MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF SALIDA IN 1892:

January 4, 1892

Mayor Hollenbeck reported having made contract with Hotel Committee of the Financial Conclave Knights Templar of Denver for advertising space in book entitled "Souvenir of Colorado Towns and Resorts" that is to be issued by the said committee for the sum of \$100. On motion the contract was ratified.

February 29, 1892

Ordinance dividing town into three precincts introduced, read and adopted.

March 8, 1892

Ordinance creating office of Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner introduced and read. Passed and adopted.

April 4, 1892

Ordinance concerning annual appropriation introduced, read and passed.

April 12, 1892

I. W. Wright, Mayor; H. W. Hauser, Clerk and Water Commissioner; New Councilmen: W. G. Sisson, Thos. Ryan, James Droney; Old Councilmen: L. Wenz, F. W. Arenberg, Geo. Crater; C. W. Erdlen, Treasurer.

April 12, 1892

Mayor Protém, Louis Wenz; C. C, Stevens, Elected Marshal; Amos Slater, elected Night Police and Fire Warden for one month; E. A. Closson, elected Street Commissioner for one month; J. M. McComas, elected Police Magistrate for one month.

On motion the bond of Town Treasurer was fixed at the sum of \$10,000.

On motion the bond of Town Marshal was fixed at \$1,000, salary \$90.00 per month.

Salary of Night Police and Fire Warden, \$85.00 per month.

Salary of Street Commissioner, \$80.00 per month.

Bond of Street Commissioner fixed at \$1,000.

Bond of police Magistrate fixed at \$2,000.

On motion, the Harness Store of H. W. Hauser was designated as the place where the office of Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner shall be for the ensuing year.

April 26, 1892

On motion, Clerk was instructed to notify the Board of School District No. 7 that the town would lay water mains to the

junction of 8th and G Streets.

On motion Clerk was instructed to get his printing done by whomsoever would do it the cheapest in Salida.

Salida Sentinel declared Official Paper of Salida.

May 16, 1892

Moved and seconded that J. B. McCoy be elected as Town Attorney for three months at a salary of \$41.65 per month. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the term of office of the Night Policeman and Fire Warden, street Commissioner and Police Magistrate be extended for 30 days.

May 24, 1892

Moved and seconded that a Committee of three be appointed to see what the building on Second Street belonging to Alger and Disman could be rented or leased for, for a term of two years, with a proviso in the lease, that should the town before the expiration of two years build a town hall, the lease on this building would expire at such time, and allow that the committee be empowered to go ahead and make the contract, and find out if the owners of the building were willing to let the town make the necessary changes on their building at no cost to them. Amended. That the committee should not rent or lease the said building until they first ascertain whether or not the Town is liable for the rent of the present Council room for more than one month at a time. Carried.

Moved and seconded that as soon as the fire Department would regularly organize and incorporate the sum of \$300 be given them. Carried.

June 20, 1892

Moved and seconded that John G. Hollenbeck be elected Police Magistrate for a term of one month.

E. A. Closson was elected for Street Commissioner for three months by a unanimous vote.

Amos Slater elected night marshal for one month by a unanimous vote.

On motion the mayor was authorized to appoint a special Policeman to impound stock caught running at large and to catch dogs, which said special policeman should make his pay out of the fines imposed and collected from such impounded stock and dogs, further that he is to be allowed 25 cents for each dog he would have to kill and 50 cents for each dog on which he had the means of collecting dog tax on.

June 24, 1892

Ordinance for extension and enlargement of water mains hereupon passed on its second reading. This ordinance was also to create a bonded indebtedness of \$20,000 at 6% per annum. Moved and seconded that the ordinance as above said be read and passed. Adopted.

July 5, 1892

Resignation of E. A. Closson as Street Commissioner read and accepted.

Resignation of Amos Slater as Night Policeman and Fire Warden read. Accepted.

William H. Pearce elected Street Commissioner for one month at \$80 per month.

James L. Pearce elected as Night Policeman for one month at \$70 per month.

An ordinance amending an ordinance entitled an ordinance regulating the issuance of license for the sale of Spirituous, Vinous and Malt Liquors and providing for the punishment of persons selling the same without a license passed and adopted.

On motion the Town Board extended a vote of thanks to Marshal C. C. Stevens for the faithful performance of his duties since his appointment to office and that his salary shall be from July 1, 1892 \$95 per month in town warrants, instead of \$90.

July 18, 1892

C. C. Stevens elected Town Marshal for three more months.

John G. Hollenbeck elected Police Magistrate for three months.

July 25, 1892

Moved and seconded that the bid of G. F. Bateman and Son, for the extension of the Waterworks be accepted with the provision that the Contract shall be null and void if the issue of \$20,000, 6% water bonds are not sold at par as said in their bid.

August 1, 1892

An ordinance providing for the contraction of an indebtedness upon the credit of the Town of Salida, Colorado by the issuance of the negotiable bonds of said town, for the purpose of supplying said town with water for irrigation and other municipal purposes, by the construction of a suitable system therefor was read, passed and approved.

Moved and seconded that the terms of office of the Street Commissioner and Night Policeman be extended for one month each.

September 6, 1892

Moved and seconded that Night Policeman James S. Pearce, Street Commissioner W. H. Pearce and Town Attorney J. B. McCoy be elected for a term of three months.

October 8, 1892

Moved and seconded that there be a levy of 14 mills made upon each and every dollars worth of taxable property in the corporate limits of Salida, Colorado, for the year 1892, as follows, to wit: For the Interest fund, 7 1/2 mills; for the Sinking Fund, 2 mills; for the McKenna Judgment, 4 1/2 mills (to pay).

October 17, 1892

Moved and seconded that Police Magistrate J. G. Hollenbeck and Town Marshal C. C. Stevens be elected to their respective offices for the balance of the term of this Board. Carried.

November 21, 1892

Resignation of A. Unger as Chief of Salida Fire Department was read and accepted.

On motion J. B. McCoy was elected town Attorney for one month from date.

Moved and seconded that the office of Street Commissioner be declared vacated.

December 5, 1892

Moved and seconded that James L. Pearce be elected for the term of one month from date for night Policeman.

December 19, 1892

Moved and seconded that at the expiration of the present term, for which the Town Attorney has been elected, which said term expires on December 22nd, 1892, said office of Town Attorney shall be declared vacated.

Moved and seconded that the Water and Fire Committee be empowered to purchase six service Fire hats and six pairs of rubber gloves for the use of the Salida Fire Department. Carried.
