A letter was read from the State Fed. asking for a .5¢ per capita contribution to State Travelling Library Fund. Owing to the poor state of the Club's finances it was decided to not respond to the request.

The Pres. report was read showing a balance of \$30.63.

Mrs. Spray gave notice of an amendment to the Constitution making first meeting after summer vacation a rally and ticket for entire Club.

Mrs. Cook gave notice of an amendment making the Club work begin in October. On motion adjourned.

membership was read from Mrs. Bertha Hance and after voting upon same the ballot was found clear.

Mrs. Spray gave notice of an amendment to Sec. 2, Art. 1 of By-laws to substitute for the words "for action thereon" — "and acted upon at the next regular meeting."

In the matter of Mrs. Gilmore and Mrs. Jackson it was decided if dues were not paid within one week of another notification their names should be dropped.

Mrs. Sisson made a statement of financial standing of the abandoned lecture course and of amounts refunded to ticket holders.

The question of giving a supper for the benefit of the Library was brought up and after discussion the matter was referred to the departments; their wishes regarding same to be reported at next Board meeting when action would be taken.
