MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SALIDA FOR 1895:

March 21, 1895

An ordinance concerning the annual appropriation bill for the Town of Salida for the fiscal year beginning with April 1, 1895 was read. Passed.

An ordinance fixing the compensation of the Clerk and Recorder and water Commissioner of Salida was read. Passed.

The liquor ordinance was read for the third time by its title and placed on final passage. Carried.

A petition of R. T. Rives and others praying that the board of Trustees lease to the Salida Driving Park Association for a term of ten years the 53 acres of land belonging to the town and known as the "Reservoir land" was read. Petition granted at yearly rental of \$20.

A warranty deed was presented to the board from C. L. Turner conveying a strip of ground in Block 206, Eddy Bros. Addition 80 x 12 ft. for an alley way.

April 1, 1895

An ordinance regulating fees of Police Magistrate was read and placed on final passage.

April 4, 1895

Finla McClure, Mayor; C. F. Johnson, Clerk and Recorder and Water Commissioner; E. W. Hively, Treasurer, John Clemm, Trustee; R. T. Hodgman, Trustee; J. T. Erdlen, Trustee; A. Slater, Trustee; D. P. Cook, Trustee; F. L. Sheldon, Trustee.

April 15, 1895

Board of Health: McClure, Chairman, Erdlen and Hodgman.

Salaries of appointive officers: Marshal \$85.00 per month, Bond \$1,000; Night Police \$85.00 per month, Bond \$750; Street Commissioner \$75. per month, Bond \$500; Town Attorney \$20 per month; Police Magistrate Bond \$1,000.

Street Commissioner, J. P. Harper; Marshal, Chas. Ankele; Night Police, A. Sievert; Town Attorney, Albert F. Miller; Police Magistrate, R. E. Wallace.

Moved and seconded that the man employed to drive city horse and one man to look after irrigation shall receive \$2.50 per day in town warrants and all other employees as common laborers shall receive \$2.00 per day in town warrants for 8 hours labor.

May 6, 1895

Moved and seconded to allow J. L. Marvin's bill for \$60 and hereafter to allow him \$60 per month for sprinkling streets to continue same at the will and pleasure of the board.

Moved and seconded to enter into a contract with the trustees of the K. of P's to rent basement of their new building at the

rental of \$20 per month.

An ordinance regulating the collection of pole tax was read and adopted.

May 20, 1895

Moved and seconded to grant Bateman Hardware the contract to lay water main on 3rd street from center of D to B Streets.

June 7, 1895

The committee on Reservoir recommended that a new reservoir be built and the tiling be put in from Springs to reservoir in place of the wooden flumes and that there be more springs opened. Report accepted and the committee to proceed to build reservoir as recommended.

June 17, 1895

The water ordinance was read by title and placed upon final passage. Carried.

July 5, 1895

An ordinance concerning stock was read on first reading and placed on final passage.

An ordinance concerning sidewalks was read on first reading and placed on final passage.

An ordinance concerning express, cab, Stock and Transfer drivers was read on first reading and passed.

July 15, 1895

Moved and seconded that the committee on Electric Lights be empowered to enter into a contract for 3 years with the Electric Light Co. as recommended (10 lights at \$12.50 per month) also be instructed to stipulate in contract that at any time before the termination of this contract that the production of electricity can be cheapened that the consideration in this contract shall be reduced proportionately.

August 19, 1895

Moved and seconded that the services of the Street Commissioner be dispensed with on September 1st.

Moved and seconded that the clerk be instructed to have a place prepared under stairway of council room to keep all tools belonging to the city, and that the clerk be custodian of all such tools.

October 7, 1895

TAX LEVY: FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE ANNUAL INTEREST UPON THE BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID TOWN A TAX OF 9 MILLS ON THE DOLLAR. FOR THE PURPOSE OF CREATING A SINKING FUND TO PAY THE

BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF SAID TOWN A TAX OF 2 MILLS ON THE DOLLAR.

Moved and seconded that the marshal, Chas. Ankele be granted permission to have 2 weeks vacation the latter part of October as per request.

An ordinance to provide for the issuance of a Bond for the purpose of improving the water works system of the town of Salida was read and passed.
