



CLASS HISTORY

The "Mighty Seniors" of '43 entered the Salida High School as green as any freshman class with 136 members enrolled under Mr. Soles as sponsor. They were properly initiated and to show the school that they were really "something," held a Freshman Week. Included in this were a skating party, a paper, a treat to the school, an assembly and a dance. The little "Freshies" entered a float in the homecoming parade and later had a picnic.

With a class of 100 they advanced to sophomores under Miss Scott as sponsor. During this year an assembly was given on the Kay Kyser order.

The class advanced to juniors with 99 members. Their sponsor again was Mr. Soles. Third prize was received for their float in the homecoming parade. The class play "Young April" was presented under Mr. Custer's direction. The theme of the annual Junior-Senior Prom was of a Hawaiian nature. The banquet was banished because of the war.

While seniors, the class presented a very successful initiation with Mr. King as sponsor. The climax was an assembly where the freshies showed they could "take it." The motto "The best hearts are always the bravest" was adopted by the 59 seniors. Red and white were chosen as the class colors. The red rose was chosen as the flower. Helen McCauley won both as Queen of the Winter Festival and Homecoming. A United States flag and a Colorado flag were presented to the school. An assembly and a class play were given later in the year.

The football season proved to be one of the best for the Spartan squad. After very successfully winning their practice games, they entered into league play and won the championship the second consecutive year.






SPRING FOOTBALL AND TRACK
