MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SALIDA FOR 1890:

January 20, 1890

Petition from citizens for an arc light on the corner of 6th and F granted. Carried.

February 3, 1890

Moved and seconded that the police force be increased one man and that the pay for same be \$75. Carried
Theo. Craig declared elected policeman.

February 17, 1890

Moved and seconded that the clerk be instructed to advertise for bids for laying water mains as follows: from 5th St. down D to 2nd, from D St. on 2nd to C, from Dodge St. one block down Teller, from Teller St. one block down C, from F ST. on 9th to E to 7th, from 13th St. on G to 2nd, on Front St. from D to E. Carried.

March 3, 1890

Moved and seconded that the sum of \$1,000 be appropriated for the building of sewers for the fiscal year commencing April 8, 1890.

March 10, 1890

An ordinance read concerning the stocking of hay, straw or other combustible material in the town. Passed and adopted.

Moved and seconded that O. P. Titcomb and others be granted permission to lay a private sewer on Front St. from Block 2 to the river. Carried.

The ordinance concerning the annual appropriation was read and passed. Carried.

March 26, 1890

Petition read from citizens asking an extension of water mains from C and Second Street down 2nd St. to Caldwell Ave. then through Caldwell Ave. to Park Ave. then down Park Ave. to Walnut St. and up Park Ave. to Palmer with sufficient signers for water to pay the required 10%.

Petition of citizens to have water main extended 3 1/2 blocks south on Hunt Street, from Teller down Maxwell to alley distance 1/2 block with sufficient guarantee to pay the required 10%.

Moved and seconded that the petitions as read be granted and Bateman and Sons instructed to lay the main. Carried.

April 7, 1890

Petition of Bowne and Grier to build on 1st Street between E. and F. Granted.

Mayor, J. Gillett; Clerk, J. J. Conover; Treasurer, B. Disman; Trustees, J. W. Deen, Geo. Lines, J. A. Rogers, J. W. Cummins.

April 14, 1890

T. S. McKelvey elected marshal. Louis Spencer appointed assistant marshal by marshal; Geo. Crosby elected Street Commissioner; J. M. McComas elected Police Magistrate; Theo. Martin, Town Attorney.

Moved and seconded that the town printing be awarded to the News and Mail to be equally divided between them at the same prices as last year. Carried.

April 25, 1890

The committee on Streets, Alleys and Bridges recommended that a contract be let for 50 loads of wash gravel and 50 loads of loam to be placed on G Street under the supervision of the Street Commissioner. Committee instructed to let contract. Carried.

Moved and seconded that Walter Bateman be appointed Water Commissioner at a salary of \$20 per month, duties to consist of keeping the city waterworks in order and to collect the water license. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the salary of marshal be \$90, the salary of Policeman \$75, Street Commissioner \$75, Fire Warden \$15 per month each.

Moved and seconded that Theo. Craig be appointed Fire Warden. Carried.

May 5, 1890

Moved and seconded that a permit be given to Gross and Wright and Geo. Sullivan to lay a sewer in the alley from First to Front Street between E and F Streets and across Front Street. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the salary of Town Attorney be fixed for this year at \$500. Carried.

May 19, 1890

Moved and seconded that Street and Alley committee be instructed to have a pound built for stray stock the cost not to exceed \$50. Carried.

June 5, 1890

An ordinance concerning the granting of licenses for the selling of Spirituous, Vinous and Malt liquors and penalty for selling same without license. Passed and carried.

June 17, 1890

Moved and seconded that two arc lights be placed on G Street as follows, one at 5th and G and one at 7th and G. Carried.

July 7, 1890

Ordinance read concerning sewers. Passed.

August 4, 1890

Ordinance read granting street railway franchise. Passed and carried.

Moved and seconded that the petition of citizens to build sewer from Blocks No. 5 to 21 on to the alley in block 32 to the Arkansas river, the city to pay for the sewer through city property. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the resignation of the fire warden be asked for. Carried.

August 18, 1890

Moved and seconded that the Town pay \$5.00 per month as dues for membership in the Chiefs of Police and City Marshal Association and receive benefits thereof. Carried.

August 25, 1890

Ordinance concerning licenses for fakers, street peddlers an etc. read for third time and passed. Carried.

Ordinance amending water license read and passed. Carried.
S. F. Smith elected Water Superintendent.

October 6, 1890

Moved and seconded that the resignation of Theo. Craig as assistant marshal be accepted.

Moved and seconded that the office of fire warden be declared vacant. Carried.

Moved and seconded the resignation of A. E. Hanks be accepted. Carried.

November 17, 1890

Ordinance concerning hydrants on Streets read the second time. Passed and carried.

D. A. Creamer elected councilman.

Moved and seconded that Mr. Deen be instructed to buy a wagon for city.

H. D. Spencer elected Fire warden.
