That morning around 11:00 a.m., coaches Dwayne Johnson and Dawna Johnson and their 18-year old daughter Kiowa Johnson's lives were taken in a tragic rockslide near the top of Agnes Vaille Falls hiking trail. 13 -year old Gracie Johnson, the lone survivor of the slide, was immediately flown to Children's Hospital where she received treatment for multiple injuries both internal and external. As important members of the community, the Johnson's touched many people's lives, and many community members stepped up to support the remaining family members. Orange and gray, Kiowa and Gracie Johnson's favorite colors, were popular among high school students for the remainder of the week.
