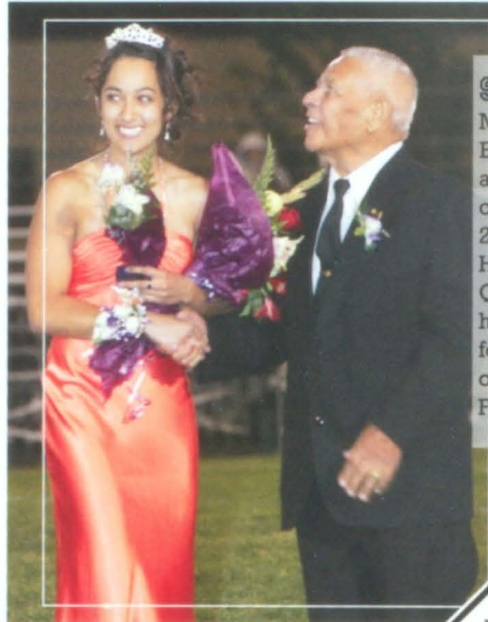

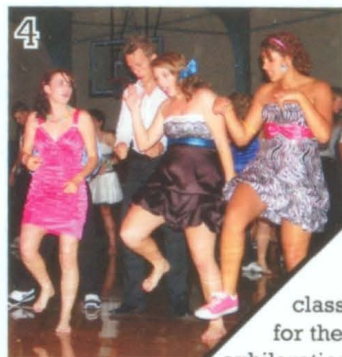

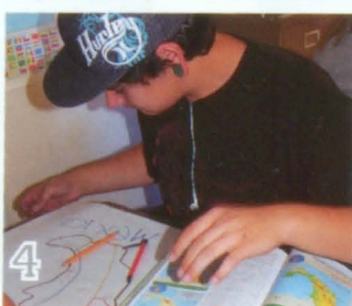

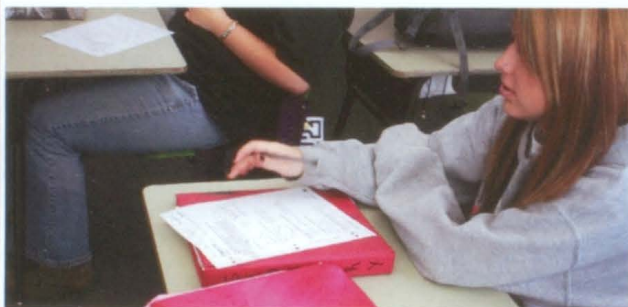

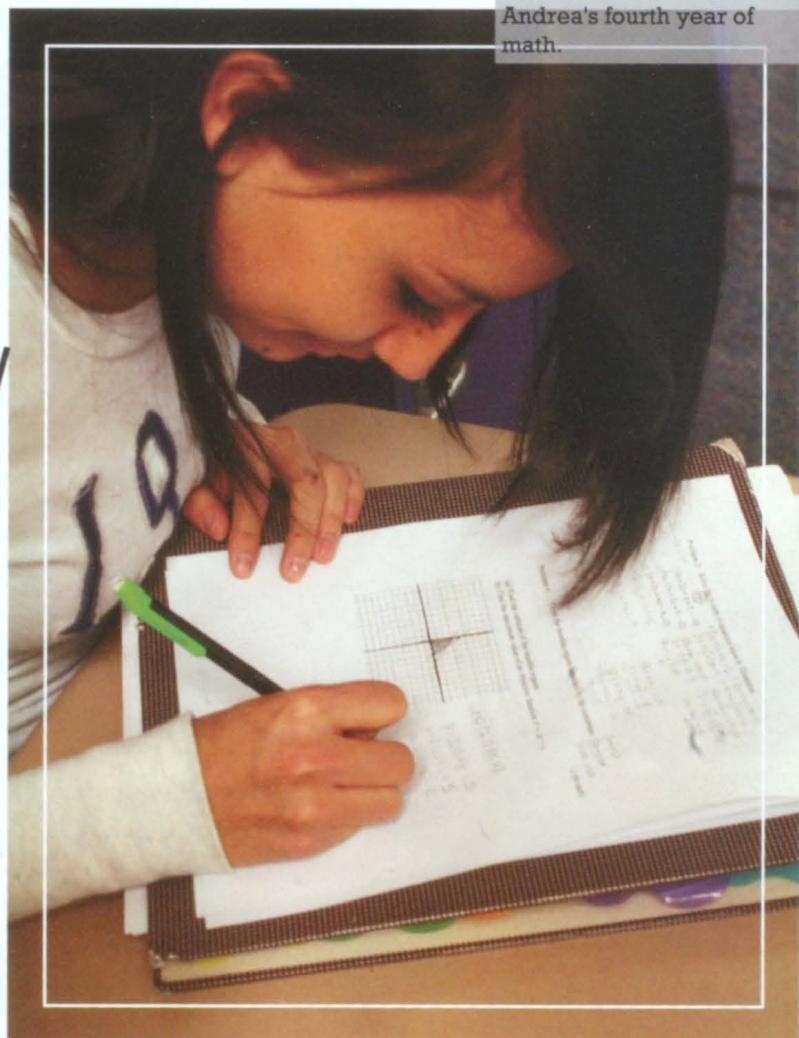
## More Than JUST ADDING NUMBERS

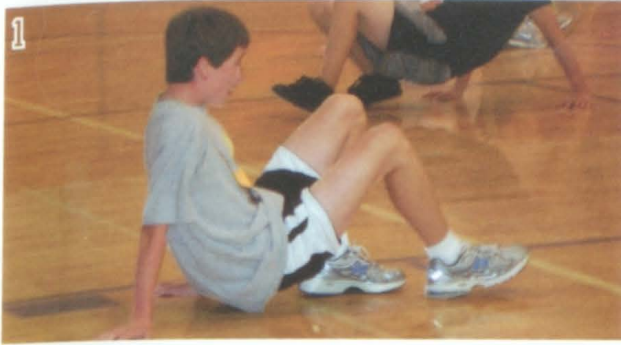

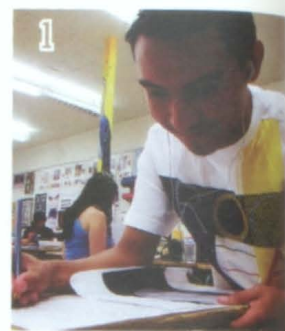

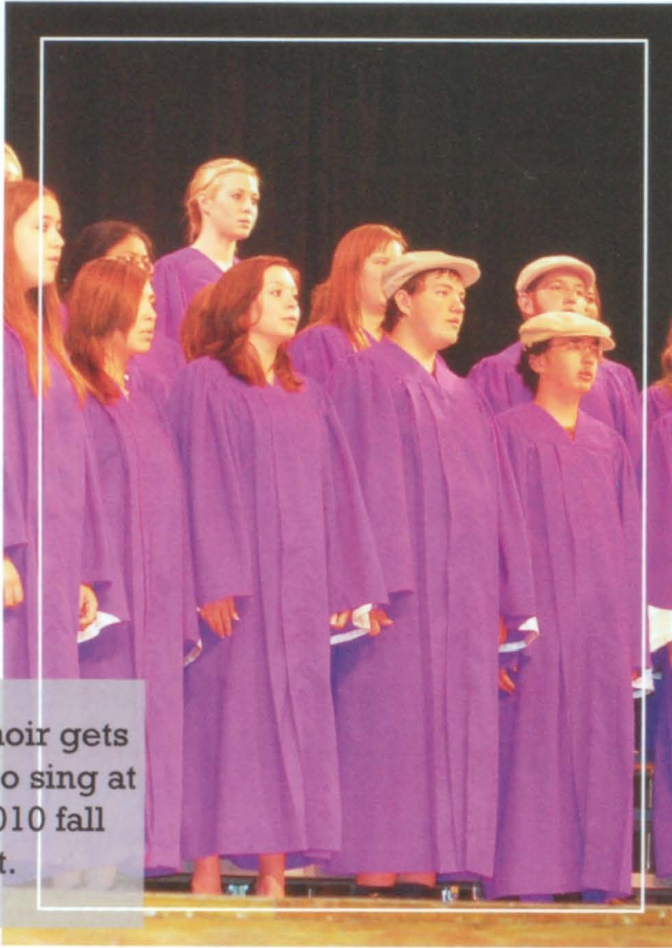

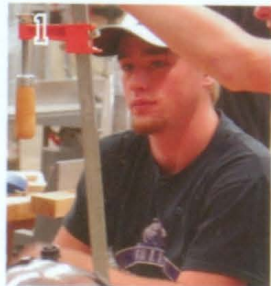

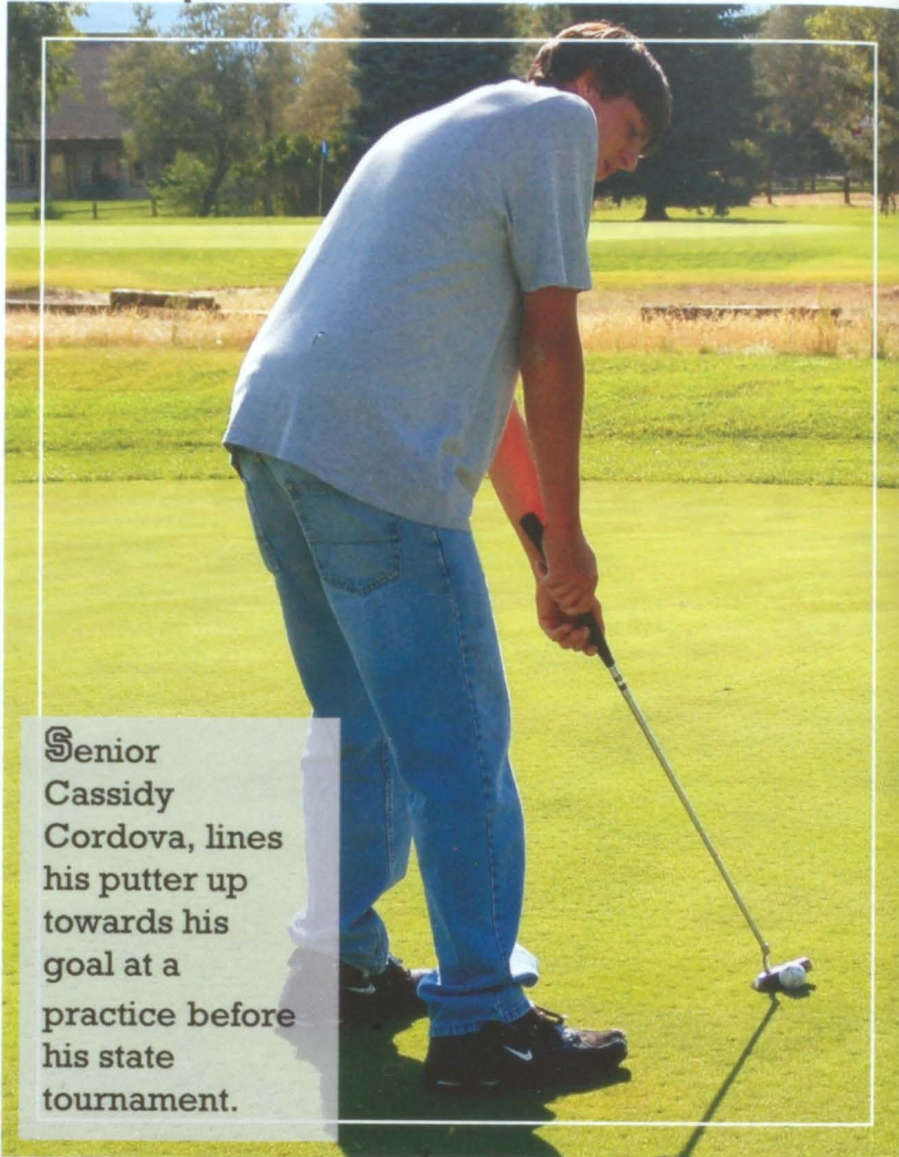

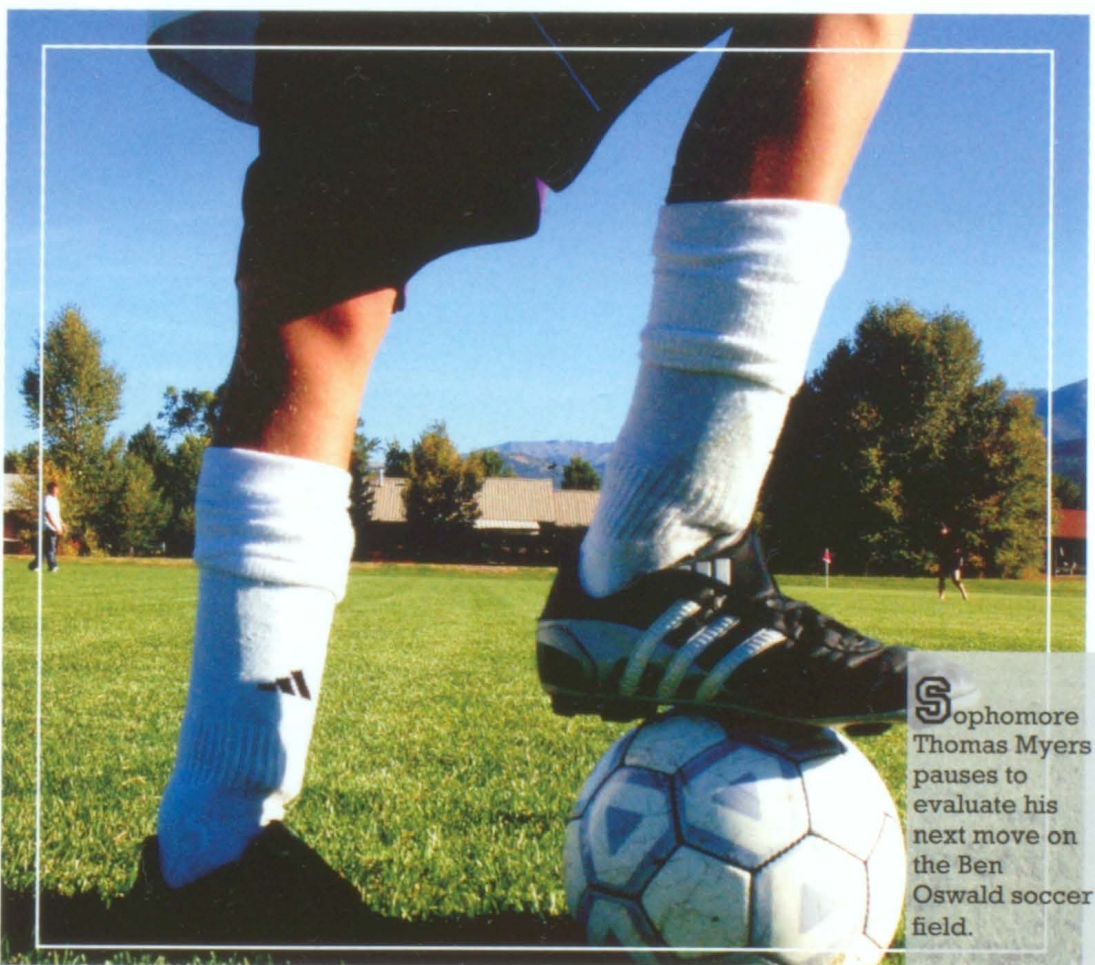

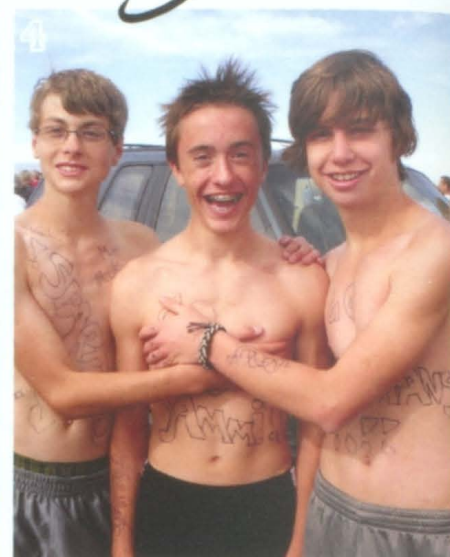
