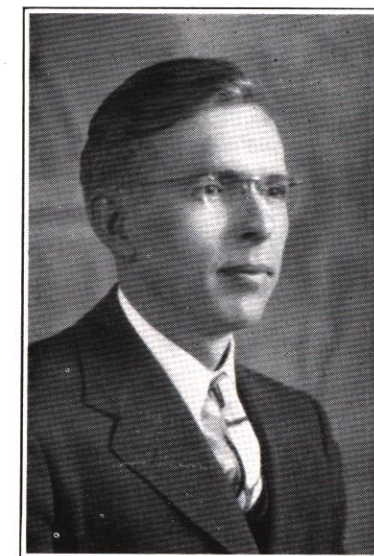

SENIOR CLASS OF '42

CLASS HISTORY

The Class of '42 first enrolled in the Salida High School no greener and no livelier than any other Freshman class. They had a total of 175 members. Their sponsors were Miss Scott and Mr. Hampshire. The Freshies were initiated by the Senior Class a whole week and a Kangaroo Assembly was held on September 30. Later in the year they gave their own assembly and entered a float in the Homecoming Parade. A race was held between the boys and girls for getting the class dues in, the boys losing had to give the girls a party.

After a successful Freshman year the Sophomores were organized with Miss Scott and Mr. Hampshire again as the sponsors. They presented a short assembly and gave an all-school dance in the gym. They entered a float in the Homecoming Parade. Their two candidates winning first and second in the "Smile Girl" contest.

Under the guidance of Mr. King they again became a progressive class. Their Junior candidate won as Queen of the Winter Festival. They presented three pay assemblies and gave a short musical program in a full assembly and presented the Junior Class Play, February 14. They gave the annual Junior-Senior Prom and Banquet May 3, using "Springtime in the Rockies" as the theme.

To start off their final year with a bang, this class brought about a new kind of Freshman initiation. Instead of the old paddle method previously used, they established a more lenient and one that even the Freshman seemed to favor. They chose a Homecoming Queen who was crowned at the football game by the Student Body President, Wendell Hutchinson. They elected a Winter Festival Queen and presented an assembly. A Senior Play was presented by the class under the direction of Miss Scott.

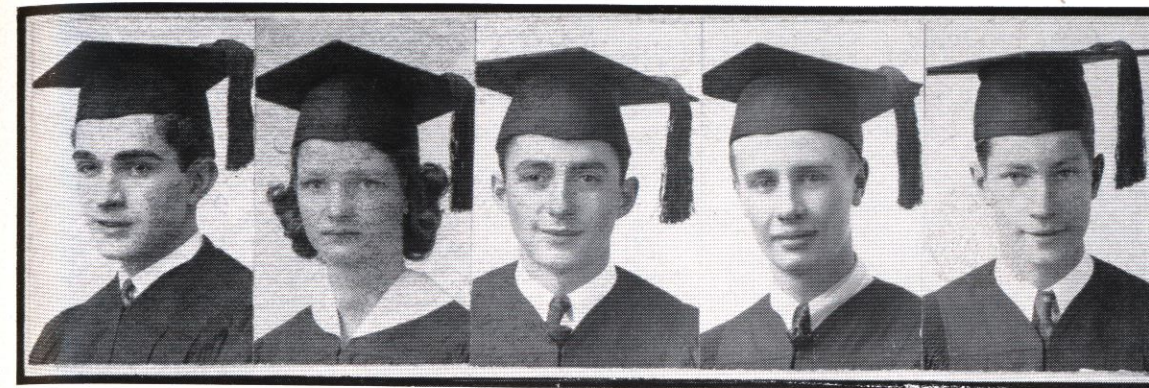

FOOTBALL

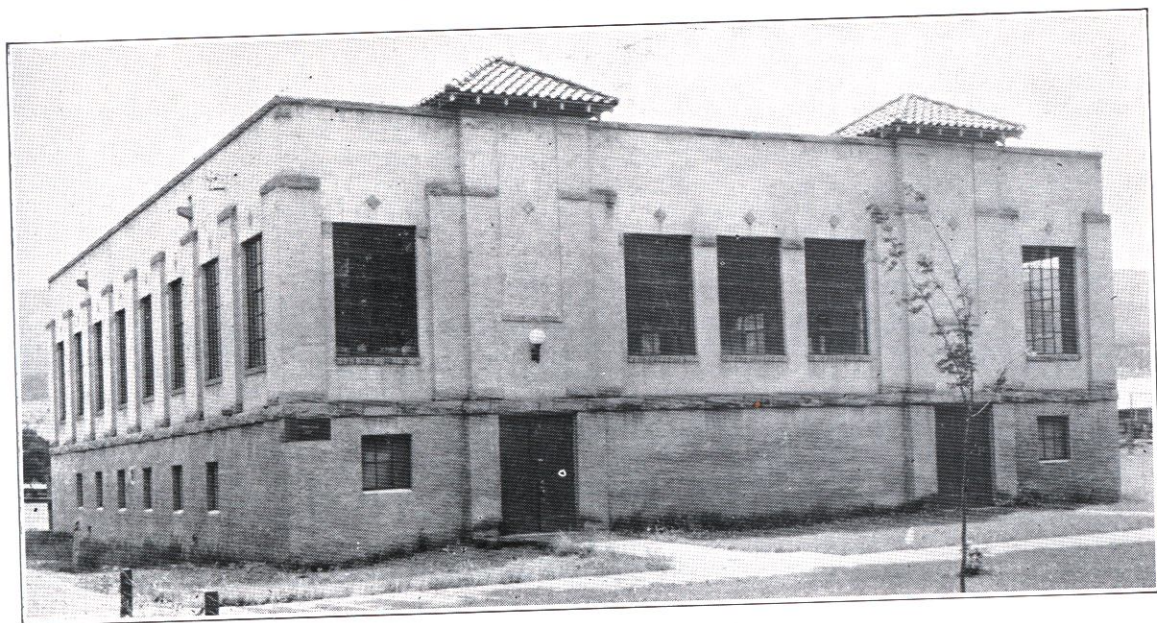

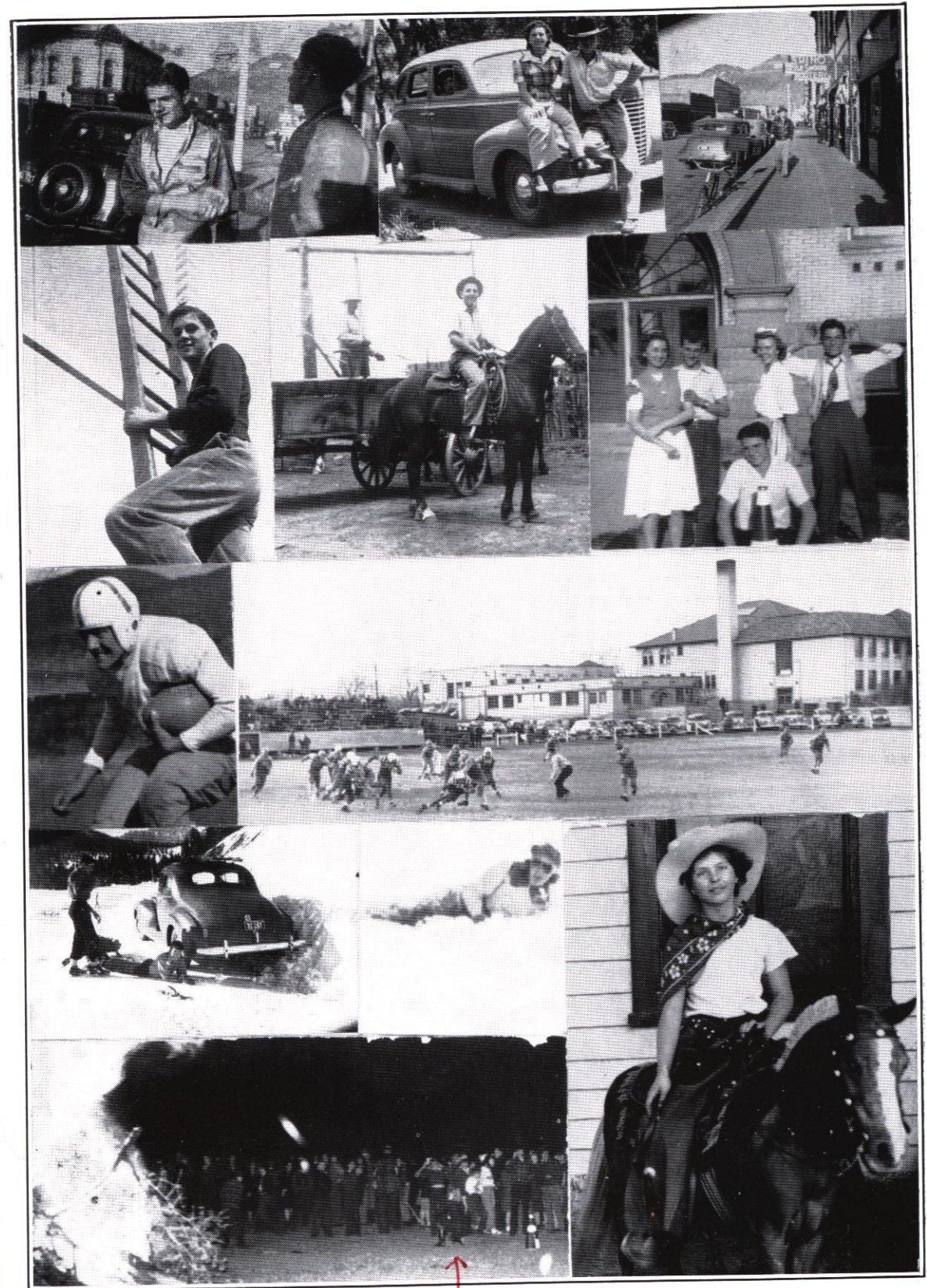

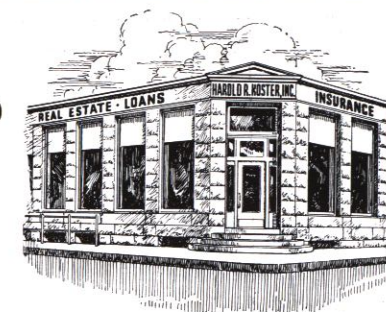
