## BASKETBALL

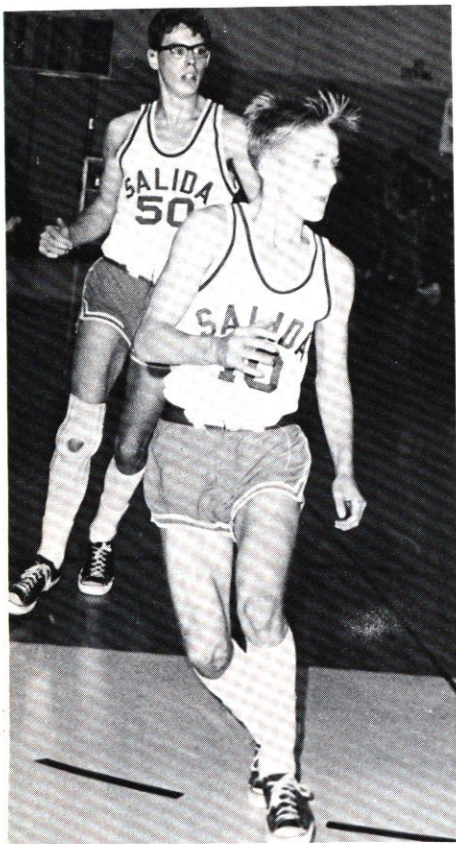
THE SPARTAN ROUNDBALLERS HAD ANOTHER GREAT SEASON AS THEY POSTED AN 19-4 OVERALL RECORD, AND A PERFECT 10-0 MARK IN PIKES PEAK LEAGUE PLAY.

COACH DON SCHMIDLI WAS NAMED PIKES PEAK LEAGUE "COACH OF THE YEAR" AND ALL OF HIS STARTING FIVE, RICHARD SHARPE, PAT KANE, GREGG LEWIS, JOHN PHILLIPS, AND MIKE HENDERSON, WERE NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAMS.

WITH THE EXCEPTION OF ED SALVI AND JAKE LEEWAY, THE SPARTANS WERE ALL SENIORS, WHICH WOULD INDICATE A BIG REBUILDING JOB NEXT SEASON IF SALIDA IS TO CONTINUE TO DOMINATE PIKES PEAK LEAGUE BASKETBALL.

THE SPARTANS HAVE GONE TO STATE 8 TIMES IN THE PAST NINE YEARS, AND HAVE WON THE LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP SIX TIMES AND THE DISTRICT CHAMPIONSHIP 5 TIMES IN THAT PERIOD. TWICE DURING THIS TIME THE SPARTANS HAVE BEEN STATE CHAMPIONS, TWICE THEY REACHED THE SEMI-FINALS AT STATE, AND ONCE THEY FINISHED THIRD. ALL THIS, WHILE COMPILING 185 WINS AGAINST 58 LOSSES.





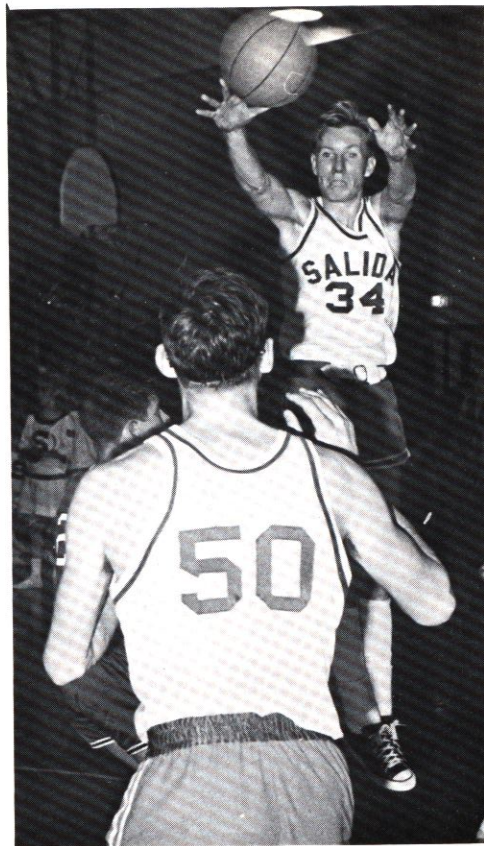

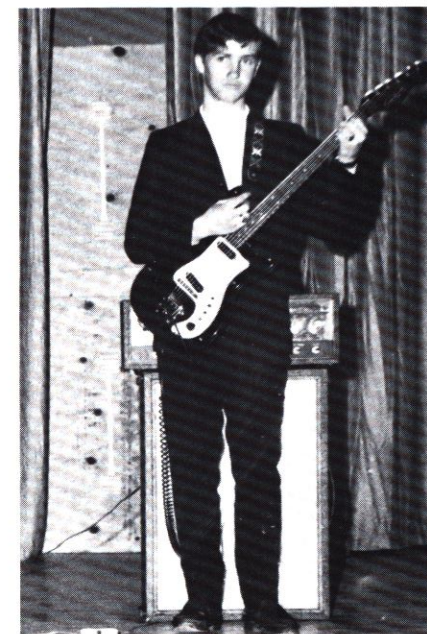
