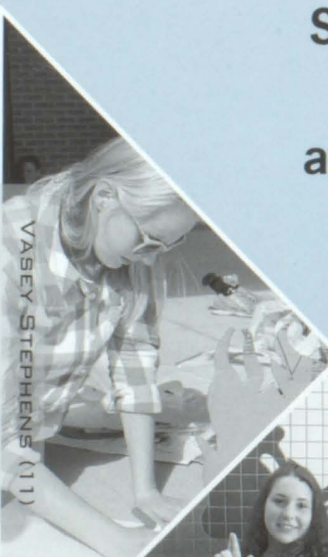


STUDENT LIFE

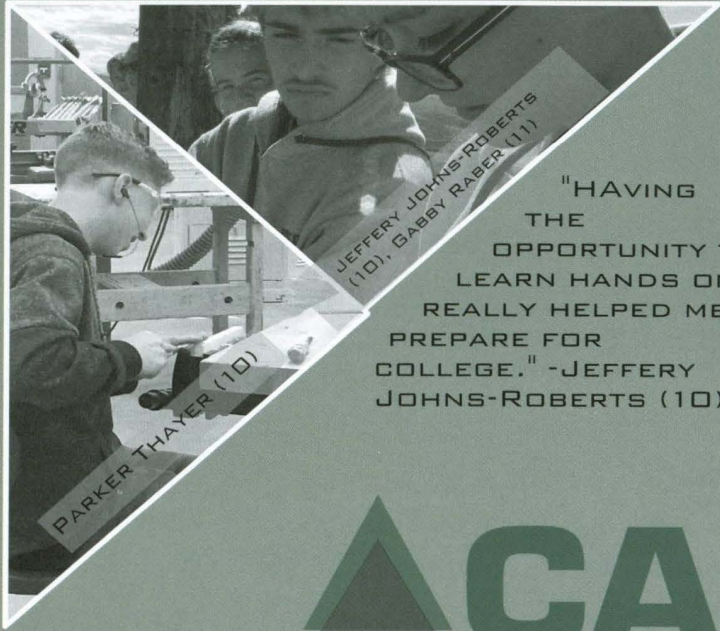
"I got sick in the middle of last year. I went to a bunch of doctors and they were saying anorexia, pneumonia... then I went to a different doctor and he sent me to Children's Hospital in Aurora. It was two weeks before school ended and so I completely missed the end of my freshman year. I was put in the ICU for three days because of the mass being so large above my heart. Then I got moved to the leukemia ward for one night while they were doing more testing to see what kind of cancer I had. After a few surgeries, one to put a pick line in my arm and another for a biopsy and a bone marrow test, I was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Lymphoma Cancer. They said the only cure would be to do chemo and radiation. So, I started chemotherapy till the end of October. Now I'm doing radiation till the end of March to hopefully be in remission.

But there have been a lot of fun things I have been able to do: going to concerts, meeting two of my favorite bands: Capital Kings and Urban Rescue. So, ya, cancer sucks, but it has taught me a lot about life: to enjoy all of it and make the best of it. Cancer has also brought up great opportunities for me. For example, "Make a Wish" has made it possible for me to be able to go to Haiti on a mission trip this summer. There are many downfalls, but there are many great things that have happened throughout my battle that I am extremely grateful for.

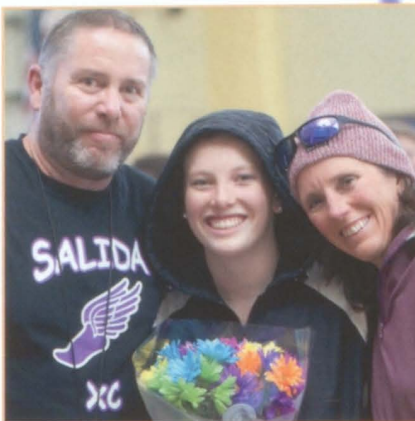

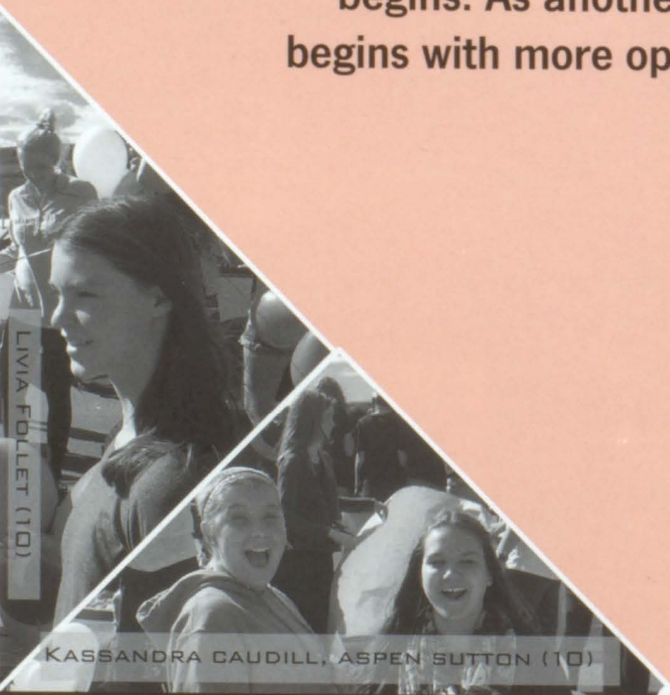


CLASSES

Every year of high school is different. Freshman are excited to begin a new chapter of their lives but also search for where in the school they belong, trying to find a place to fit in.

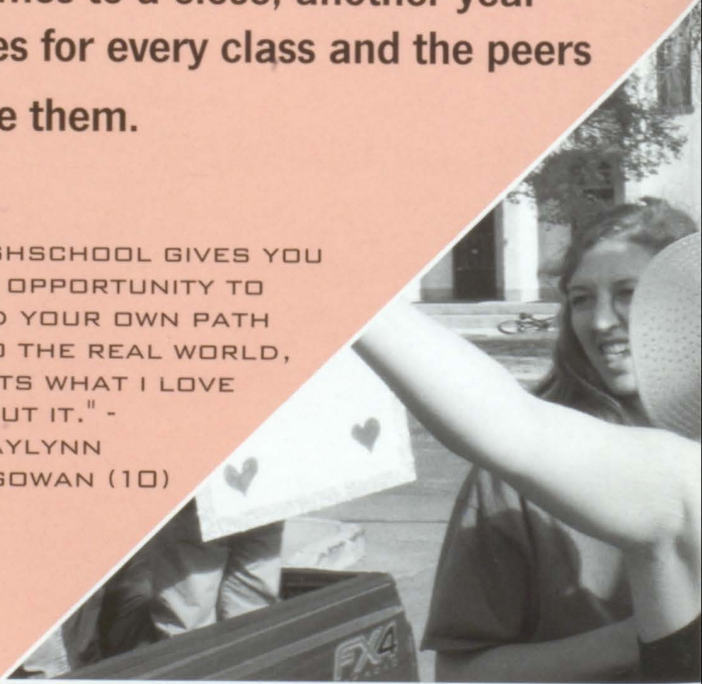
