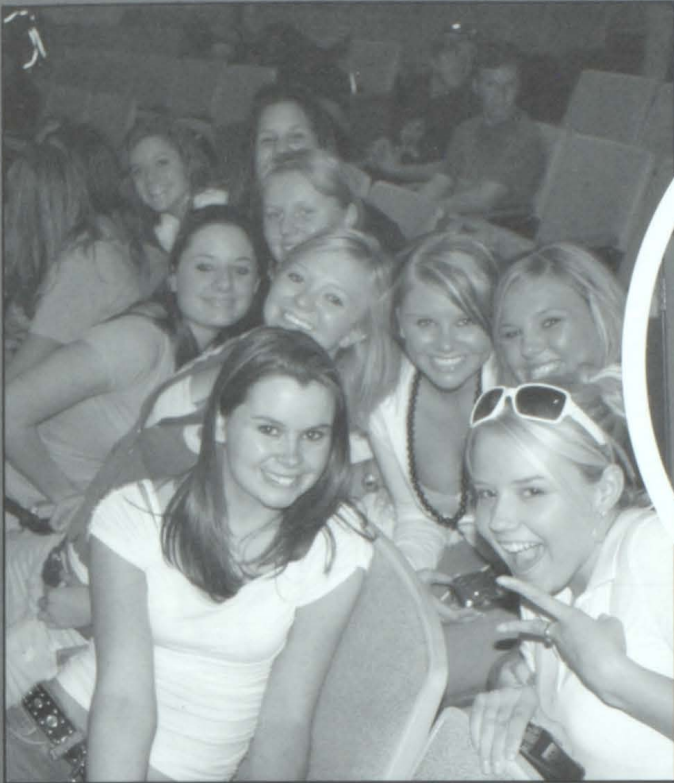

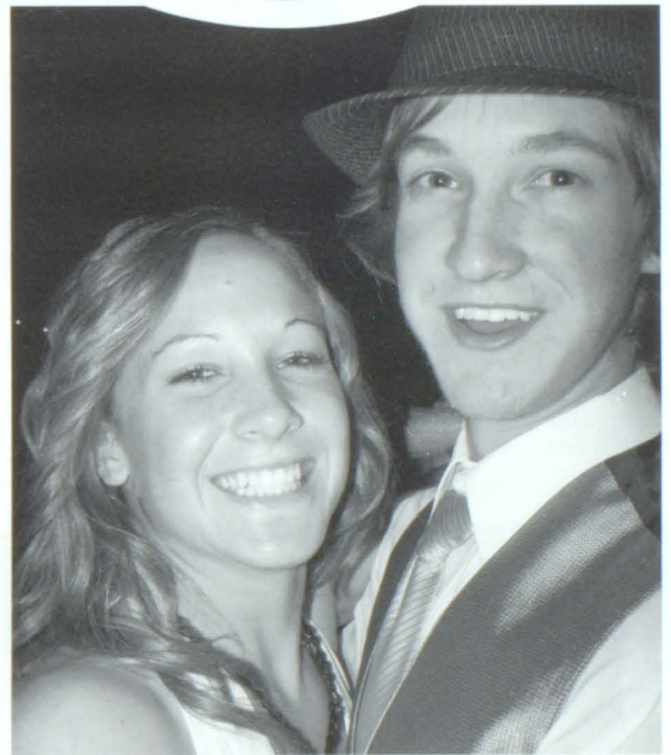


# Prom 2007

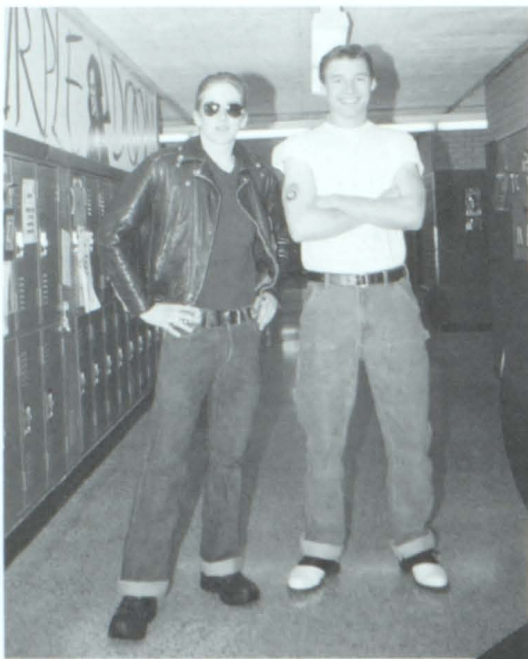

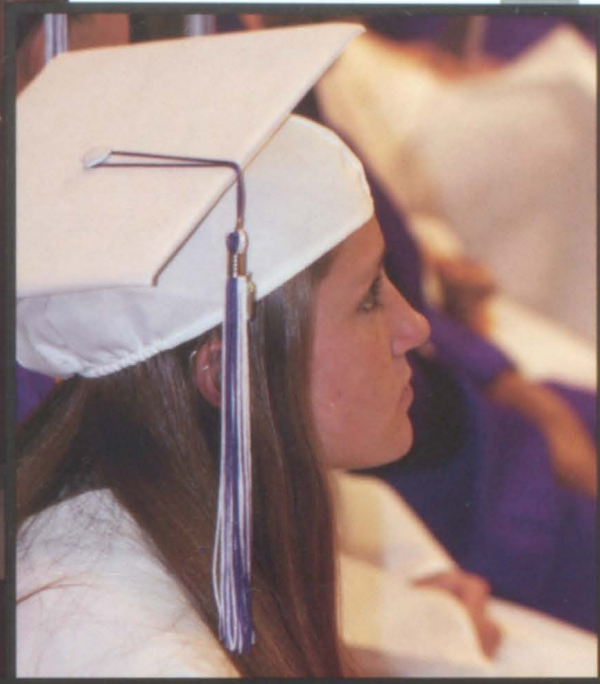
## *Graduation.*

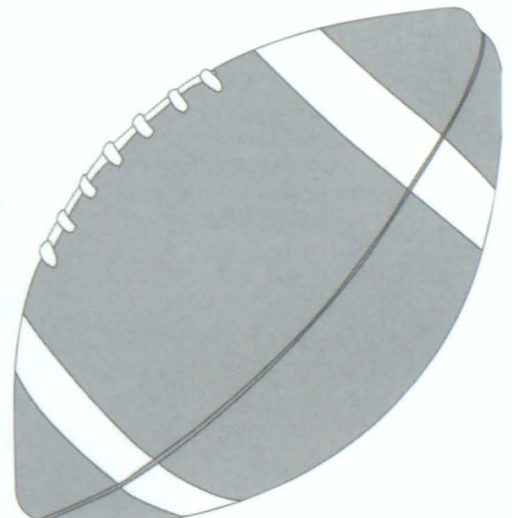

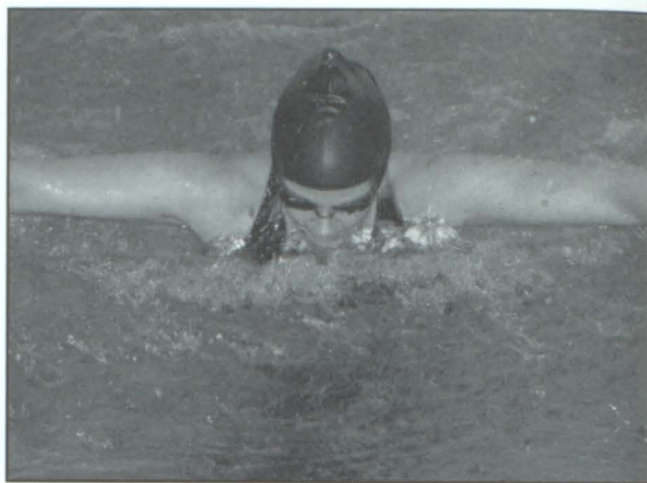

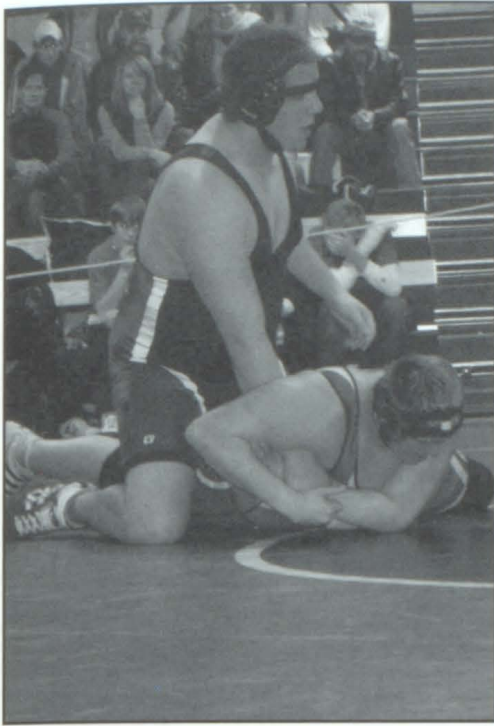

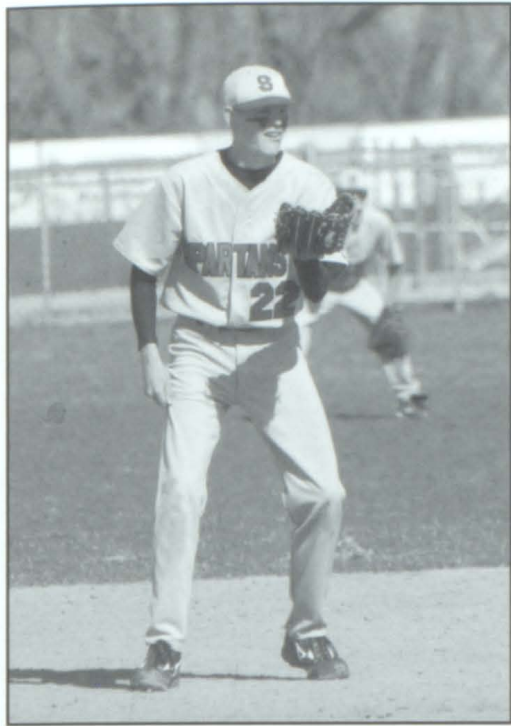

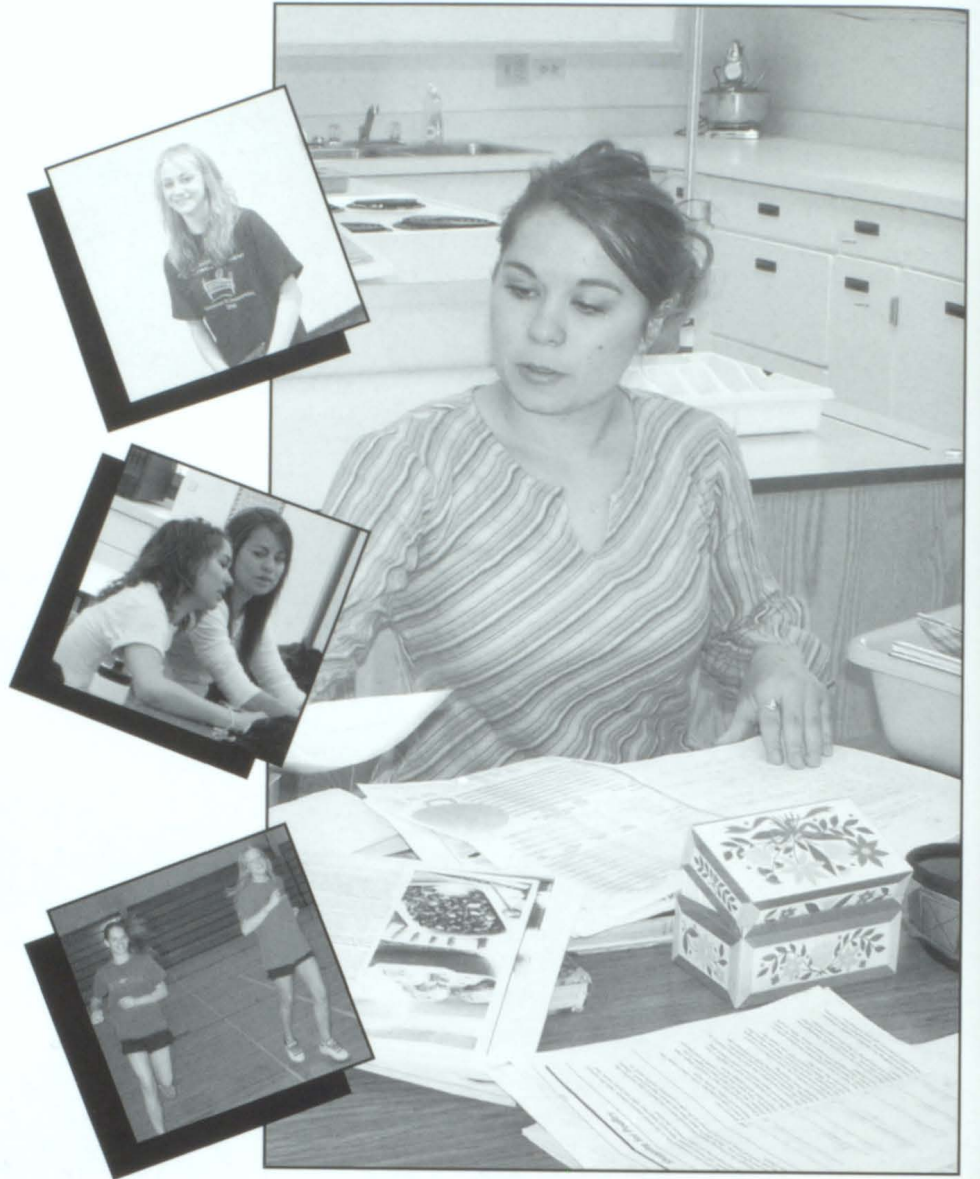
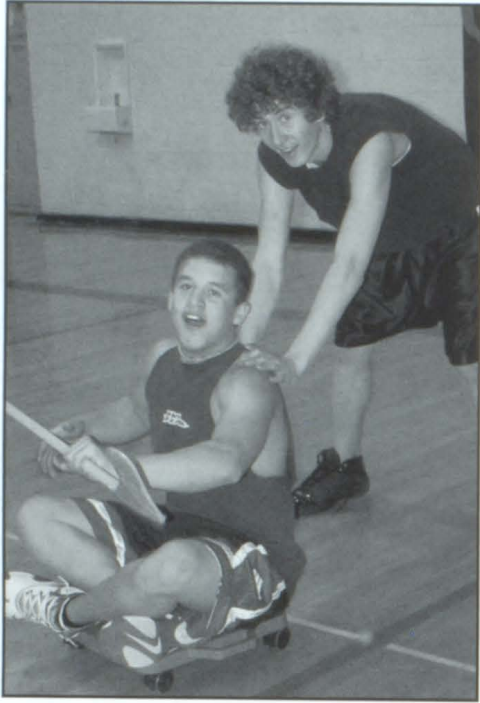
## Academics.

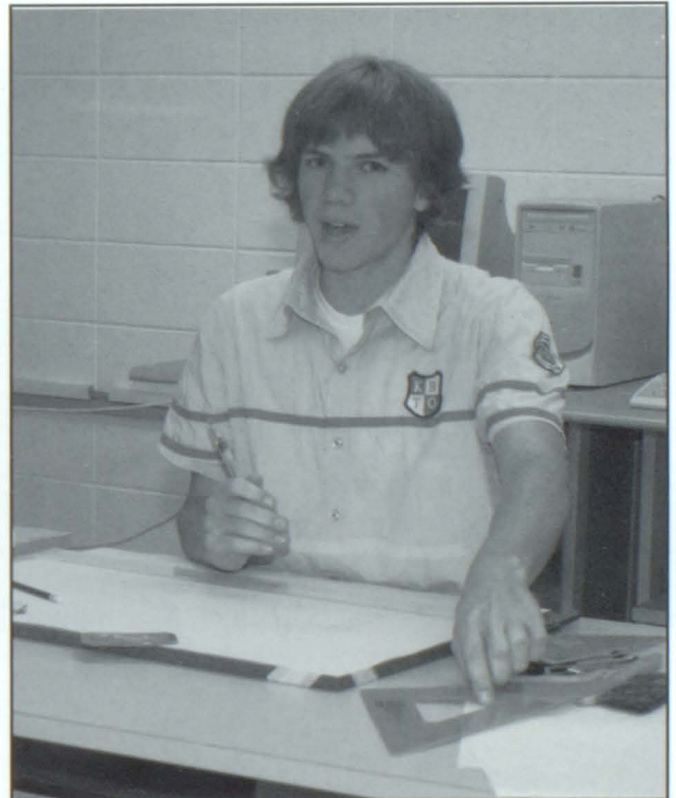




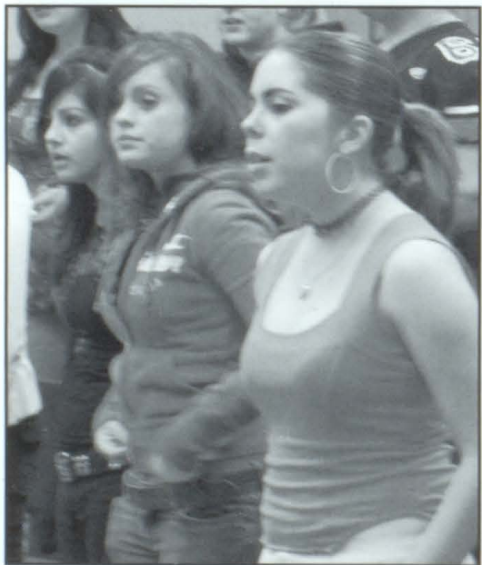
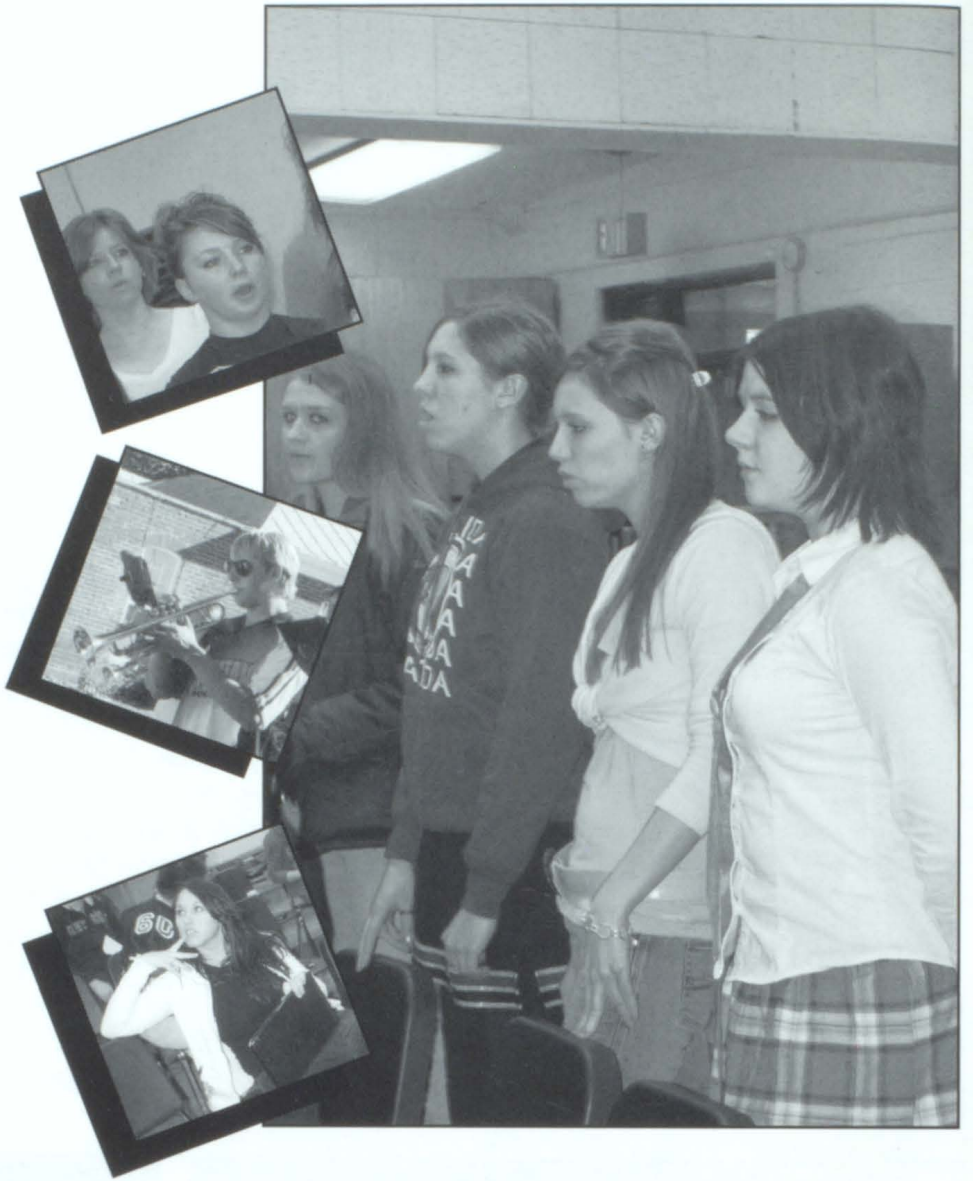
# Industrial Arts

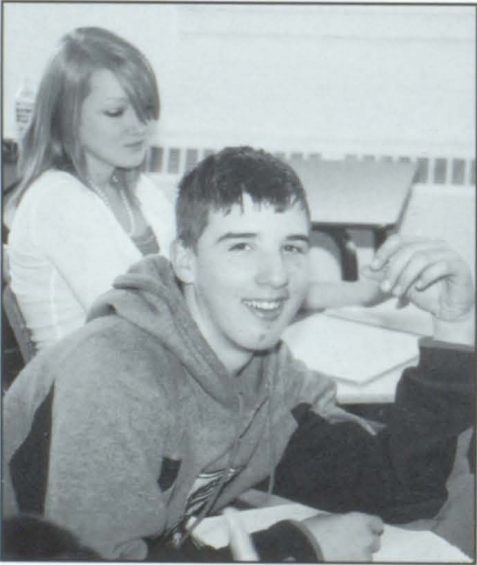
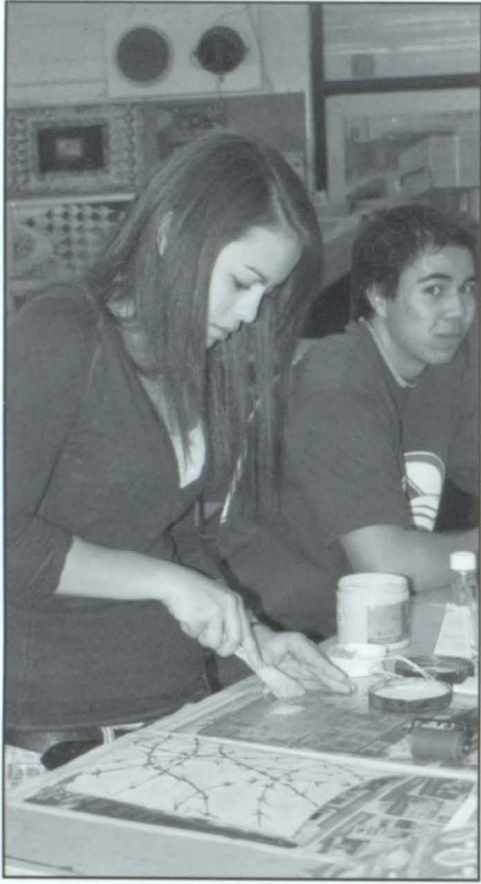
# Band & Choir

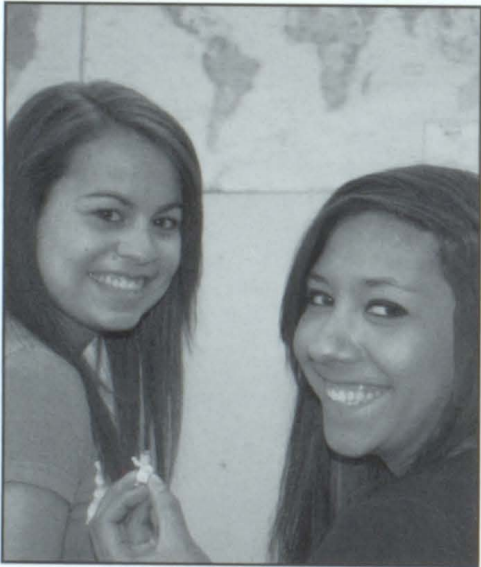
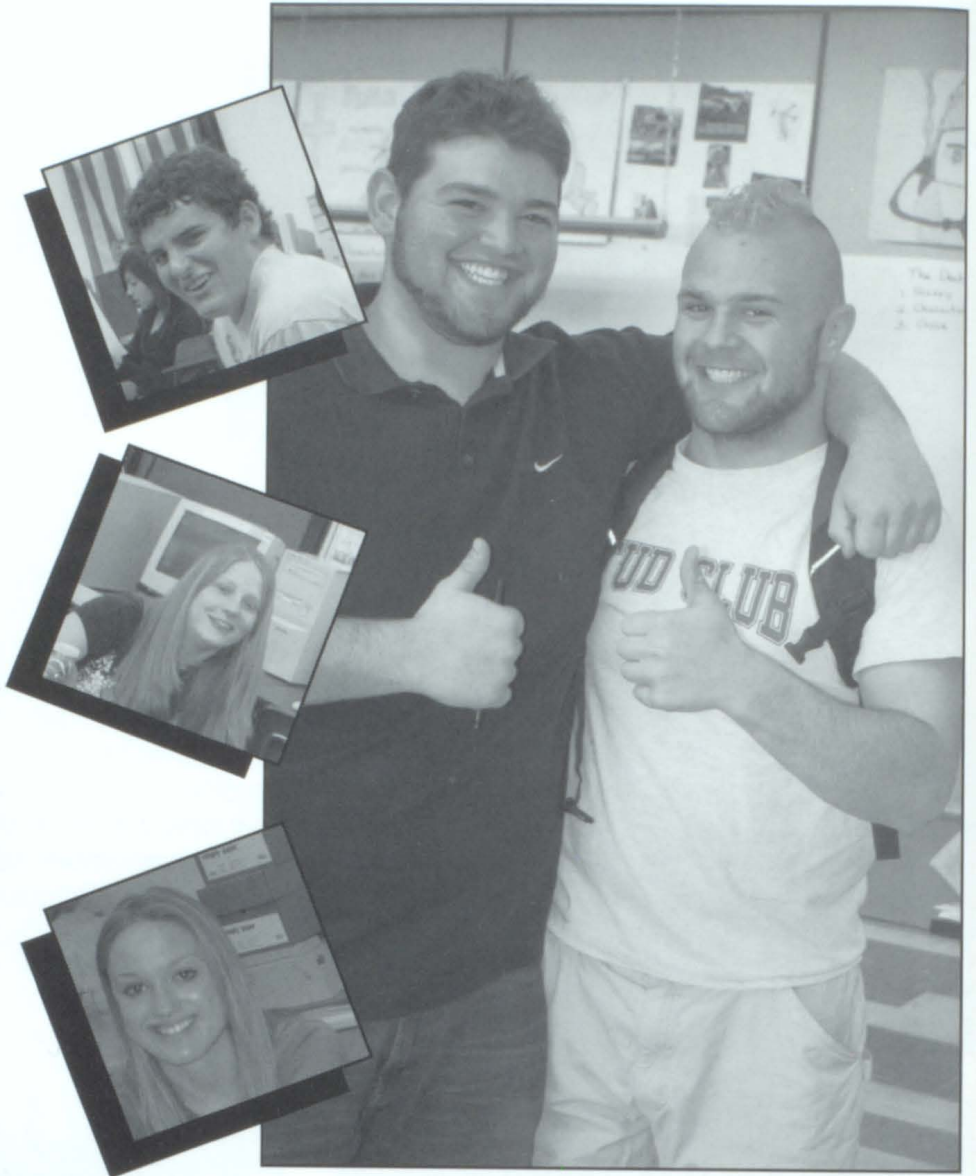
# Foreign Language & Art

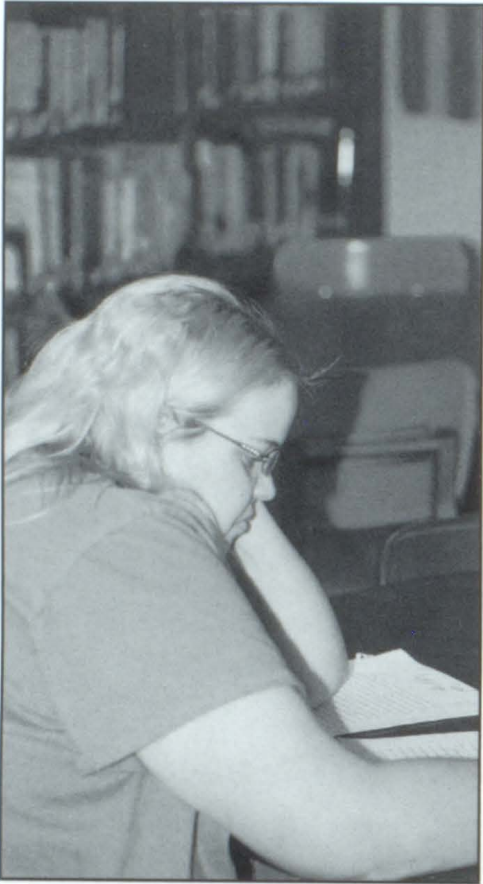
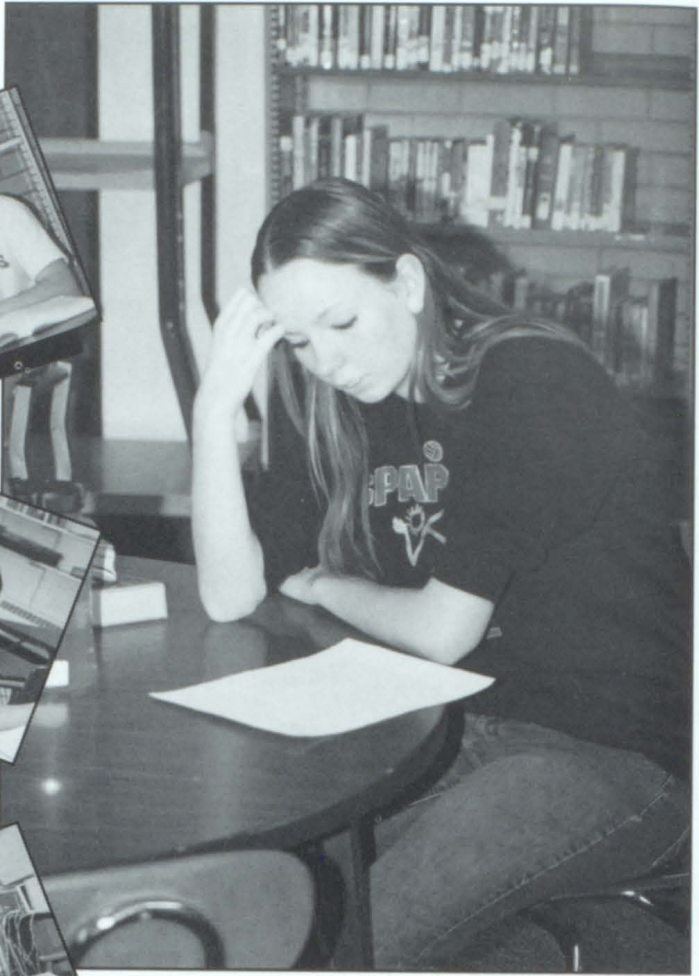
# Math & Science

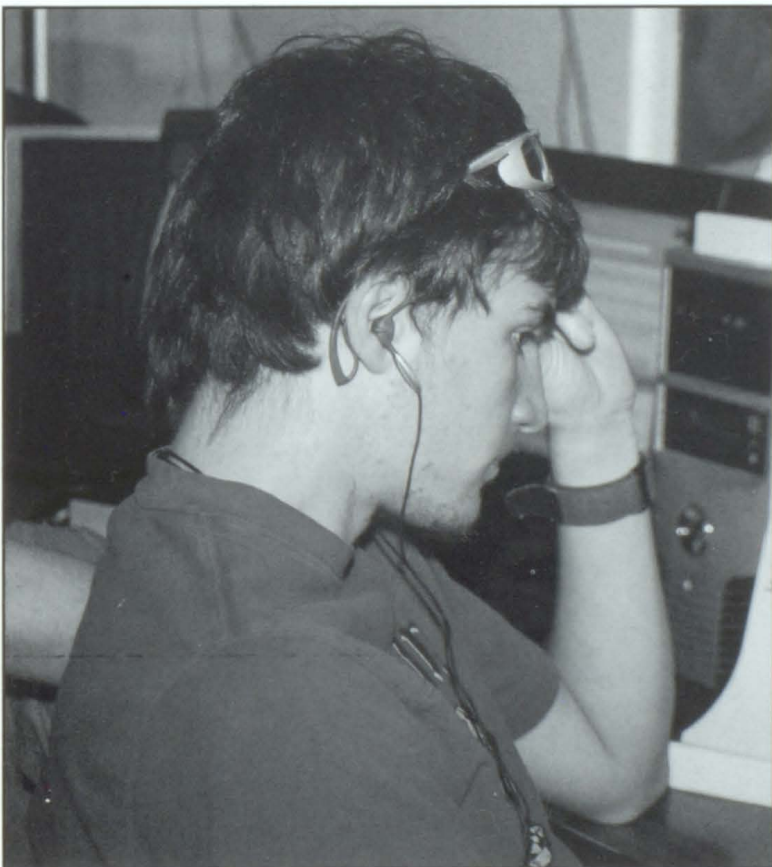
# Medical & Business

ent — The coccyx is formed by three vertebrae, one for each pair of ribs. The first three pairs of ribs are connected to the sternum by two centres of ossification, one by side and one by front. The nucleus makes its appearance in the following order in the segments: first at the birth in the first piece, secondly by the second, in the third from ten to fifteen years, in the fourth and fifth at fifteen years. As age advances these various segments become united, each other from below upward, the union being first between the first and second segments being completed until after the age of twenty, and the fourth at a late period of life, especially in females, the coccyx often becoming joined to the end of the sacrum.

**Articulation.** — With the sacrum.  
**Attachment of Muscles.** — To the tenth and one or two vertebrae: on each side, the Coccyx is connected to the Gluteus maximus and minor coccygeus, when present, at the Levator ani, and the Levator ani.

**The Spine in Gene.**

The Spinal Column, formed by the union of the vertebrae, is situated in the median line, at the posterior part of the trunk. Its average length is from five to six or three inches, measured along the curved anterior surface of the body. Of this length the cervical part is about five, the thoracic about eleven, the lumbar about seven, and the coccygeal about six. The remainder is the sacrum, which is about seven inches in length.

The joints of the spine are slow and being formed by the vertebrae, they are not so strong as the joints of the lower limbs. When examined more closely, the upper
