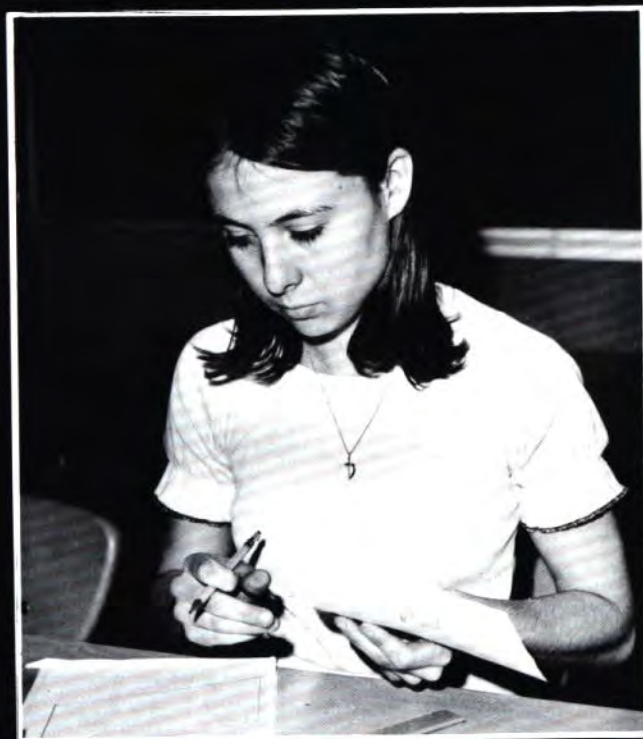

We hope that within the 1973 Le Resume we have captured a few pictures, some typed words, and many memories of Salida High.

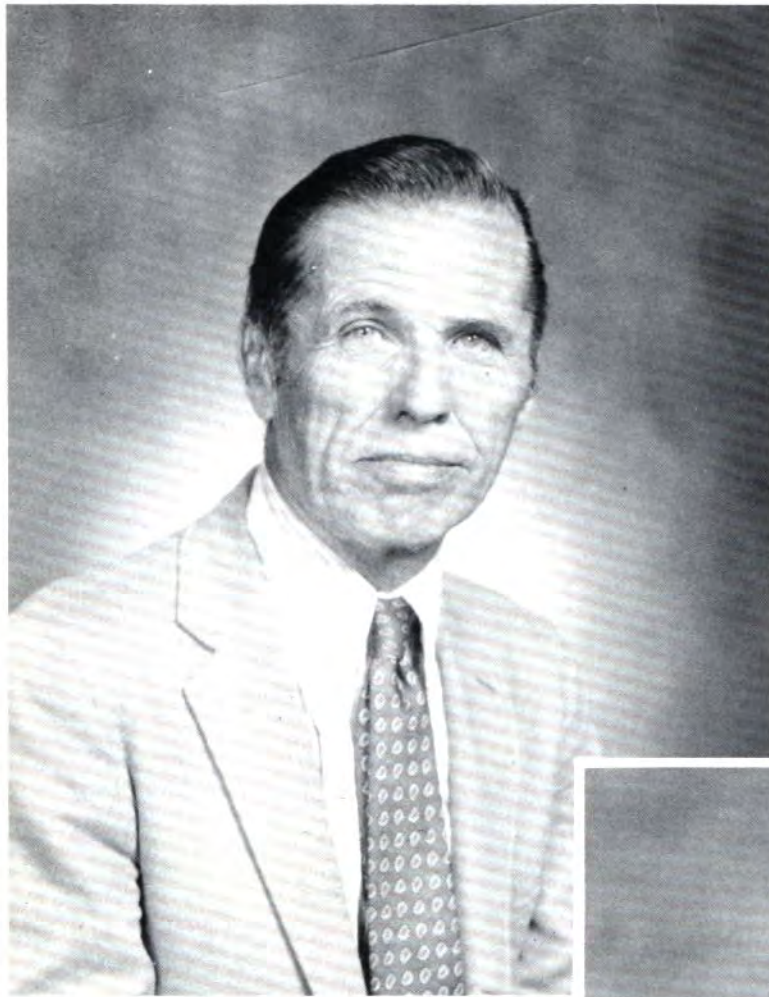

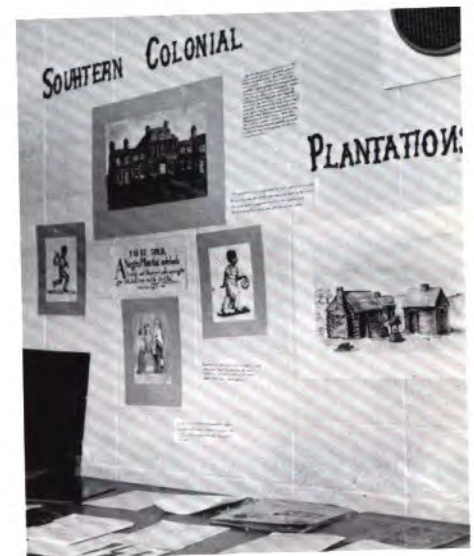

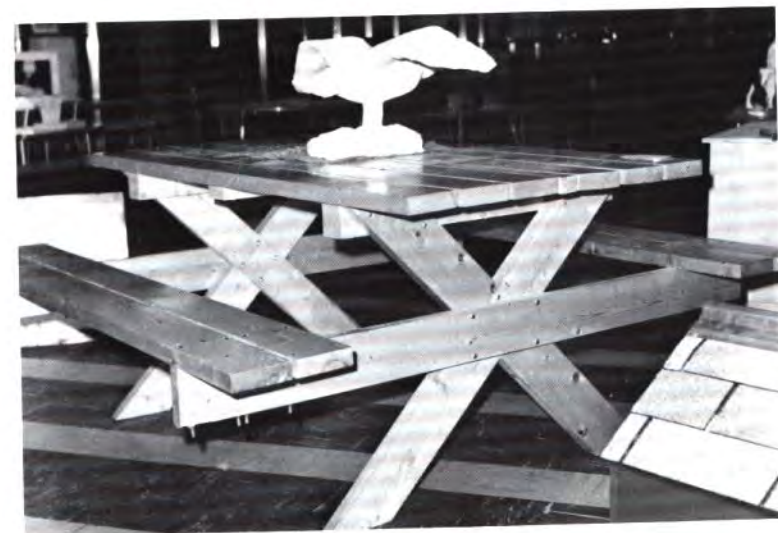

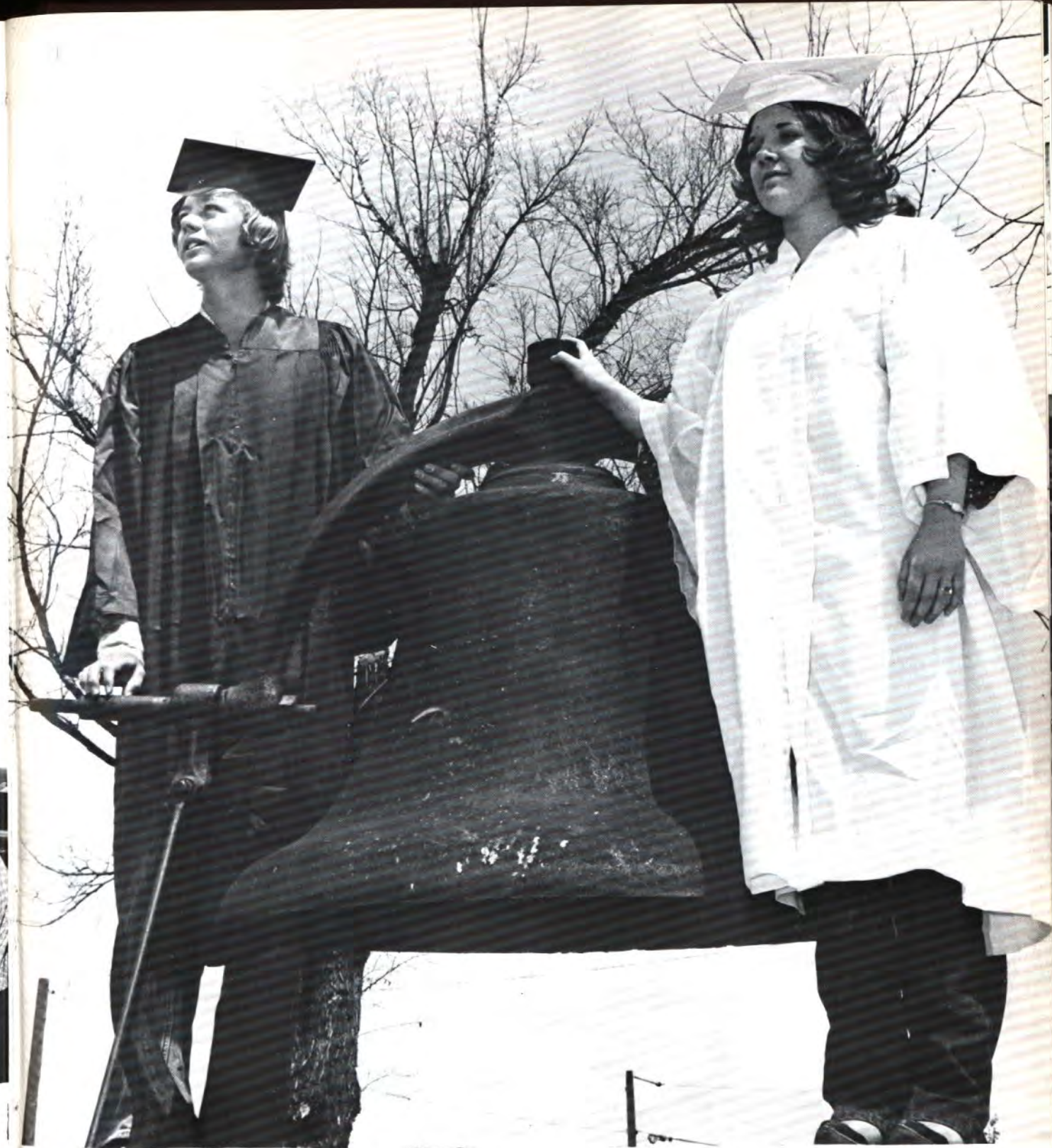

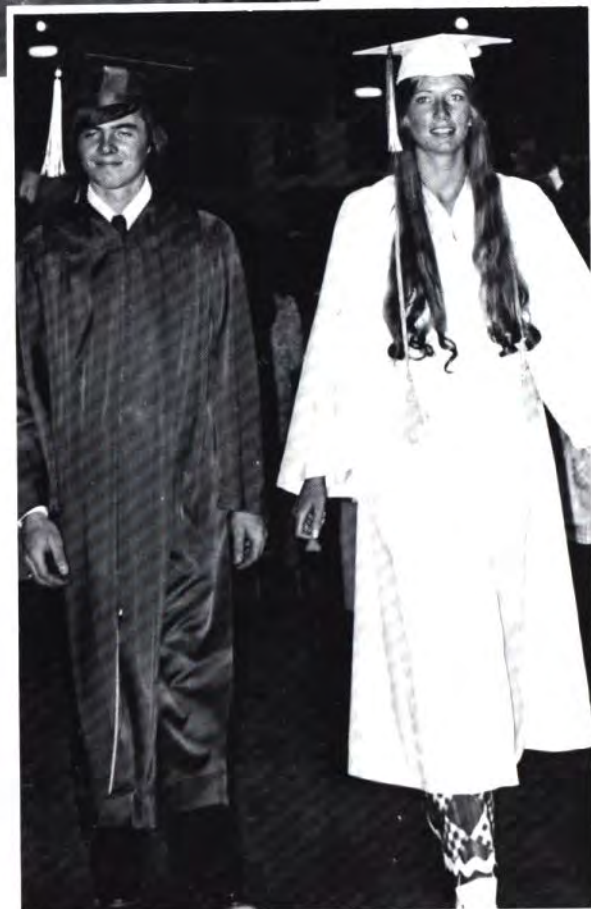

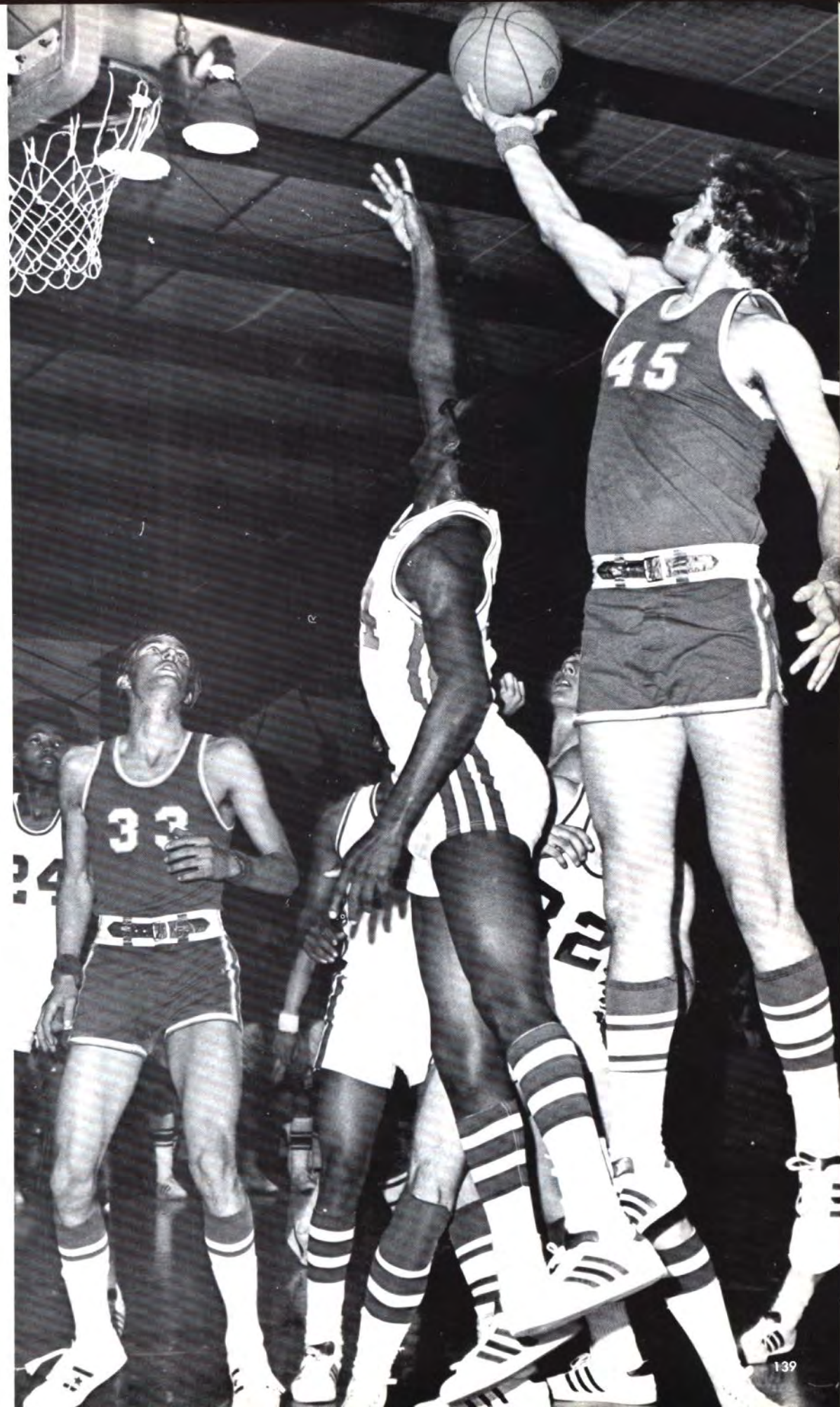

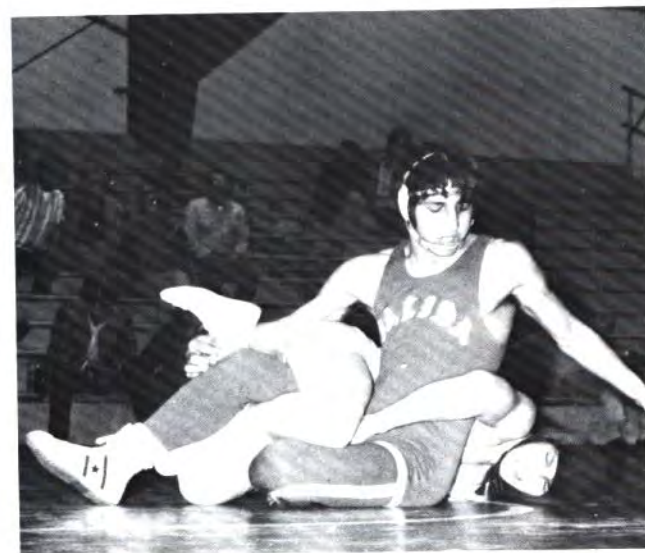

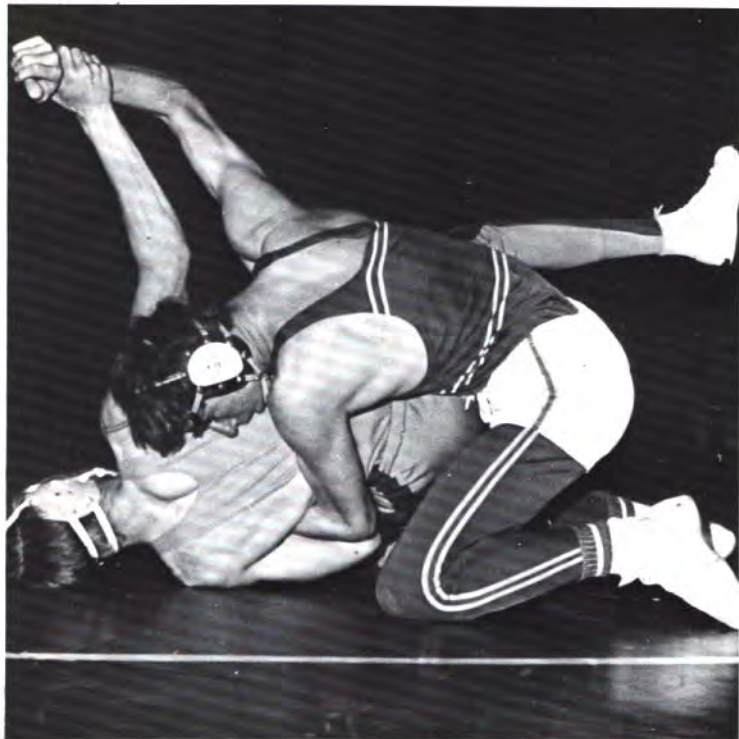

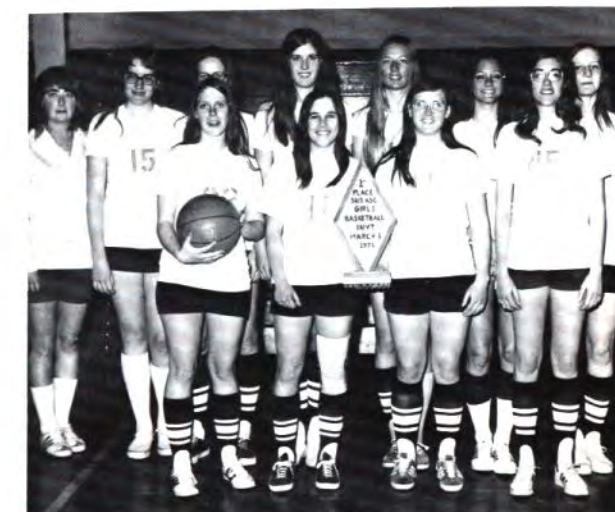

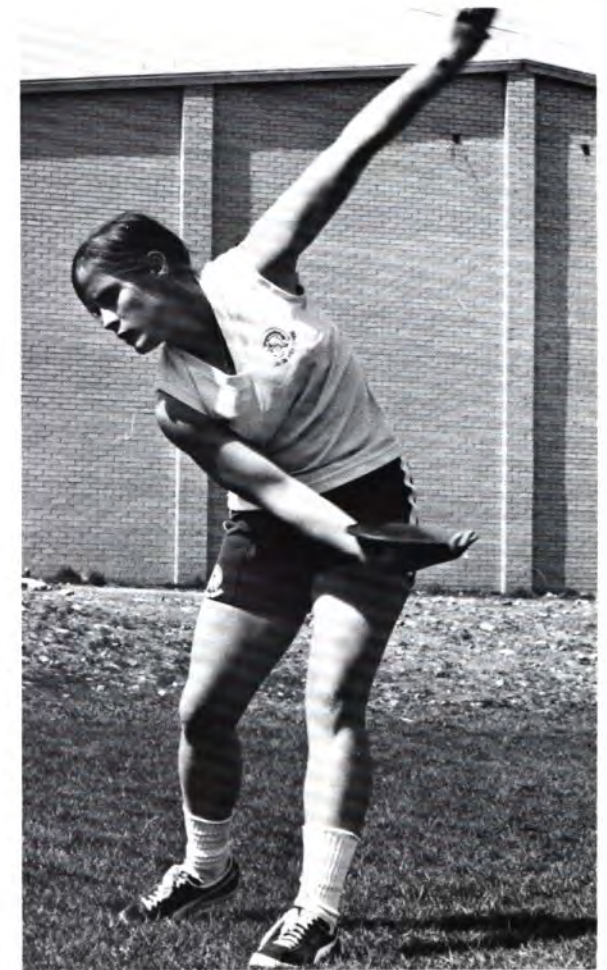
