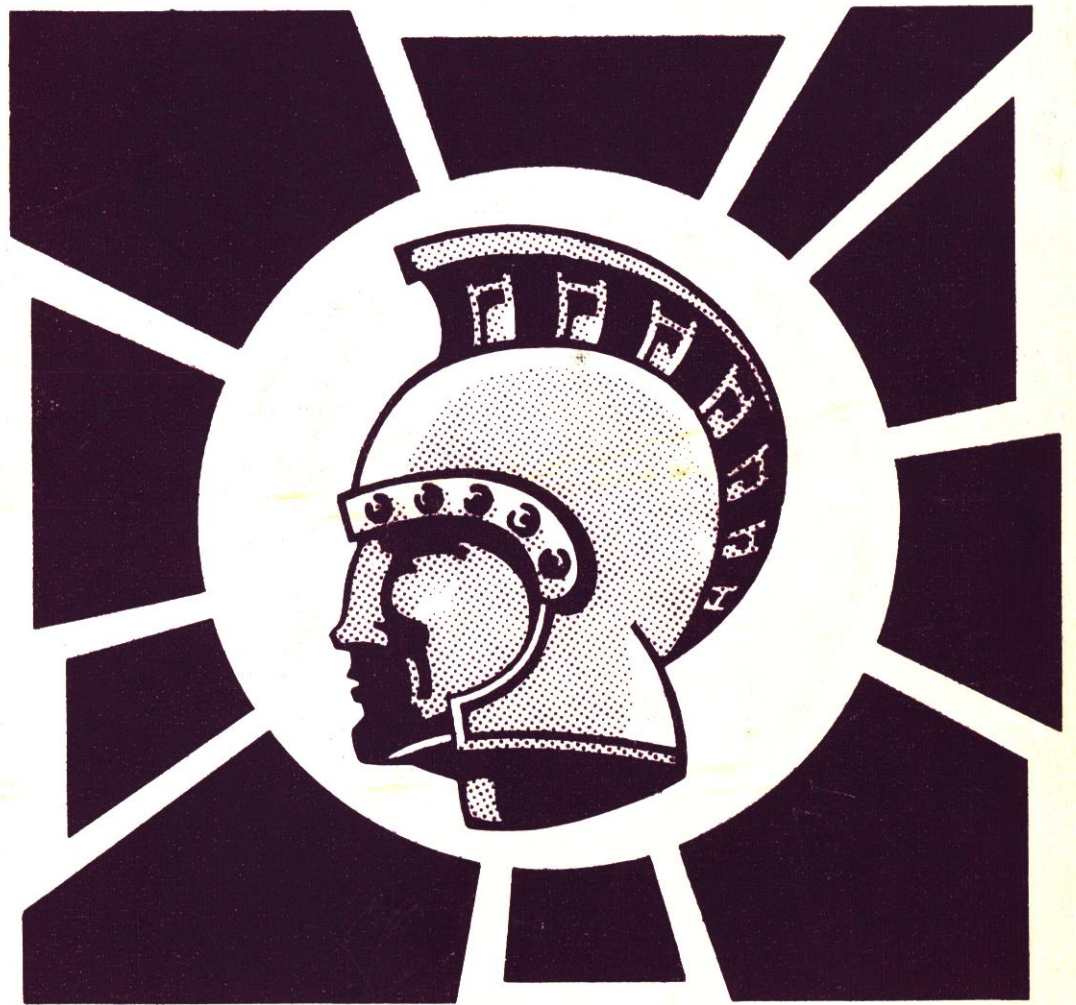

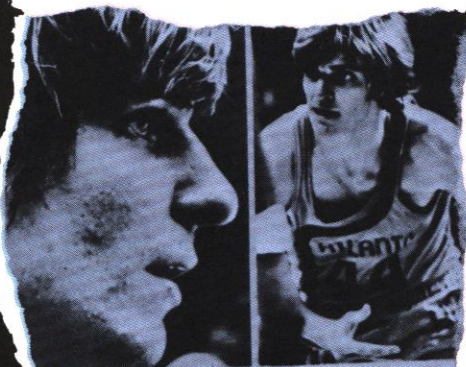
9. Figures on the map indicate the percentages of new voters, aged 18-21, that will be granted the right to vote under a controversial new law passed by Congress.

10. John Wayne is congratulated by Barbra Streisand as he accepts the Oscar for best actor for his performance in "True Grit."

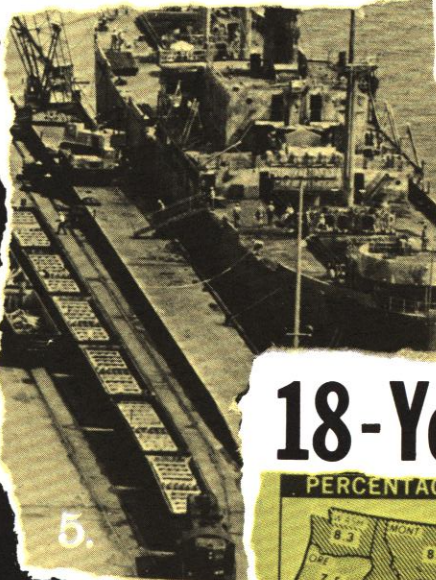
11. In December short shorts and pedal pushers made a comeback for spring in this New York showing.

Dedication

Three people who have meant much to Salida high will not be here when school opens in the fall: Mr. William "Bill" Andreas, Mr. Lauren E. King, and Mr. Joseph W. Soles.

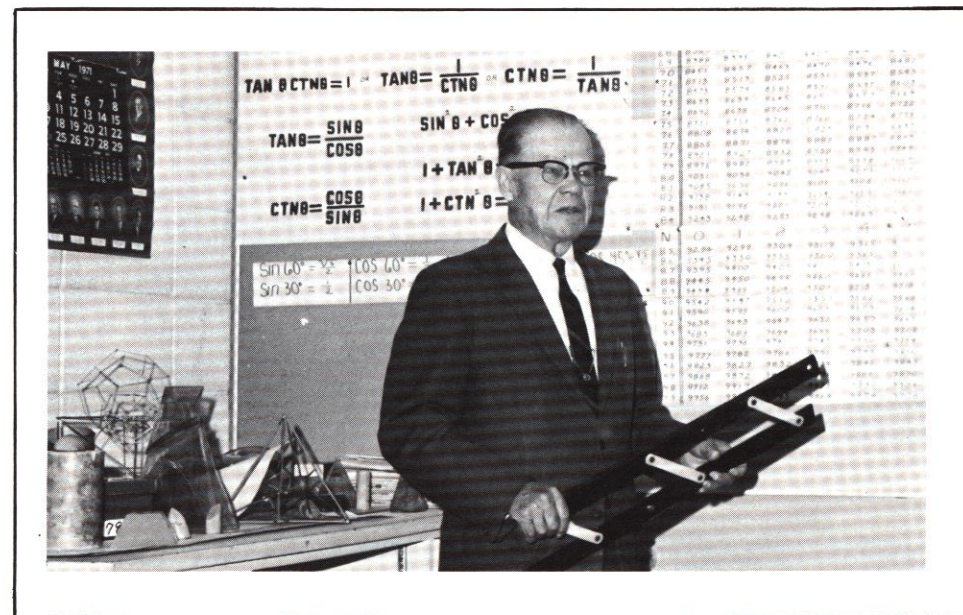


The community was saddened in January when Mr. Andreas, who had been superintendent of schools in Salida since 1965, was taken by death. Under the leadership of Mr. Andreas the physical facilities in the district were practically rebuilt. Salida High, Longfellow Elementary, Larimer Gymnasium, and Andreas Field House were all constructed and furnished during his tenure.

Before becoming superintendent Mr. Andreas had served as a coach and a teacher at Salida high school. He was known as "a friend to all students."



After 40 years of service to education and to the community, Mr. Lauren E. King will retire at the end of this school year. Mr. King came to Salida in 1931 as a language and social studies teacher. He served as high school principal from 1941-1963. Since giving up his principalship because of ill health, Mr. King has taught French and sponsored the National Honor Society.



Mr. Joseph W. Soles will have completed 43 years of service to the school and to the community when he retires at the end of this school year. Three generations of Salida children learned their advanced "Math" from Mr. Soles. Over the years, as he served under four superintendents, Mr. Soles sponsored almost every organization at Salida high, and participated in most of the school's activities.

We dedicate this 1970-71 annual to these three gentlemen - Mr. Andreas, Mr. King, and Mr. Soles - who for so many years dedicated themselves to the young people of Salida.

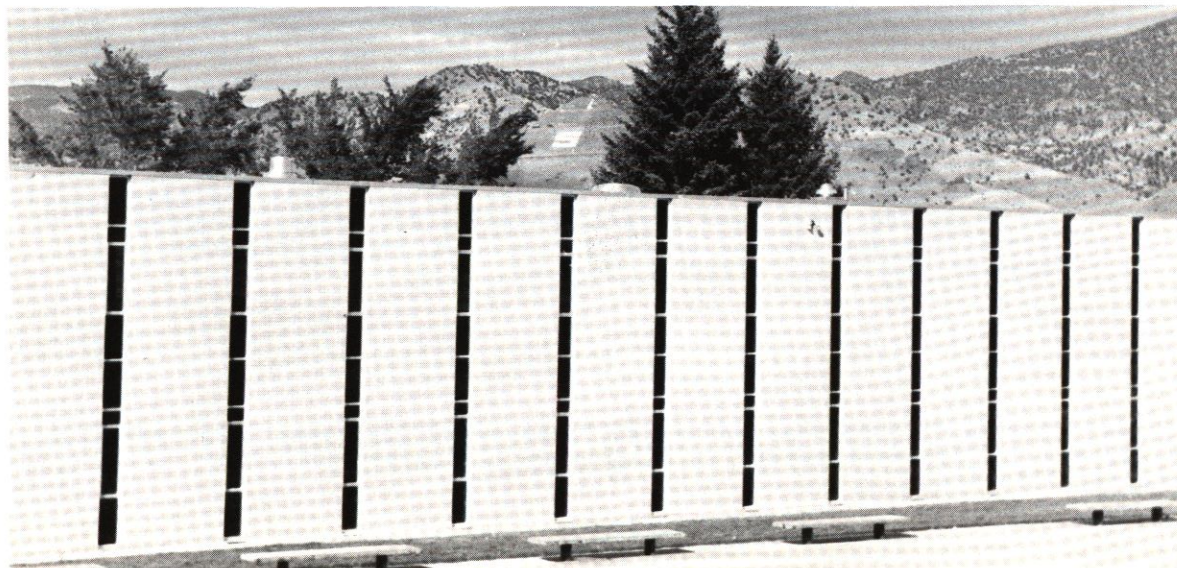
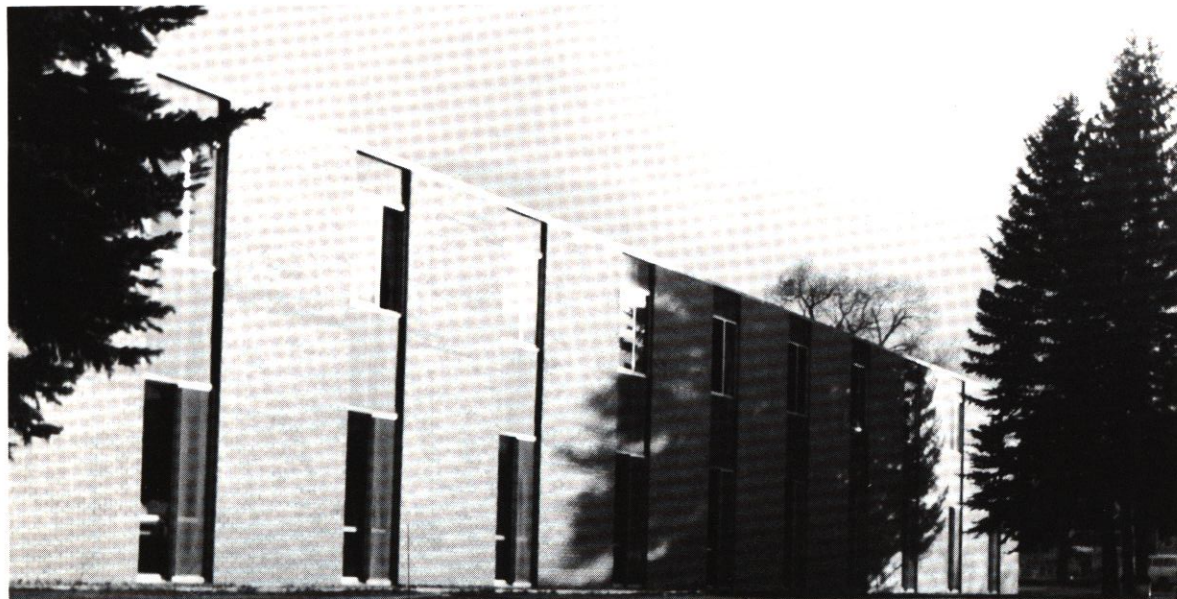

HISTORY CLASSES



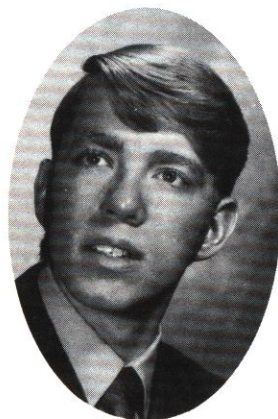

PROM

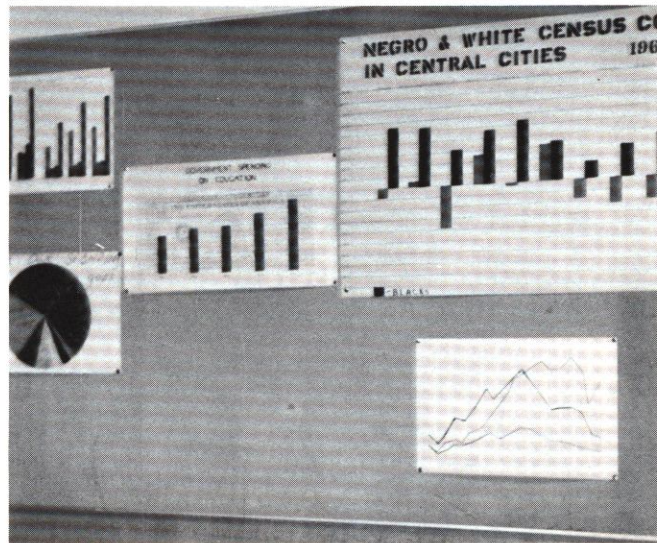

AWARDS

Four seniors, Ed Smith, Cheri Post, Chris Cady and Steve Harrison, seemed to be on stage constantly during the Awards Assembly.

Ed Smith, the retiring student-body president, was there to receive a Scholastic Medal, the Leason Memorial Award, a Certificate of Merit, the Salutatorian Award, and recognition as an Outstanding Scholar. In addition, Ed was the winner of a coveted Climax Scholarship and several athletic letters.

The most important award Ed earned, however, and probably the most important ever earned by a Salida High School student, arrived after graduation: the Presidential Scholarship. Ed was one of only 121 high school seniors from throughout the nation to receive this high award. During June he and his parents traveled to Washington at government expense. In ceremonies at the White House, President Nixon presented the scholarship to Ed.

Cheri Post, the Valedictorian of the Class of 1971, also received several important honors. In addition to a scholarship to the University of Colorado, Cheri was the recipient of a Scholastic Medal, a Merit Award, the Readers Digest award, and an award for her work on the Annual staff.

Steve Harrison, vice-president of the student-body, was honored with two of the most important awards presented at the assembly: the Harold R. Koster award, and the American Legion Medal. In addition, Steve received the "I Dare You" award, a Cross Country letter, and a scholarship from Colorado School of Mines.

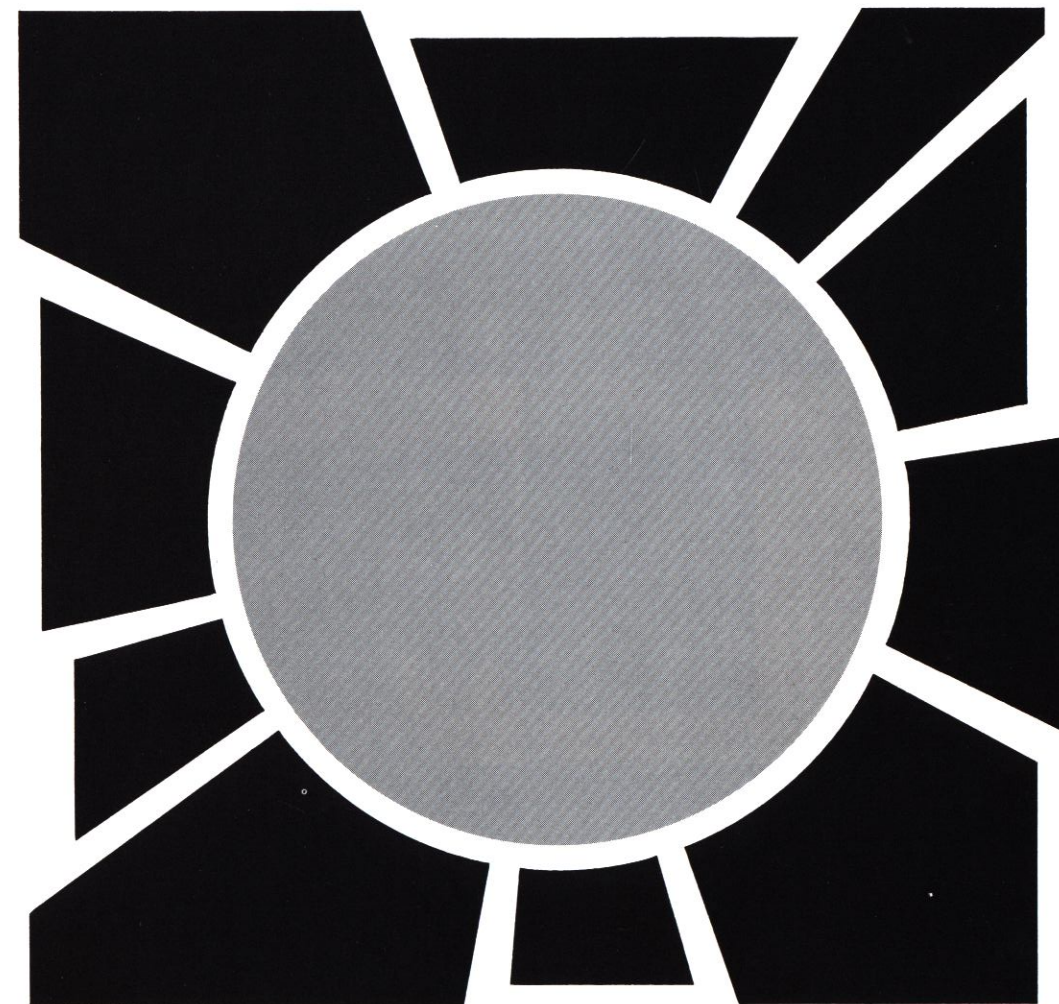
Chris Cady, who won a scholarship to Ft. Lewis College, was the female recipient of the Koster award and the American Legion Medal.

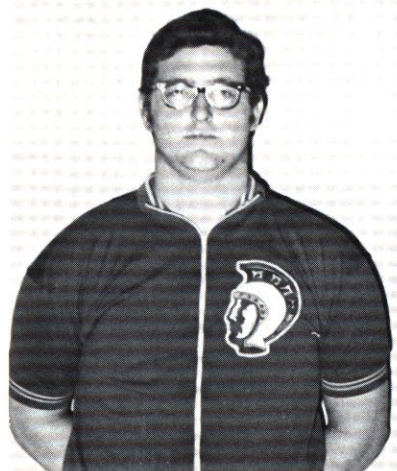
WRESTLING

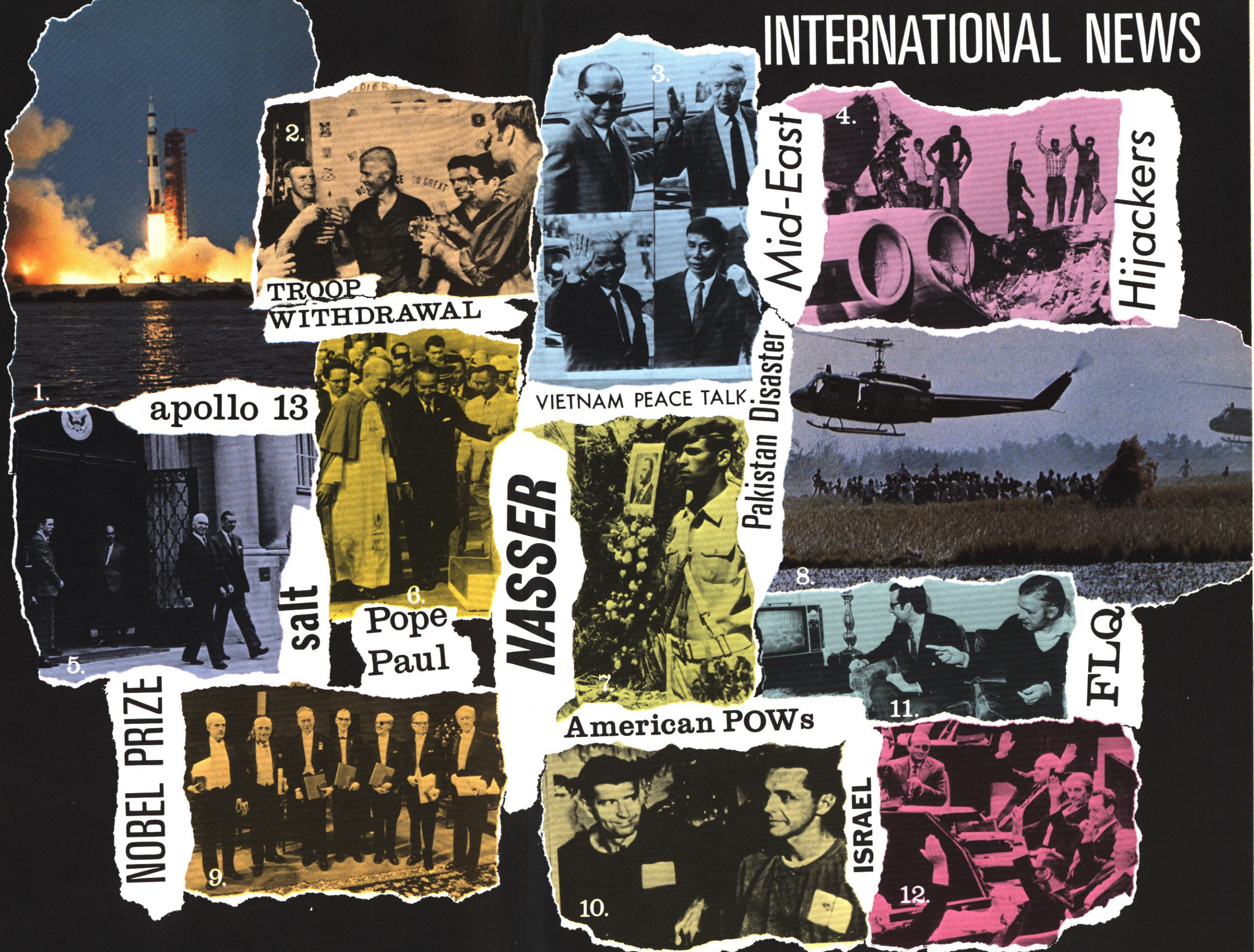
