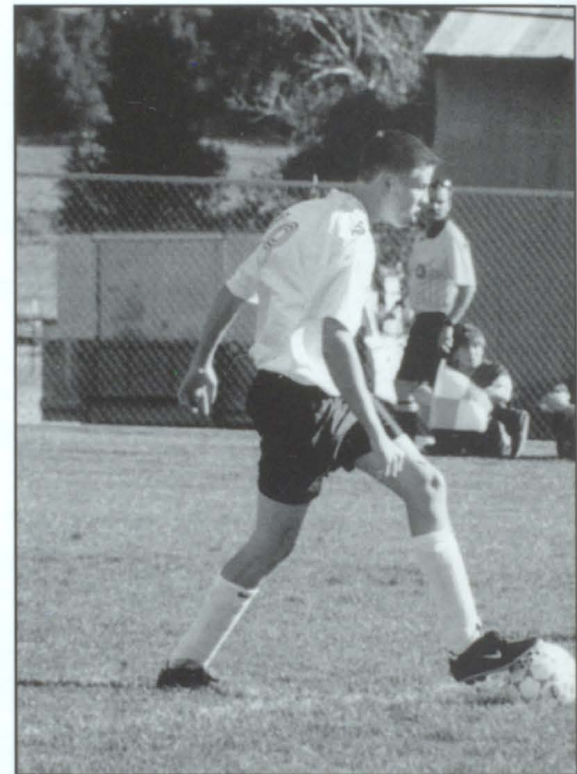

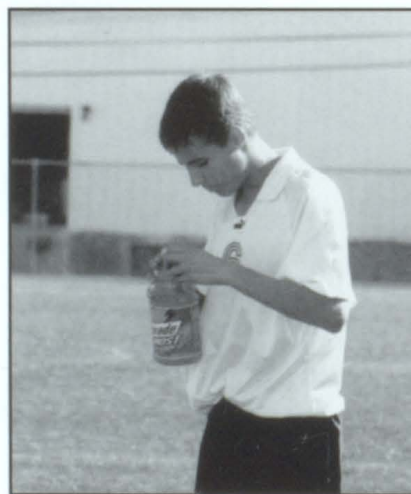

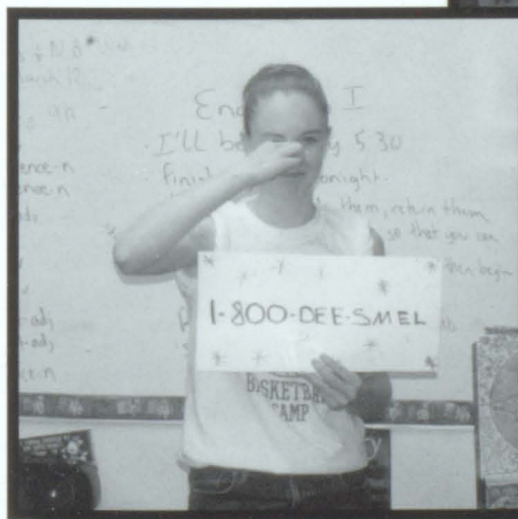

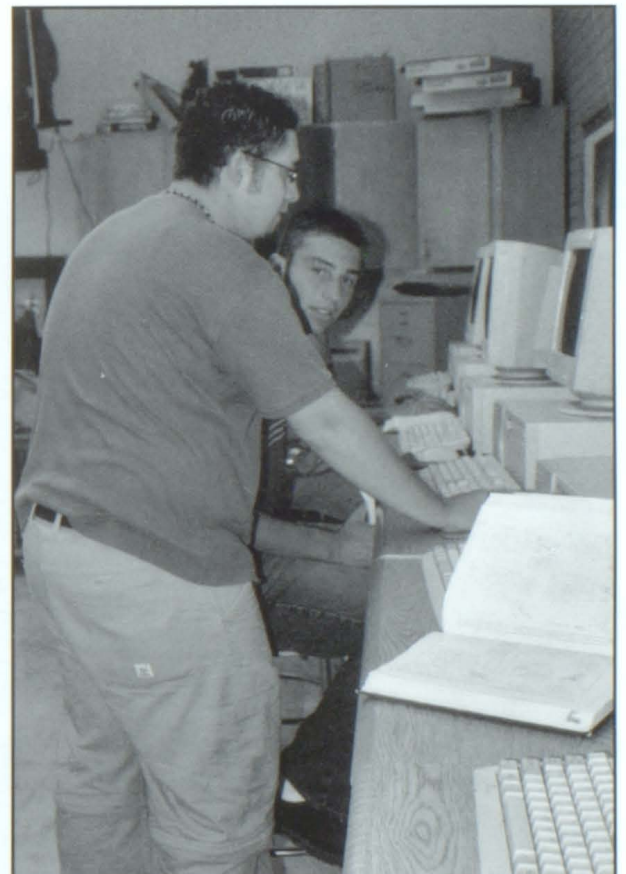

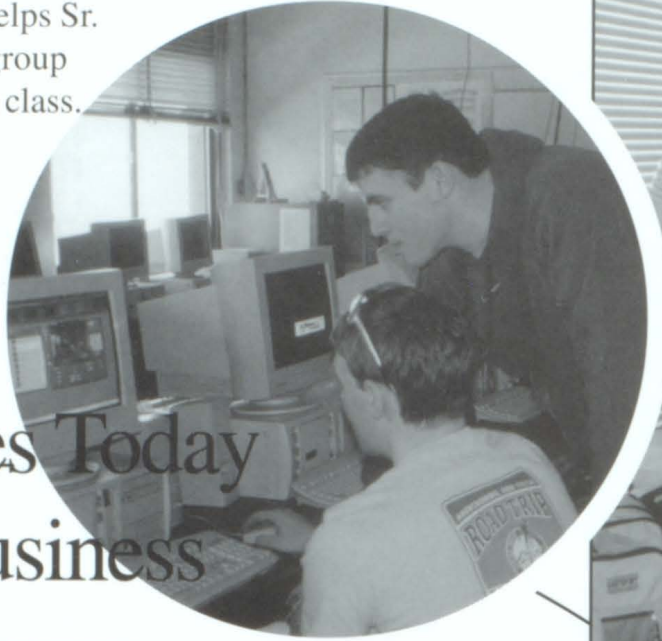

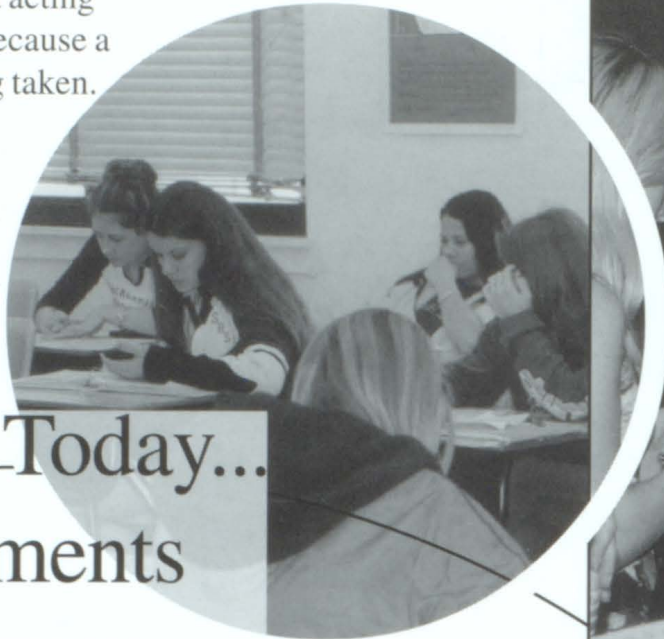

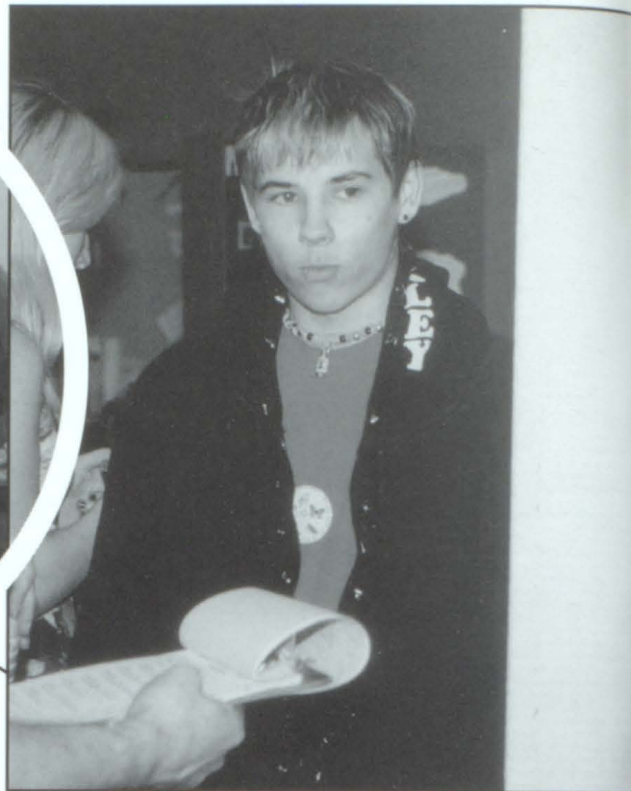
Numbers Today... Experiments Tomorrow.

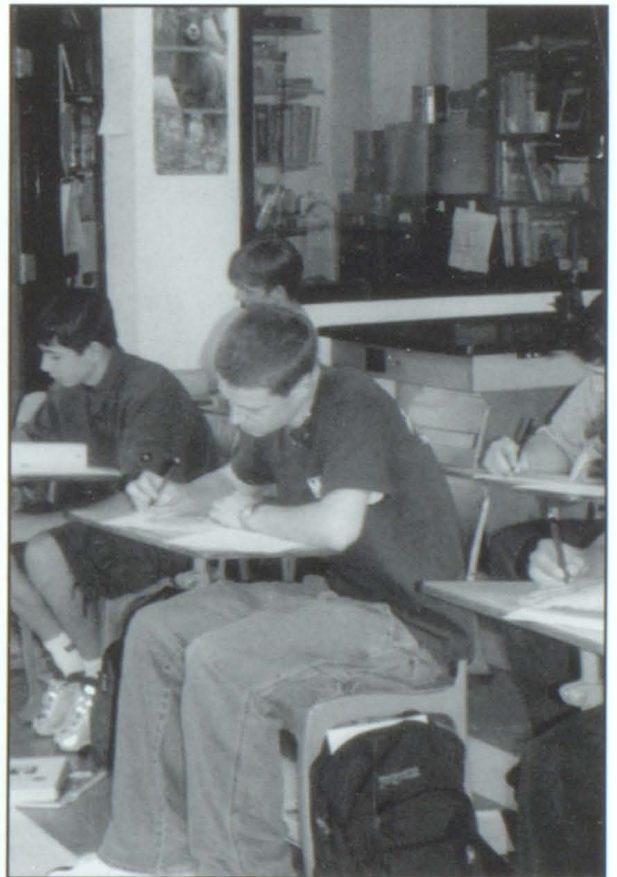

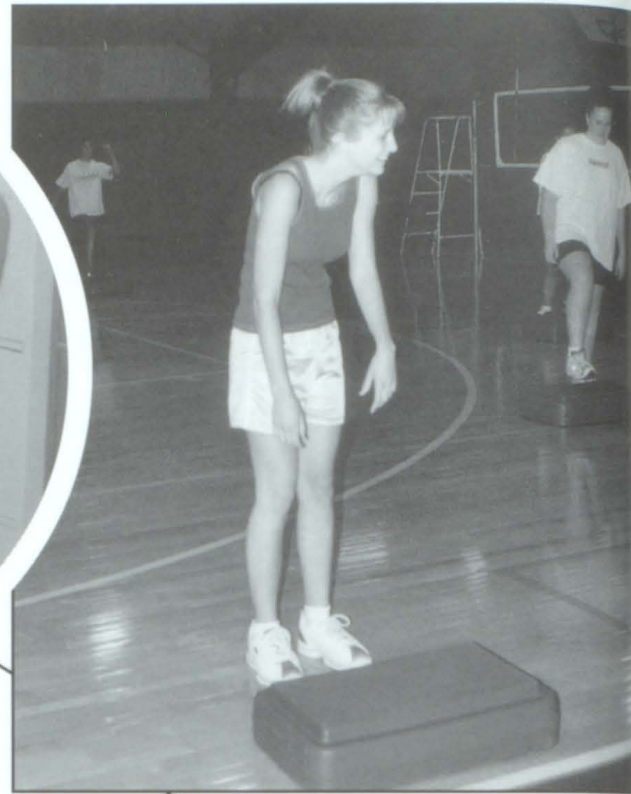

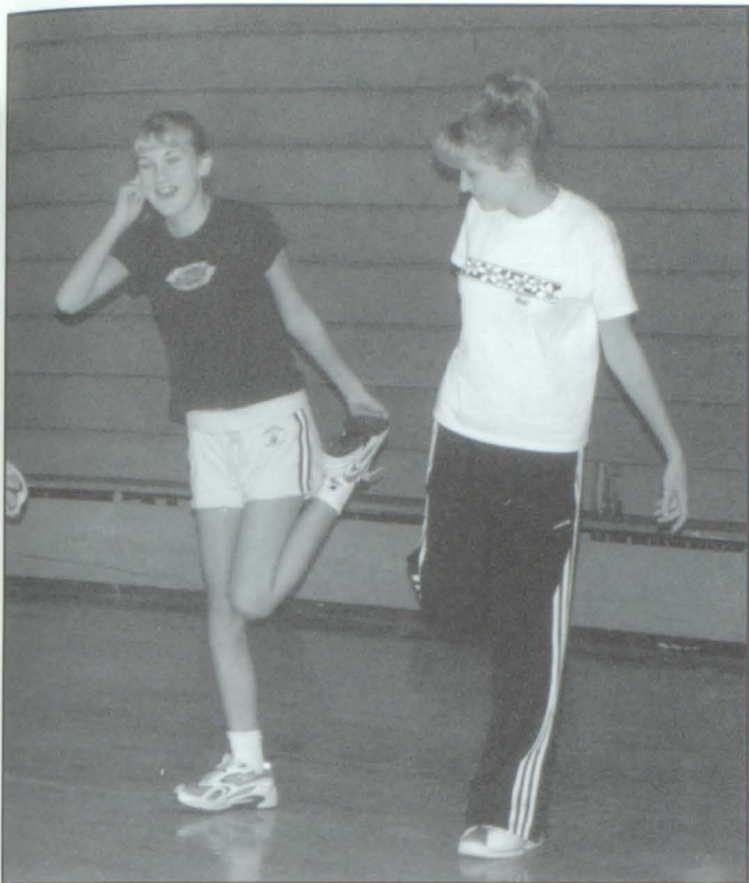

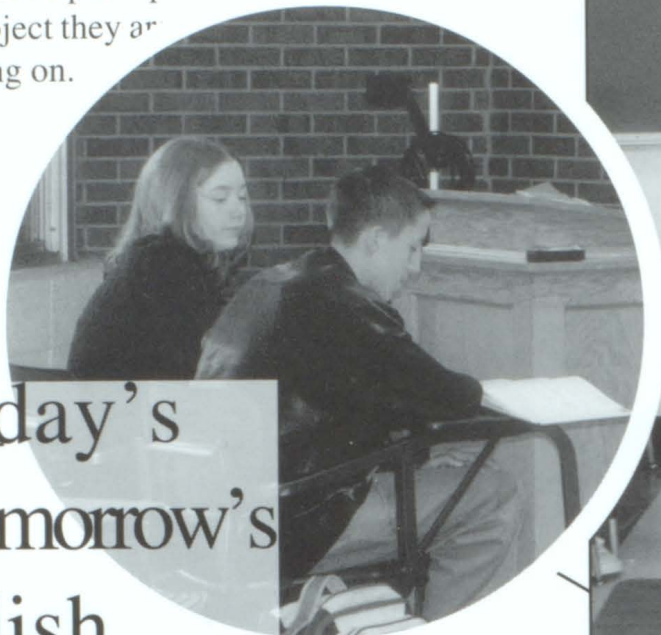

Mr. Richardson- "This is my second year teaching at Salida High. I am trying to keep my curriculum the same, but only make it more thematic."

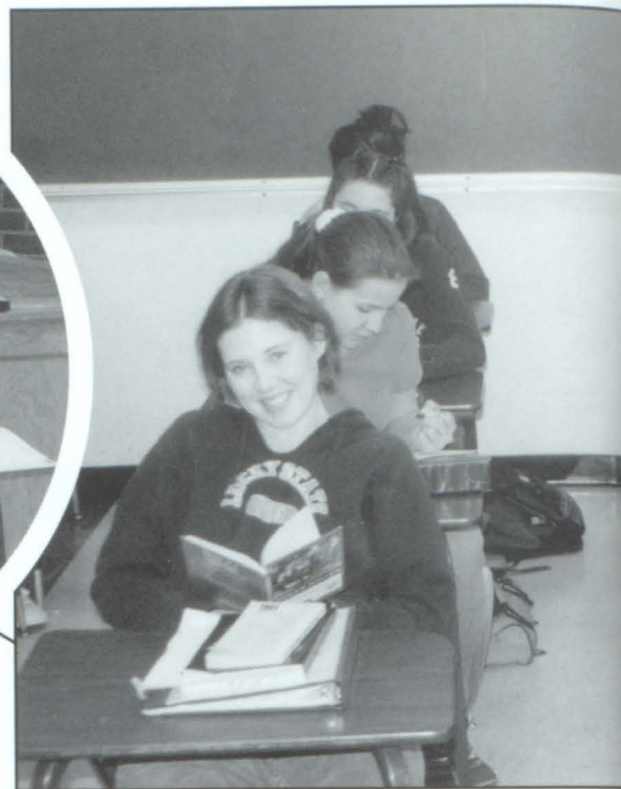
Ms. Curtis- "I've only been teaching at Salida High for two years. This year I've switched up the order of the curriculum a little bit. I just try to make English fun and exciting."

Ms. Roberts- "From year to year I try to find new ways of doing things in my classes."

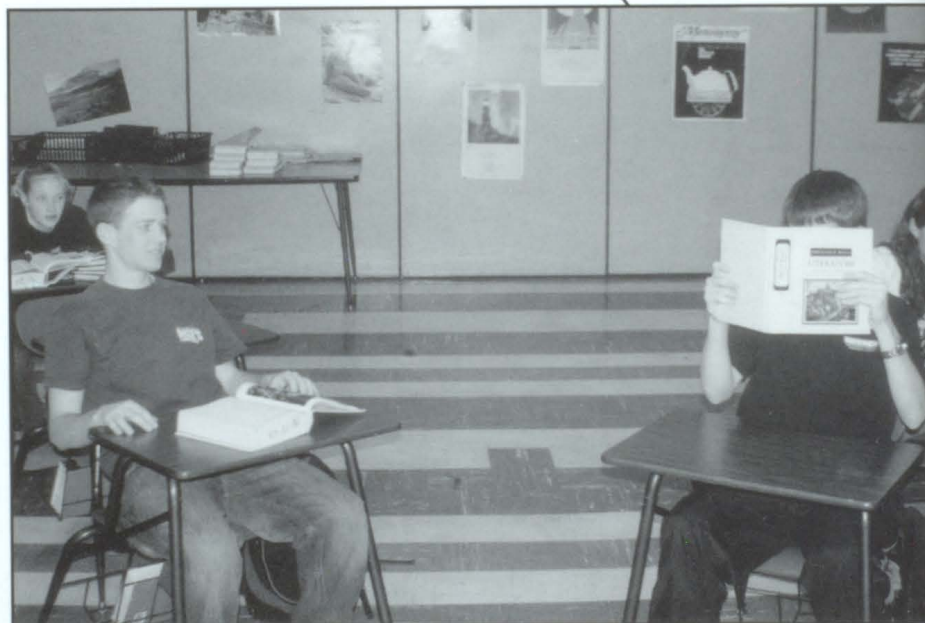

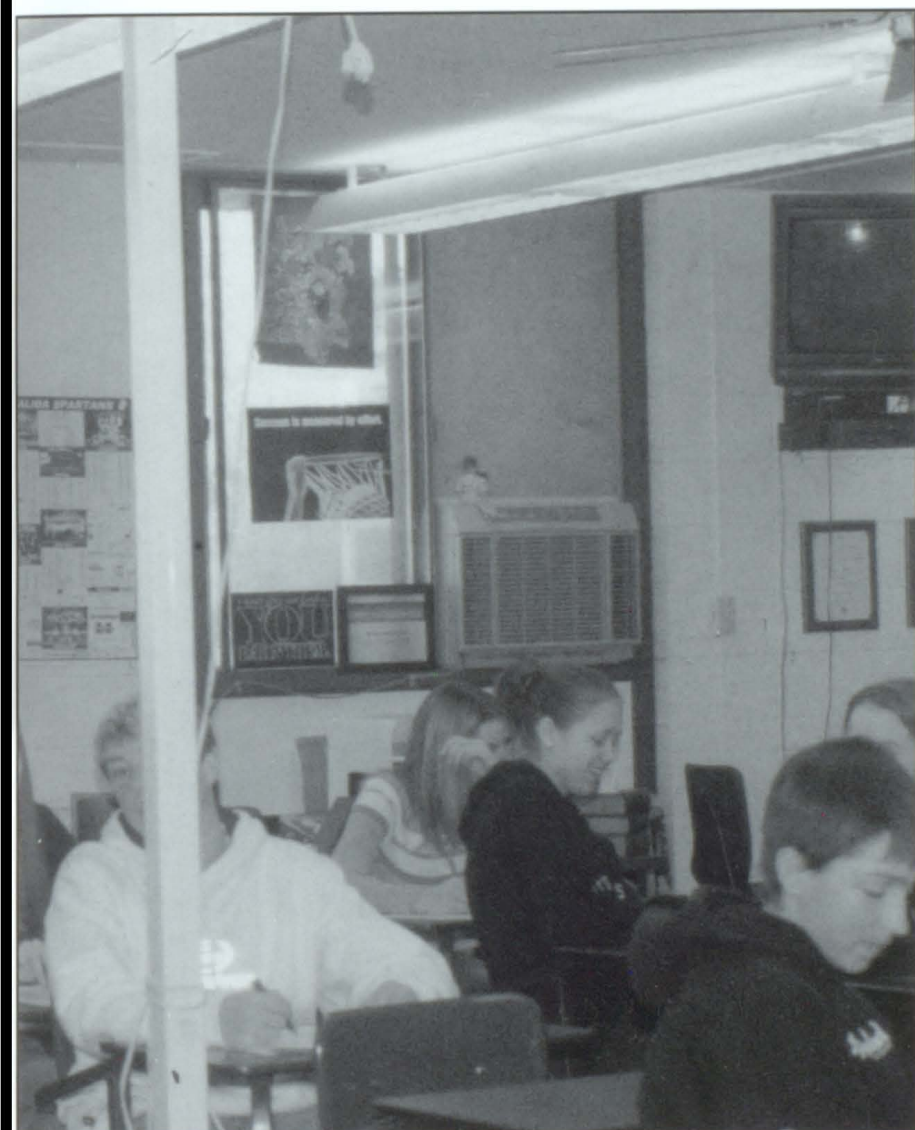

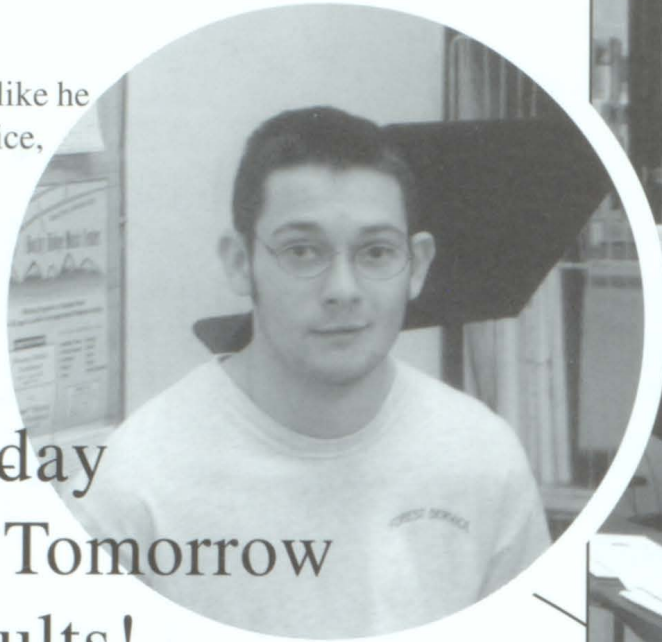

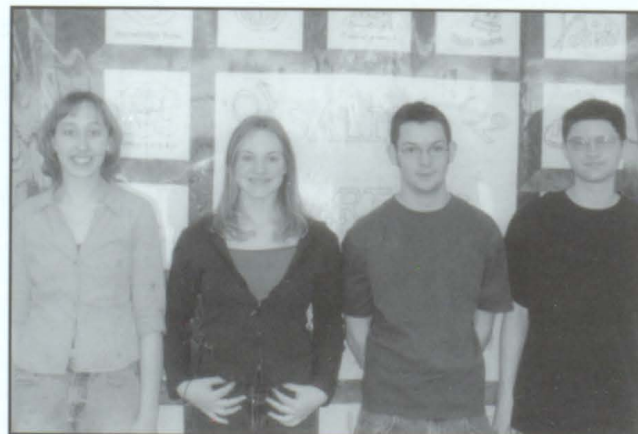

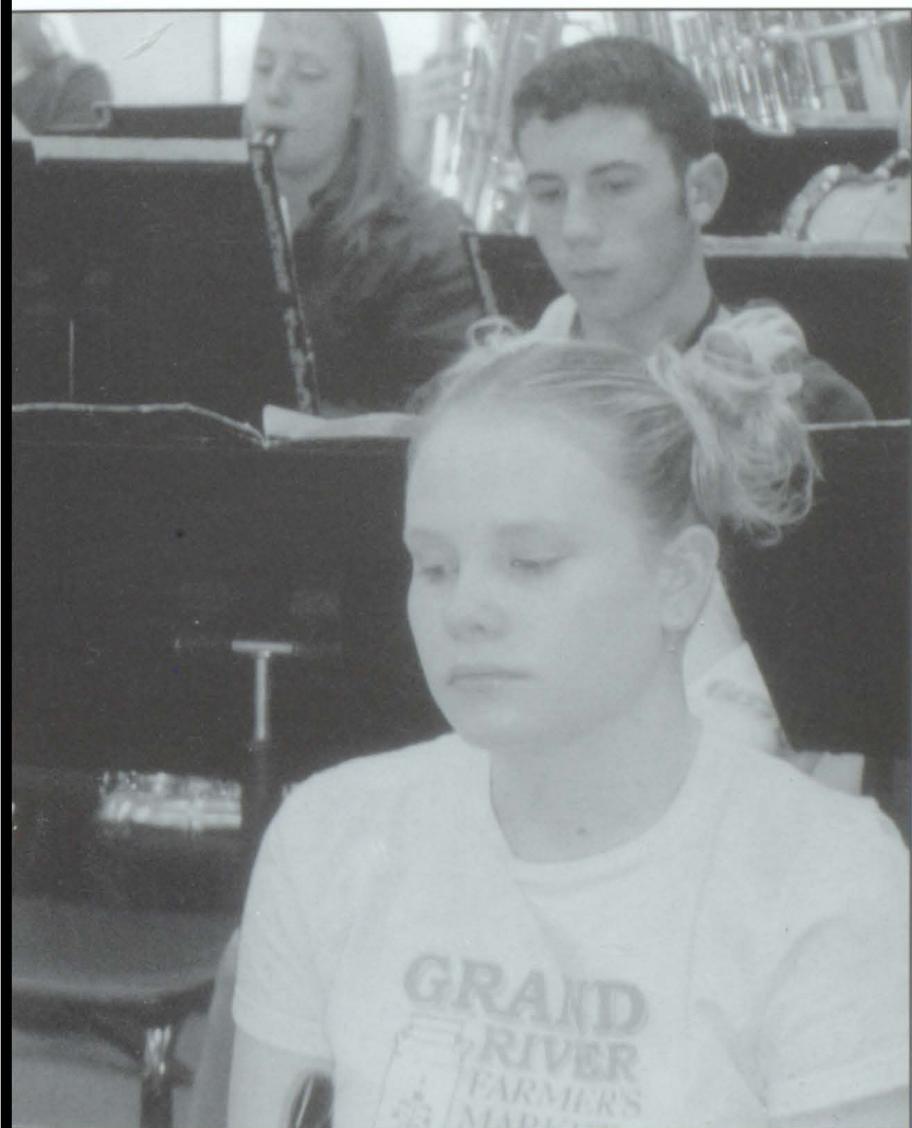

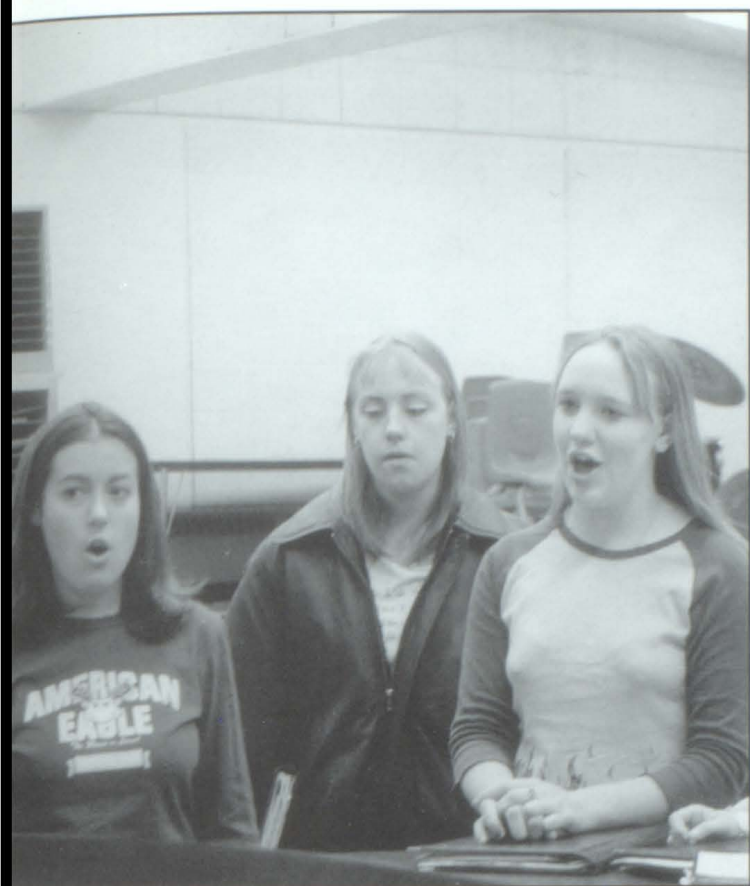

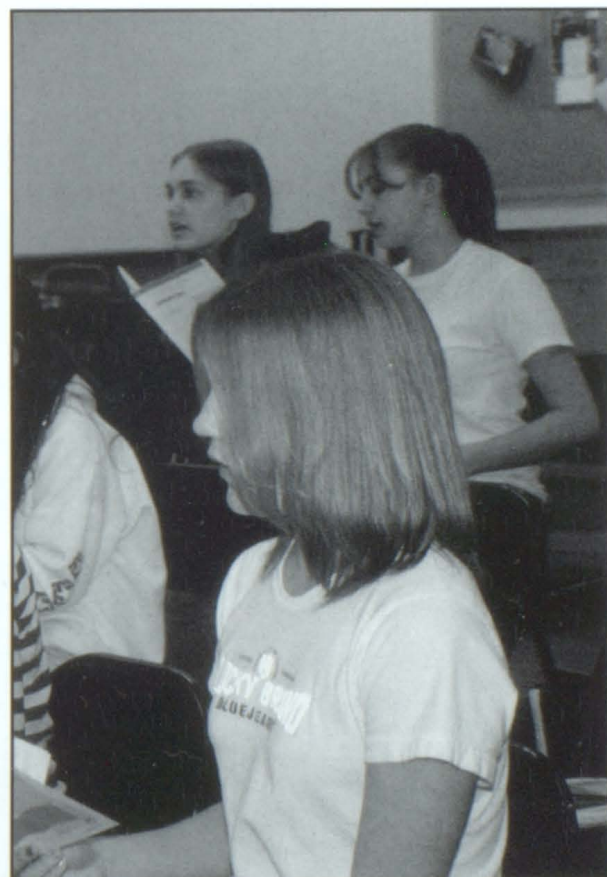

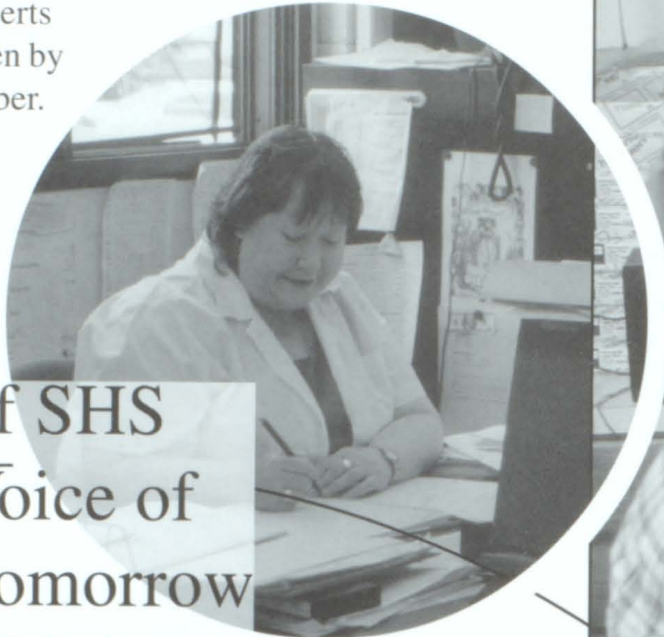

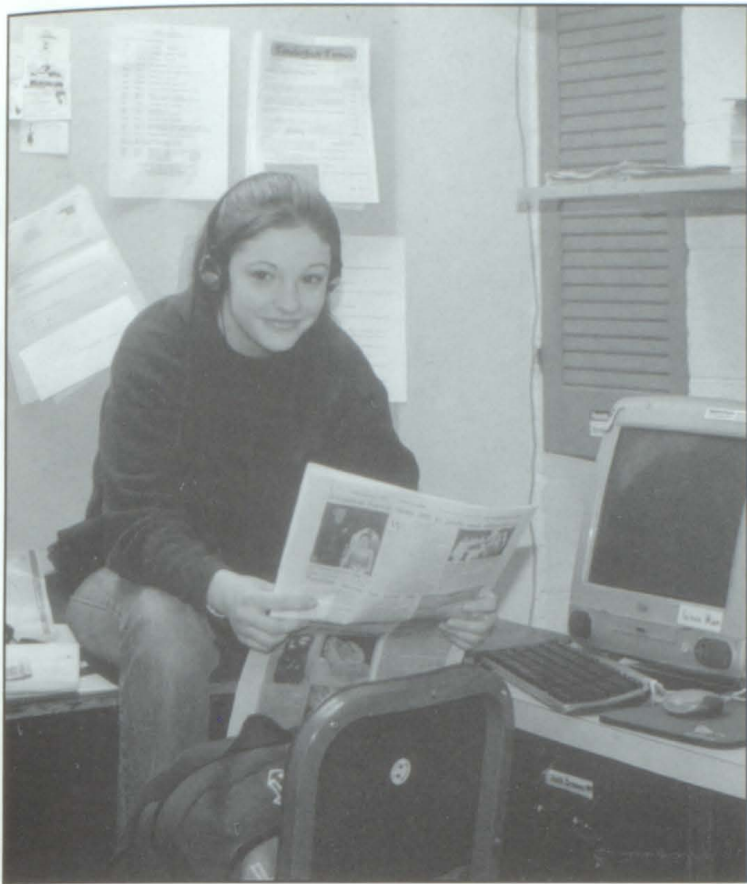

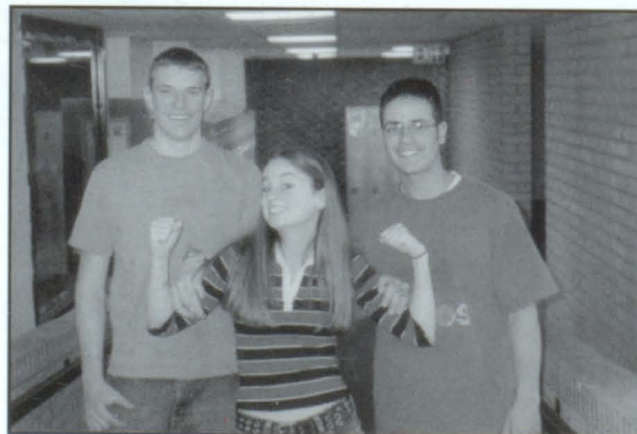

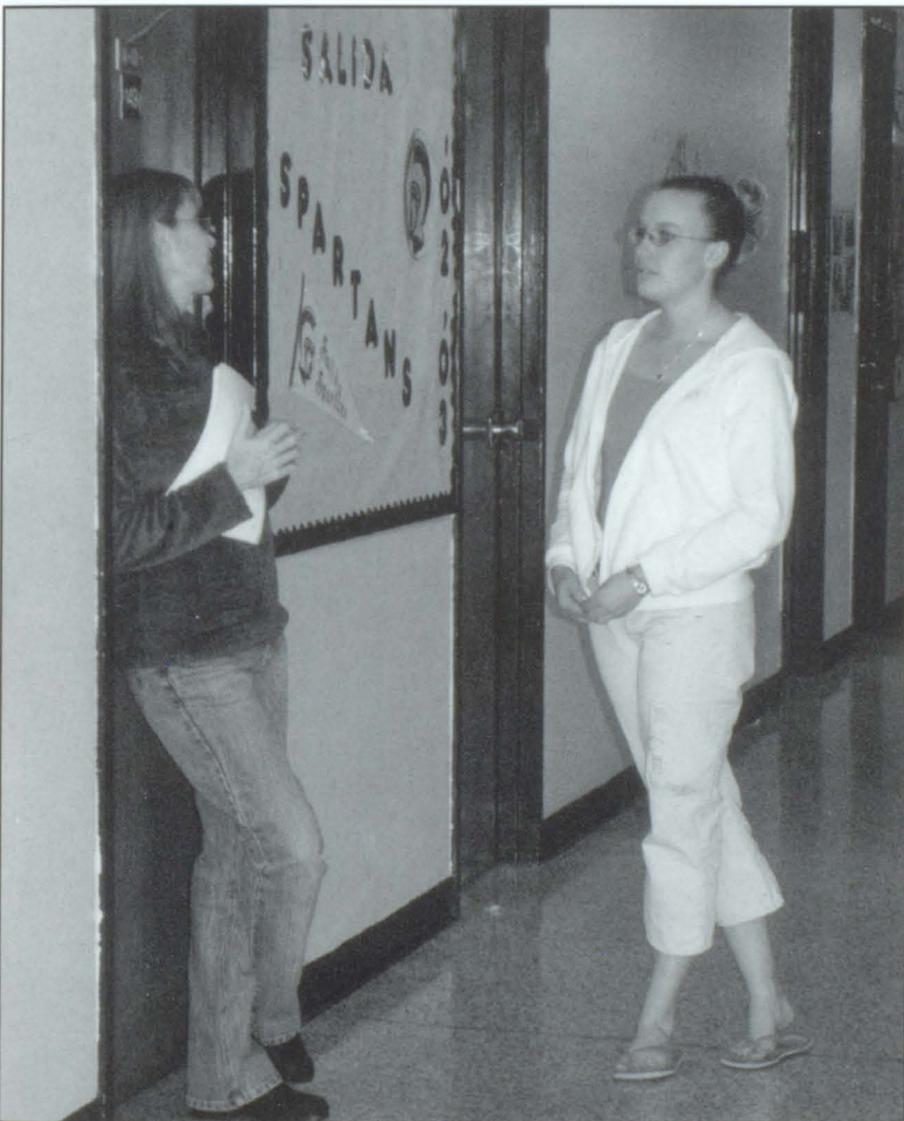
