MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SALIDA FOR 1893:

January 4, 1893

Resignation of James L. Pearce as Night Policeman was read and accepted.

A. J. Thomas elected. Salary \$78 per month.

January 16, 1893

The following property deeded to city for alleys by Henry Wise, Mary F. King and Mrs. M. C. Johnson. Beginning at a point along the northerly line of Second Street 90 feet in a westerly direction from the intersection of D and Second Street; thence 150 feet in a northerly direction parallel with D Street to alley; thence 10 feet in a westerly direction parallel with Second Street; thence 150 feet in a southerly direction parallel with D Street to Second Street; thence 10 feet in an easterly direction along the line of Second Street to the place of beginning being a portion of Lot 23 in Block 23 in the Town of Salida, County of Chaffee and State of Colorado. Deed accepted.

Moved and seconded that the mayor be authorized to have the braces tightened and necessary repairs made on the wagon bridge crossing the Arkansas river on F Street. Carried.

February 6, 1893

A. J. Thomas re-elected for one month as Night Policeman.

February 20, 1893

Moved and seconded that the people who had said sewer laid, through said alley in Blocks, viz 22 and 24, claimed ownership therein, the town give up all right and title thereto, as well as to the sewer which now runs through Blocks 32-21 and 5, and let these people maintain said sewers hereafter and the town have nothing whatsoever to do with them in any way.

March 21, 1893

Petition from J. B. Bowne and W. W. Roller for permission to erect 6, 2 story 6 room dwellings on Lots No. 14, 15 and 16 in Block No. 23 was read and granted.

March 23, 1893

Moved and seconded that the Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner's salary be \$1200 per year and the Treasurer's salary \$240 per year.

An ordinance concerning the annual Appropriation bill of the Town for fiscal year beginning 1893 passed and adopted. Carried.

April 3, 1893

An ordinance amending Sec. 2 of an ordinance Entitled an Ordinance Creating the office of Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner passed and approved March 8, 1892 was read, passed and adopted.

April 17, 1893

M. K. Miller, Mayor; H. W. Hauser, Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner; C. W. Erdlen, Treasurer; Geo. F. Crater, Alex Renwick and F. W. Brush, Trustees; Droney, Ryan and Sisson, old trustees.

Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner's Bond fixed at \$6,000 and Treasurer's Bond at \$10,000. Carried.

J. M. Lawrence elected Night Policeman, Salary \$78, elected for one month.

Moved and seconded that the Clerk be instructed to get what printing is necessary where he can get it the cheapest. Carried.

May 15, 1893

Moved and seconded that the Chaffee County Record be made the official paper of the Town. Carried.

Moved and seconded that any one wanting to purchase any town supplies hereafter must first get an order from the chairman of the Committee of the Department for which the goods may be wanting and present the same to the town Clerk, who will give him a requisition to purchase such goods. Carried.

Salary of Town Marshal, \$90 per month, Bond \$1,000; Salary of Night Policeman, \$78 per month, Bond \$750; Salary of Police Magistrate ?, Bond fixed at \$2,000; Salary of Street Commissioner, \$75, Bond \$1,000.

June 19, 1893

July 5, 1893

C. E. Eggleston, Secretary of the Edison Electric Light Co., of Salida, Colorado, made the following proposition to Board: That they would furnish 10 arc lights for streets at \$15 per light per month and 2 incandescent lights at the jail for \$2 per month for both, and furnish the incandescent lights in Council Room and the Hose House as heretofore for use of Town water. Contract accepted.

August 21, 1893

Moved and seconded that the Water and Fire Committee be instructed to get Fire hats and Rubber gloves for the Hose Company.

September 6, 1893

A proposed contract between Lucile Van Every and Town Board in which Van Every was to furnish a good and sufficient supply of ditch water to all that part of town lying northwest of the Gunnison Branch of the D&RG Railway and between 3rd Street and the main Arkansas River until April 1, 1894 for \$15 per month or fractional part thereof. Contract signed and accepted.

September 18, 1893

An Ordinance concerning the barber Shops and fixing the time for the closing thereof, was read and passed.

Moved and seconded that the plat of Huggins and Van Every's Addition be referred to a committee of three, to have inserted therein the Water Rights to be given to the Town, also to ascertain whether the part of Eddy's Addition which abuts the before said addition had been accepted by the town. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the Office of Street Commissioner be declared vacant after September 30, 1893.

Balloting for Marshal. No election.

September 25, 1893

Town Levy for Taxes, Year 1893: 9 1/2 mills for Interest Fund; 2 1/4 mills for Sinking Fund.

October 2, 1893

Matter of accepting Huggins and Van Every's Addition. Reported progress and that the proposition had been made for the Town to accept the map, without liability for water.

Treasurer Erdlen informed the Board that the outstanding warrants of the Town amounted to \$23,223.48.

October 16, 1893

Moved and seconded that the map of Huggins First Addition to Salida on the Mesa be accepted without any liability to the Town of Salida for ditch water.

October 21, 1893

Moved and seconded that we accept the offer as made by Mr. Sackett for deed for Park from Front Street to River and from F to D all included and reimburse him for taxes as paid by him on River Front Park, since proposition was made and recall all action pertaining to sidewalk made by previous Board as well as this, and that Park be named "Sackett's Park" and we tender a vote of Thanks to Mr. Geo. Sackett for his great kindness to the town. Carried.

November 20, 1893

Resignation from Town Treasurer, C. W. Erdlen, dated November 20, 1893, to take effect as soon as his successor has been appointed and qualified. Resignation received.

November 27, 1893

Charles Ankele elected night policeman.

E. W. Hively elected Town Treasurer

J. M. Lawrence, Night Policeman, services to be dispensed with after November 27, 1893.

December 4, 1893

Moved and seconded that the Town pay the rent for the Opera House for the use of the Miners Convention to be held here December 6, 1893.
