MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SALIDA IN 1894:

March 5, 1894

An ordinance concerning the annual Appropriation Bill for the fiscal year beginning April 1, 1894 and ending March 31, 1895. Passed and approved.

An ordinance concerning salary of Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner was read, passed and adopted.

March 19, 1894

Resignation of Police Magistrate Hollenbeck read.

April 6, 1894

M. K. Miller, Mayor; Charles F. Johnson, Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner; Alice Parks, Treasurer. Trustees: Daniel P. Cook, Fred L. Sheldon, Amos Slater, Alex Renwick, F. W. Brush, Geo. T. Crater.

Resignation of Alice Parks as Treasurer read.[Did not qualify.]

April 18, 1894

Moved and seconded that the salaries of various appointive officers shall be as follows: City Marshal, \$85 per month; Night Police, \$85 per month; Street Commissioner, \$75 per month; Town Attorney \$20 per month, R. Linderman elected.

May 7, 1894

C. C. Stevens elected Marshal; Charles Ankele elected Assistant Marshal; R. E. Wallace elected Police Magistrate; E. P. Gilpatrick elected Street Commissioner; E. W. Hively elected Town Treasurer.

Be it resolved by the Board of Trustees that the Marshal and Assistant Marshal shall hereafter serve in their respective positions one month day work and one month night work alternately. Approved and adopted.

June 4, 1894

Moved and seconded to amend the Dog License Ordinance to read \$1 on dogs and \$3 on Bitches instead of \$2 on dogs and \$5 on bitches. Passed and adopted.

Charles Ankele elected marshal

A. Sievert elected Assistant Marshal.

June 18, 1894

An ordinance pertaining to the storage of powder and other highly combustible material within the Town limits was read. Adopted.

An ordinance pertaining to the manufacture and sale of Oleomargarine within the Town limits was read and adopted. Chaffee County Record made official paper.

July 2, 1894

Ordinance amending an ordinance relative to running bicycles and tricycles on the sidewalks within the corporate limits of the Town of Salida was read and adopted.

July 16, 1894

Town attorney instructed to institute the necessary proceedings to have the records pertaining to the incorporation of this town properly completed.

August 6, 1894

Communication from W. C. Willits asking that this board subscribe on behalf of the town for 5 full mounted copies of a map of this town at \$5.00 per copy. Motion carried.

October 1, 1894

It was moved and seconded that pursuant to the action of this board, at its meeting on the 6th day of August last appropriating \$100 from the contingent fund for the purpose of extra electric lights and decorations during the session of the Grand Lodge of Odd Fellows to be held in Salida this month the Clerk and Recorder draw a warrant for \$100 payable to I. W. Haight, Treasurer of Salida Lodge No. 54, I.O.O.F.

For the purpose of paying the annual interest upon the bonded indebtedness of said town a tax of 9 1/4 mills on the dollar. For the purpose of creating a sinking fund to pay the bonded indebtedness of said town a tax of 2 1/2 mills on the dollar. Carried.

November 20, 1894

The resignation of E. P. Gilpatrick as Street Commissioner was read. Accepted.
