On December 14, they held an assembly to discuss the various "squawks" that had come in and also to have reports given by some of the members that had attended the conference.

Throughout the year they sold activity tickets which also proved to be successful. Another project for the year was the opening of the Activity Room for use at noon. They have also put fluorescent lights in the basement of the Senior High building.

At the end of the year, candidates were nominated for the next year's student body president.

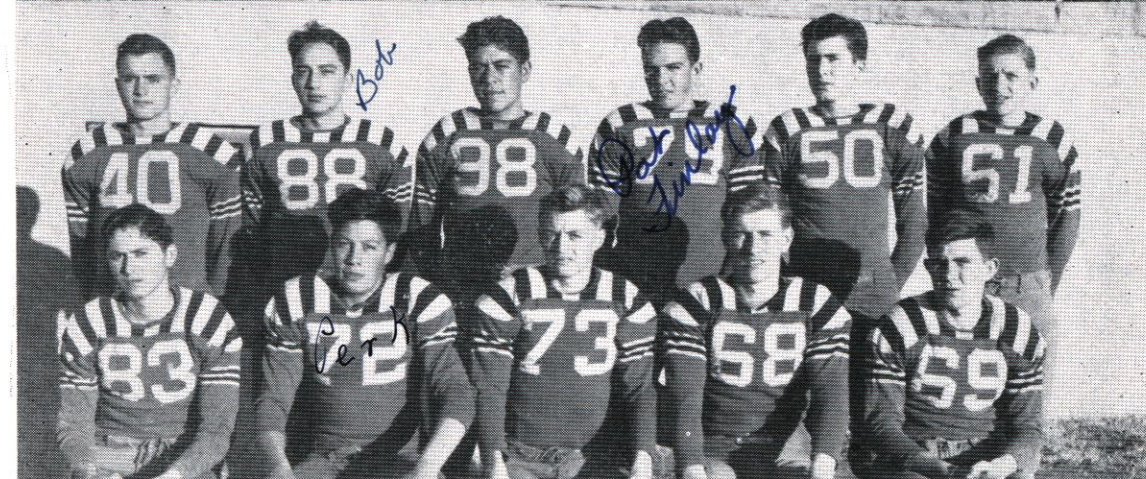
BASKETBALL

Three of the boys, John Leiva, Charles Cribari and Bob Gruenler, were named on the District Tournament team, while John Leiva was chosen as the most valuable player.

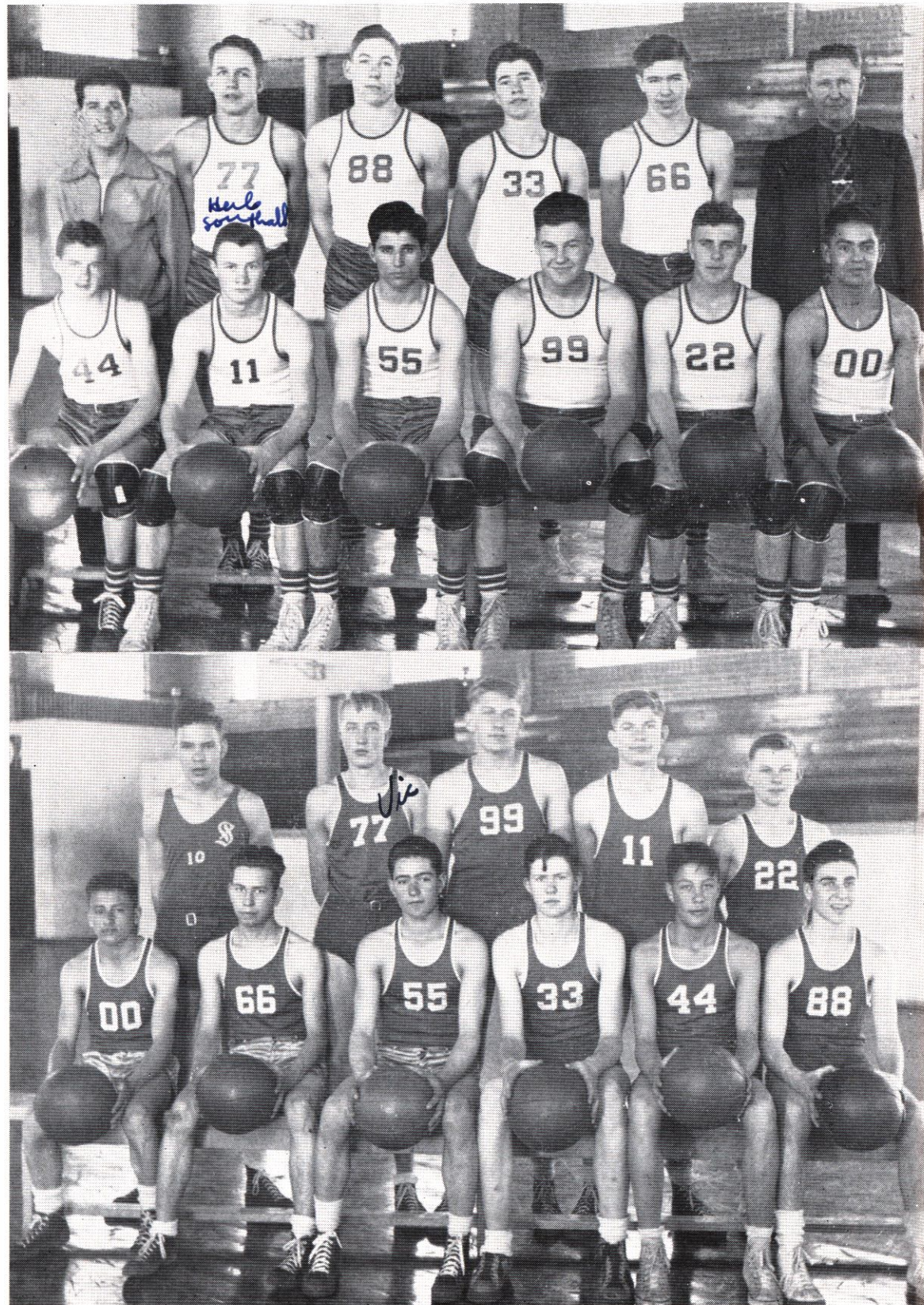

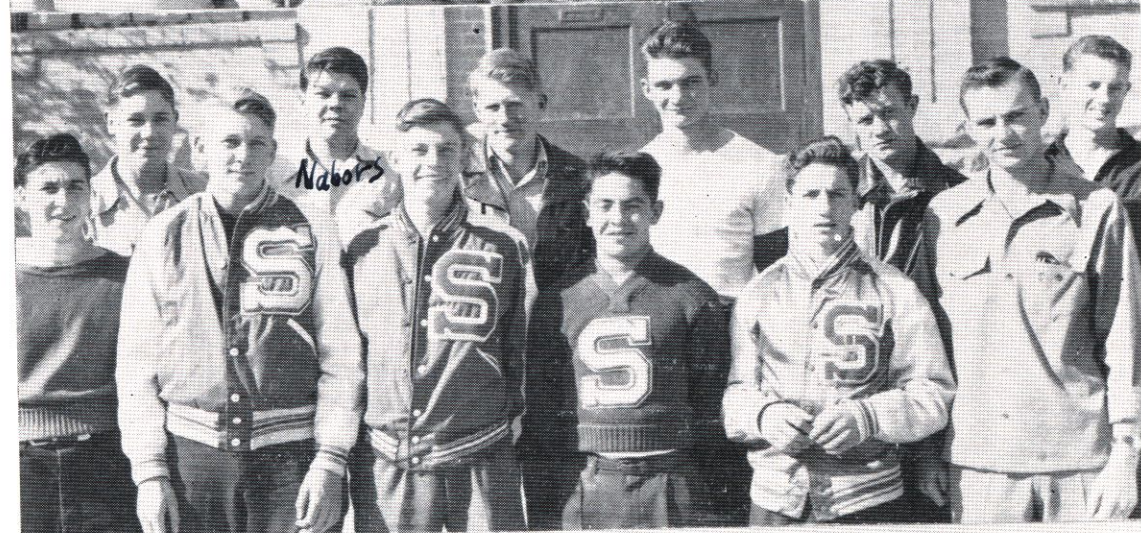
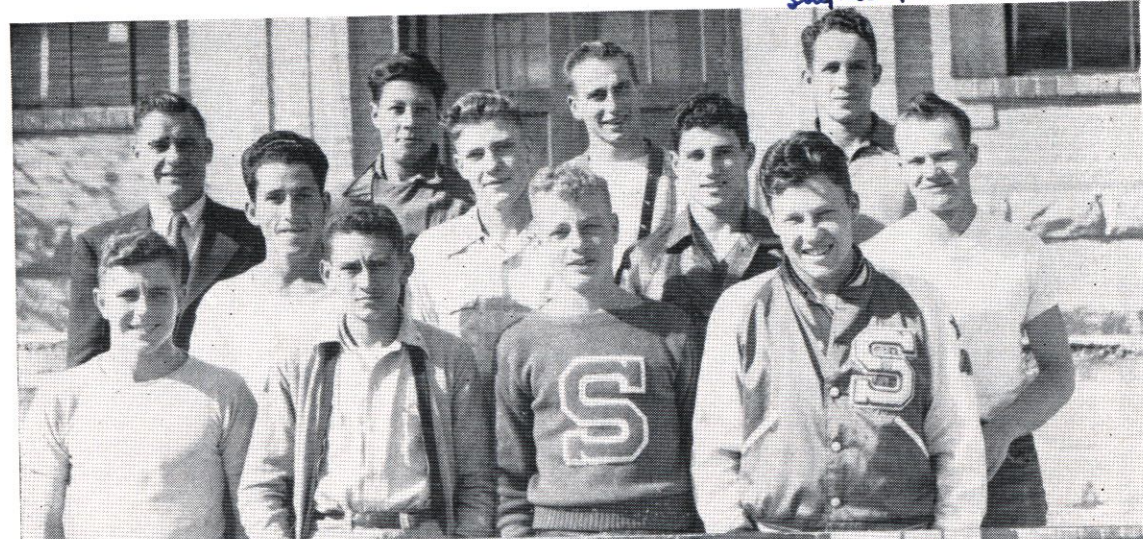
On November 13, we had our annual Homecoming parade. It began at the Alpine Park and went through the down-town business district and wound its way to the high school football field.
