In September a class of 88 humble and bewildered freshmen entered high school. The class of 1957 began its freshman year by electing Suzanne Lofgren as President, Don Phillips as Vice-President, Jacque Lotshaw as Secretary, Vivian Houle as Treasurer and Nancy Donnohue, Fred Mahe and Sandra Crawford as student council representatives. The class entered a float in the homecoming parade. After the traditional freshman days, the class assisted the Almighty Seniors in presenting an assembly for the entire student body and faculty.

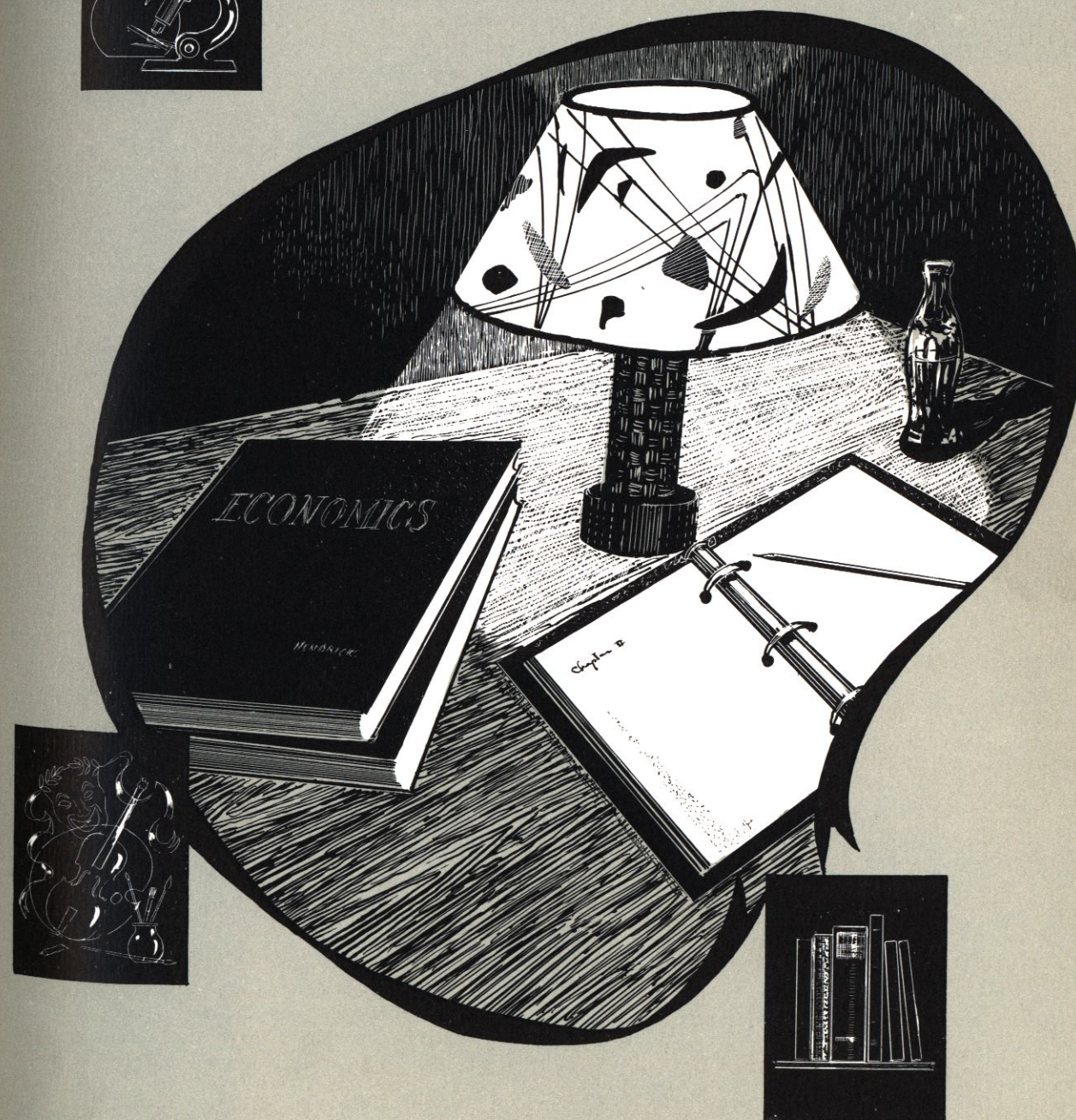
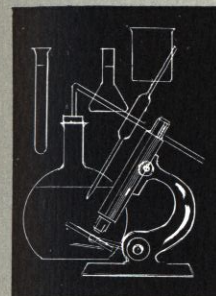
In its sophomore year the class of '57 entered a float in the homecoming parade and took charge of the concession stand for the track season. Mr. Soles was the sponsor for its first two years. Shirley Campton, JoAnn Wall, Vivian Houle, and Jacque Lotshaw were elected President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer respectively. Fred Mahe, Marilyn Struna, and Nancy Donnohue were chosen as student council representatives.

During its junior year, the class, under the sponsorship of Mr. Redman and Mrs. Tarlip, took charge of the concession stand in order to finance the Junior-Senior Prom which was given in the latter part of May. The theme of the prom was "Oriental Gardens." As the result of a tie vote, Don Phillips and Clyde Trainor were Co-Presidents; Pat Rundell, Vice-President, Jacque Lotshaw, Secretary; JoAnn Wall, Treasurer; edged out their opponents in the race for class offices. Sandy Cowan, Fred Mahe, Nancy Donnohue and Marilyn Struna were elected as student council representatives. Sandra Crawford was Winter Festival Queen candidate.

When at last the class reached senior status, it had dwindled to 55. This class again entered a float in the homecoming parade and JoAnn Wall, Sandy Cowan, and Jacque Lotshaw attended the queen, Nancy Donnohue. Dick Wise and Ralph Padoven were football captains. The following were elected to the graduating class' offices: Pat Rundell, President; Lonnie Lantz, Vice-President; Jacque Lotshaw, Secretary; JoAnn Wall, Treasurer, and Don Phillips was elected as Student Body President and Fred Mahe was then Vice-President. Nancy Donnohue, Lloyd Predovich, Sandy Cowan, and Sandra Crawford were elected to the student council. Mr. Redman was sponsor of this class.

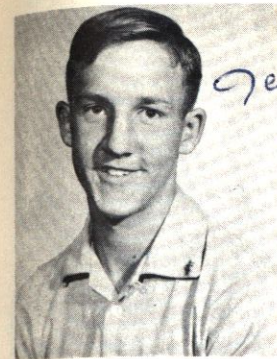
During all four years, the class chose the chrysanthemum as its flower and as its motto, "The greater the obstacle, the more glory in overcoming it." Class colors, in the first two years, were gold and white with blue and silver being chosen for the junior year. As is traditional in Salida High, purple and white were taken as class colors for the senior year. A class day assembly was held in the spring and Baccalaureate was held on May 26. Commencement took place on May 31 in the gym and the members of the class, some feeling a twinge of nostalgia and all feeling triumphant, ended their high school career.

They plan to have charge of the concession stand during the track season.

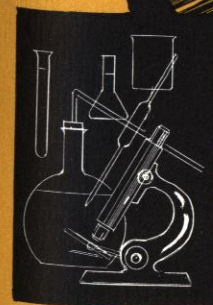
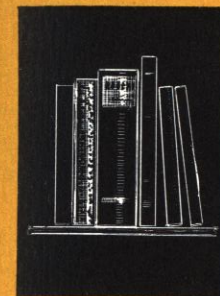
