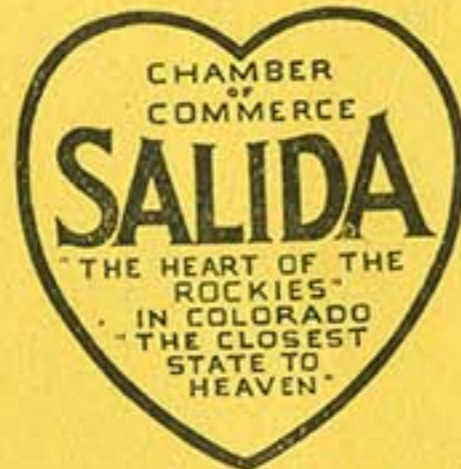

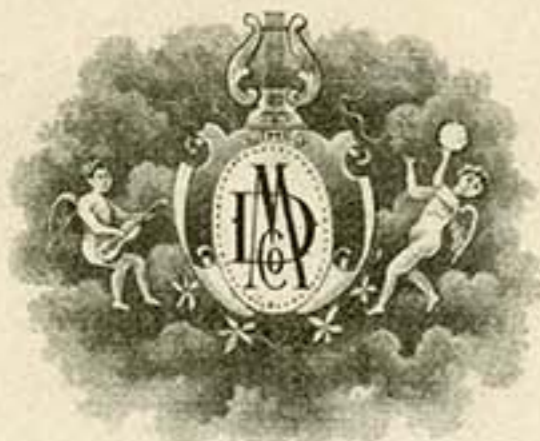

Dear Laura:

I enclose a couple of snaps for your scrapbook. I trust that you enjoy them as much as I did taking them. I showed them to Ralph and he requested a set for his scrapbook. He said that the sign was extremely interesting. I told him that you had promised to save the sign for me, and he said "hurray".

Now as to the matter of Lil Powers. This is confidential. It appears that the D.A. is politically ambitious and wants to make a big showing by enforcing all of the laws impartially. He warned the slot machine operators several times before taking Court action. He took Court action in the case of Lil Powers without warning. When I suggested this to him, he did state that he warned not Lil Powers but some party that was operating the place. This warning was shortly after election, and my guess is that the warning was only luke warm. Lilly Powers is represented by Mr. Stinemeyer, a very reputable attorney at Canon City, so it would have been improper and unethical for me to go to Lilly Powers at your suggestion.

It appears that the certified check is to be returned after one year. It further appears that Lilly Powers has full use of her premises, except that she cannot use them as a "house of pleasure" for "ladies of easy entrance".


