


BASKETBALL

THE SPARTAN ROUNDBALLERS HAD ANOTHER GREAT SEASON AS THEY POSTED AN 19-4 OVERALL RECORD, AND A PERFECT 10-0 MARK IN PIKES PEAK LEAGUE PLAY.

COACH DON SCHMIDLI WAS NAMED PIKES PEAK LEAGUE "COACH OF THE YEAR" AND ALL OF HIS START-ING FIVE, RICHARD SHARPE, PAT KANE, GREGG LEWIS, JOHN PHILLIPS, AND MIKE HENDERSON, WERE NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAMS.


WITH THE EXCEPTION OF ED SALVI AND JAKE LEEWAY, THE SPARTANS WERE ALL SENIORS, WHICH WOULD INDICATE A BIG REBUILDING JOB NEXT SEASON IF SALIDA IS TO CONTINUE TO DOMINATE PIKES PEAK LEAGUE BASKETBALL.

THE SPARTANS HAVE GONE TO STATE 8 TIMES IN THE PAST NINE YEARS, AND HAVE WON THE LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SIX TIMES AND THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP 5 TIMES IN THAT PERIOD. TWICE DURING THIS TIME THE SPARTANS HAVE BEEN STATE CHAMPIONS, TWICE THEY REACHED THE SEMI-FINALS AT STATE, AND ONCE THEY FINISHED THIRD. ALL THIS, WHILE COMPILING 185 WINS AGAINST 58 LOSSES.

DURING THE 1966-67 SCHOOL YEAR SALIDA HIGH HAD ITS FIRST WRESTLING TEAM. THE SPARTAN MATMEN PARTICIPATED IN THE PIKES PEAK LEAGUE AND COMPILED A RECORD OF THREE WINS, SIX LOSSES, AND ONE TIE IN DUAL MEETS. THE SPARTANS TOOK SIXTH IN THE DISTRICT MEET AND OUALIFIED ONE MAN, 103 POUND FRESHMAN MIKE COAN, FOR STATE.

THOUGH THIS MIGHT NOT BE CONSIDERED OUTSTANDING FOR A SEASONED SQUAD, FEW SCHOOLS HAVE HAD SUCH A GOOD RECORD IN THEIR FIRST YEAR OF COMPETITION.

MR. JIM GENTILE AND MR. JAMES DUNHAM, COACHES OF THE FLEDGLING SQUAD, WERE PLEASED WITH THE RAPID PROGRESS DURING THE YEAR. OF THE 25 SQUAD MEMBERS, ONLY THREE WERE SENIORS, A FACT WHICH SEEMS TO INDICATE BRIGHT PROSPECTS.





The Spartan squad finished third in the district meet to cap their first year of competition.




