STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council held its first meeting for the new year a week before school was out in 1945. At this time, the new members were introduced and the officers elected. The meeting was then adjourned until the following school term. The new officers were: President, Alfred Trujillo; Vice-President, Gerald Nabors; and Secretary, Shirley McDaniel.

The first activity undertaken was a dance. No admission was charged as it was a "welcome-back-dance." A few weeks later, another dance sponsored by the Student Council was held.

A trip by special bus was made to Pueblo by members of the council to attend the South-Central Association of Student Councils.

On December 14, they held an assembly to discuss the various "squawks" that had come in and also to have reports given by some of the members that had attended the conference.

Throughout the year they sold activity tickets which also proved to be successful. Another project for the year was the opening of the Activity Room for use at noon. They have also put fluorescent lights in the basement of the Senior High building.

At the end of the year, candidates were nominated for the next year's student body president.

Not long ago in 1942, the almighty seniors of 1946 enrolled in the Salida High School as green as any freshman. We held our first freshman meeting in the auditorium with Miss Mosgrove as our sponsor. We entered a float in the Homecoming parade. We also elected Claudine Martin as our Winter Festival queen.

As we graduated from the green worm class into the sophomore class, our enrollment decreased to ninety-one. Under the direction of Miss Scott, our sponsor, we entered a float in the Homecoming parade and won first prize. Rayetta Davidson was elected Winter Festival queen. On St. Patrick's Day we gave an assembly of singing, poems, and a play appropriate for the day. On the same day we enjoyed a St. Patrick's Day party.

In our Junior year, our sponsor was Mr. Soles. It was under his direction that we gave several dances and four pay assemblies. Colleen Moore was elected Winter Festival queen. Our class play, "Secret Service," was given under the direction of Mr. Custer. With the money we received from these entertainments, we financed the Junior-Senior Prom. It was held at the Elk's home and the theme was the nautical motif-"Bon Voyage."

Finally, we had obtained our goal and were the "High and Mighty" Seniors. At the beginning of the year, we did our duty by initiating the freshmen under the direction of Mr. King. Our class motto was: "In ourselves our future lies," with the class flower being the white carnation and the colors purple and white. Colleen Moore was elected Homecoming queen with Gladys Pasquale, Carolyn Ramey, and Alice Argys as attendants. Marilyn Gatterer was elected our Winter Festival queen. During the last semester, we held our class day program which consisted of the will of each senior and the prophecy. We also gave a very successful play under the direction of Miss Scott.

This was one of the most worthy classes to graduate from Salida High School. During our four years in school no one person had taken all the honors for high grades or outstanding leadership records. However, we had but two presidents during our four years. When we were Freshmen, Bill Egley was president. During the three last years Frank Mitchell was the president, who led us out the doors of good old Salida High School.


BURRELBUTT


Salida Homecoming
