MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF SALIDA IN 1891:

January 5, 1891

Ordinance read concerning franchise of Telephone System to S. J. Foster. Passed.

January 9, 1891

Meeting called to take action on the death of councilman Titcomb. Moved and seconded that the city officers elected and appointive attend the funeral in a body.

February 2, 1891

R. B. Hallock elected councilman.

Resolution offered by Geo. Lines. Be it resolved by the board of this town of Salida, Colo. That our representatives in the legislature of the State of Colorado be asked and they are hereby requested to have enacted during the present legislature a law enabling Cities and Towns of more than three thousand inhabitants upon the written request of 2/3 of the resident property owners on any street within said Town or City to grade or pave such streets, to lay water pipes along the same and have the cost of constructing or laying, grading and paving such streets assessed to the abutting property owners along such streets as such improvements may be paid for by the Town or city. Moved and seconded that the resolution be adopted and a copy sent to each of our representatives. Carried.

February 13, 1891

Moved and seconded that a board of health be appointed. Messrs. Creamer and Rogers appointed.

Moved and seconded that the members of the board of health be empowered to employ a physician who shall be a member of the board to arrange compensations, etc. Motion carried.

March 6, 1891

The chairman of the committee appointed to look over the plans of the new hall and jail recommended that the plans and specifications be approved by the Town Board. Moved and seconded that the new plans and specifications for hall and jail submitted by Messrs. Chenowith and Snyder be approved and accepted by Board. Carried.

March 16, 1891

An Ordinance read concerning the Appropriation for the fiscal year commencing April 1, 1891 and ending April 1, 1892. Passed and adopted.

April 15, 1891

Resignation of T. S. McKelvey as city marshal read.

Mayor, John G. Hollenbeck; Clerk, H. J. Burghardt; Treasurer, C. W. Erdlen; Councilmen, Louis Wenz, Geo. Crater

On motion it was ordered the bond of the Treasurer be \$10,000, Clerk and Recorder, \$3,000, Street Commissioner, \$1,000; and City Marshal, \$1,000. Approved.

April 20, 1891

On motion it was ordered that the salary of Marshal for ensuing year be \$90 per month. R. L. Shewalter elected marshal for 1 month. On motion the salary of policeman was fixed at \$70 per month and Fire Warden at \$15 per month. One person to fill both offices.

J. D. Stewart elected policeman and fire warden, for month. On motion it was ordered that the salary of the city attorney be \$500 per annum.

Vincent Stine elected City Attorney for 1 month.

On motion it was ordered that the salary of the street commissioner be \$80 per month. G. P. Gessert elected Street Commissioner for one month.

On motion the Mayor and Clerk were instructed to get the town printing done wherever they choose.

May 4, 1891

The mayor made some remarks regarding a fitting reception of President Harrison by our Town and appointed the following citizens as a committee to make full arrangements for such reception: J. C. Stead, J. A. Israel, E. B. Jones, W. W. Roller, and S. M. Jackson. Mayor appoints councilmen Arenberg and Rogers on Board of Health, they to appoint a physician.

McComas appointed Police Magistrate until next meeting.

May 20, 1891

Petition of J. L. Marvin asking use of city water and City to pay \$25 per month toward sprinkling was granted, so long as sprinkling is required.

Marshal, R. L. Shewalter; Policeman and Fire warden, J. D. Stewart; Street Commissioner, G. P. Gessert; City Attorney, Vincent Stine; Police Magistrate, J. M. McComas.

June 1, 1891

On motion it was ordered that the ordinance prohibiting the running of bicycles and tricycles on sidewalks be read. Passed and adopted.

Bond of Police Magistrate fixed at \$2,000.

July 10, 1891

On motion licensed plumber's fee was fixed at \$3.35. Geo.

Sullivan elected by acclamation as city plumber, and instructed to use nothing but iron boxes.

July 21, 1891

An ordinance amending an ordinance relating to sidewalks was on motion read the second time. Passed and adopted.

September 22, 1891

Proposition received from E. B. Preston and co. of Chicago, to furnish hose cart and 400 feet safety hose for \$380 was by vote accepted. On motion ordered that the tax for 1891 be as follows: Interest Fund, 7 mills; Sinking Fund, 2 mills; General Fund, 3 mills.

October 5, 1891

Petition of First National Bank et. al. for permit to construct a sewer through Block 22 as follows: Commencing in the center of the alley fronting on First Street, in the rear of the McGovern Building and extending through said alley to the main alley in said block, thence from the south side of the main alley along the private alley commencing in the rear of the Hodgman building and extending the sewer to Second Street, also to have the trench dug and pipe for said sewer laid across First Street, and over the main alley in Block No. 22. On motion ordered referred to street and alley committee with power to act.

On motion ordered that the third Police officer be dispensed with.

October 19, 1891

City Attorney reported an ordinance creating a sewer district and governing the construction of sewer in same. Passed and adopted.

November 16, 1891

On motion the recommendation of Hose Company in regard to the purchase of rubber coats was adopted, and the clerk was instructed to purchase 18 coats of A. Unger.

Mayor announced the death of City Attorney Stine. On motion it was ordered that a committee be appointed to draft resolutions of respect and condolence.

December 7, 1891

Ordinance relating to sidewalks introduced and read. Passed and adopted.

On motion it was ordered that the sum of 48.25 in Town warrants be allowed monthly for an arc light at foot of Mesa on Eddy's addition in accordance with proposition from J. A. Eddy.
