The proceeds of the Kermiss are to be used to liquidate the debt on the library. Rev. Thos, J. Wolohan has been selected as chairman of the ticket selling committee and Mr. Scott Carroll as vice-chairman.

As the demand for seats will be very great it has been decided by the committee in charge to sell tickets in advance. The tickets may be exchanged for reserved seats on Friday, July 9, 1909.
