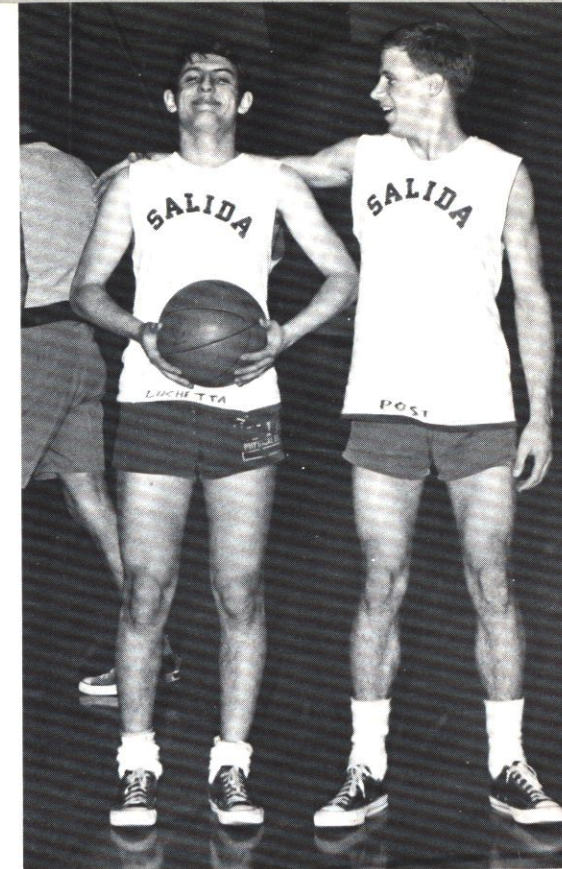
Salida hoopsters had a 12-7 record for the season and finished second in the Pikes Peak league race.

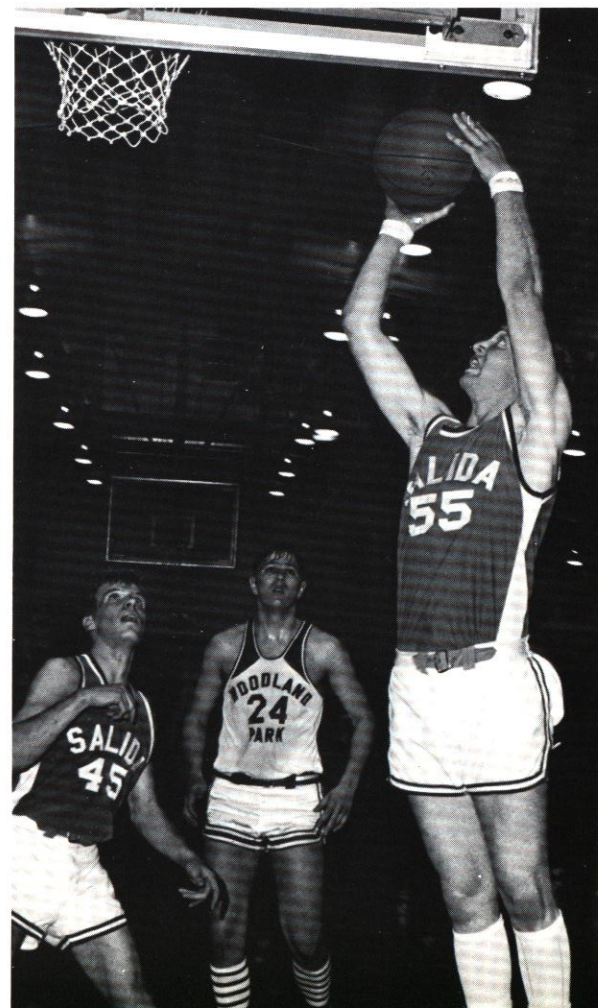
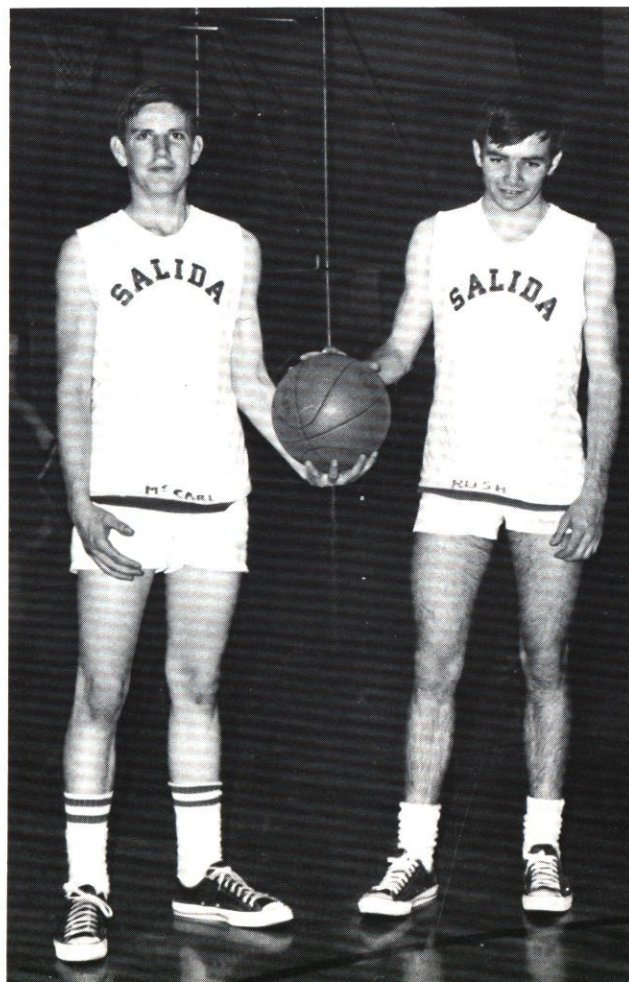

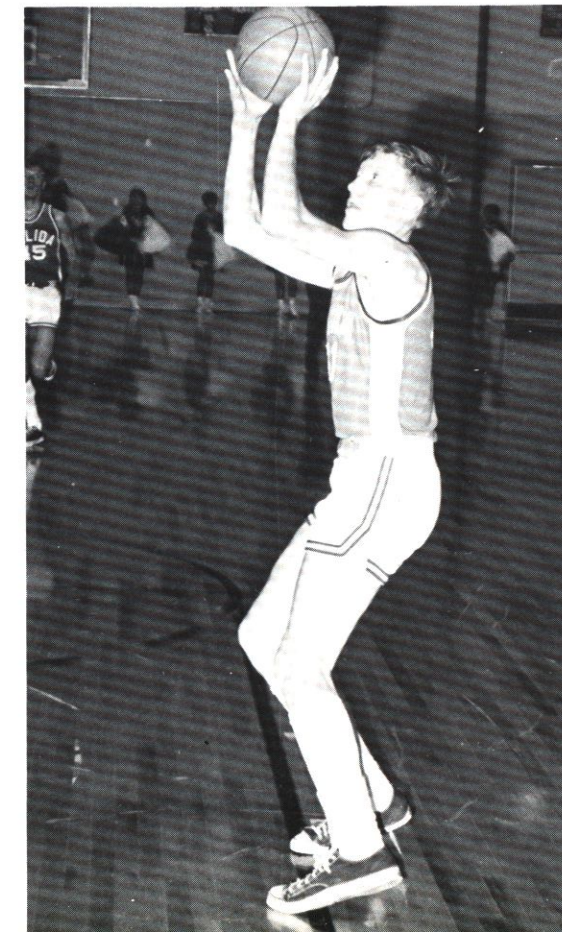

A big milestone in the coaching career of Don Schmidli was reached during the 1968-1969 season when the Spartan basketball squad won their 200th game under his direction. By the end of the season, his fourteenth at Salida, Coach Schmidli's record showed 205 wins against only 78 losses.

In his first season, 1956-57, the Spartans just about broke even, losing every game they played on the road and winning each home contest--except the last one, a loss to La Junta.

The next year, however, Salida finished 15-6, as the greatest era in Spartan basketball got underway. In the nine year period which followed, the Spartans were to win or share eight championships and made seven trips to the state tournament. Those seven trips to "State" yielded a Class "A" championship in 1960-61, and a Class "AA" title in 1963-64. In addition, the Spartans had a second place finish in 1962-63, and brought home the third place trophy after the 1964-65 tournament.

Through the years Coach Schmidli's teams have provided the Coach with some gray hairs and the fans with many thrilling moments. Probably the most memorable game was the quarter-final state championship contest against Brush in 1963, which the Spartans won 66-62, after five over-times, a state tournament record.

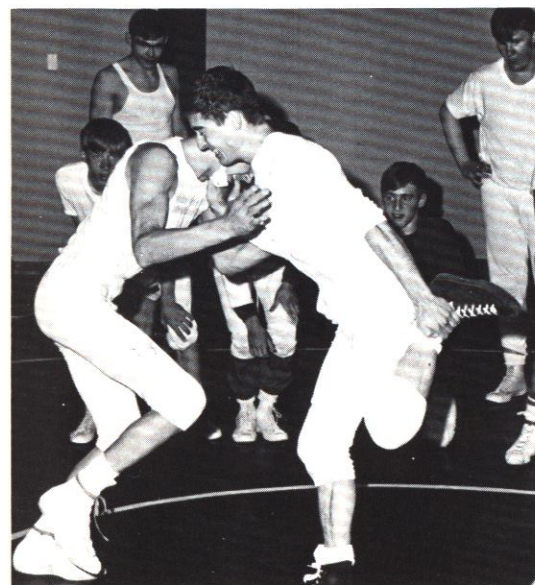

The girls' track squad had the best season of their brief history as they dominated the league meet and had six girls qualify for "state" at the district meet. Miss Barbara Riley, coach of the team, was able to report that five girls, Barbara Mooney, Peggie Conroe, Laurie Everett, Margaret Dunckhorst, and Regina Gustafson, won a total of 36 ribbons in five meets. Twenty of this total, moreover, were first place ribbons.

Other members of this team were Peggie Conroe, Barbara Mooney and Margaret Dunckhorst. Margaret also qualified for the shot-put with a third place, and came in second in the broad jump. 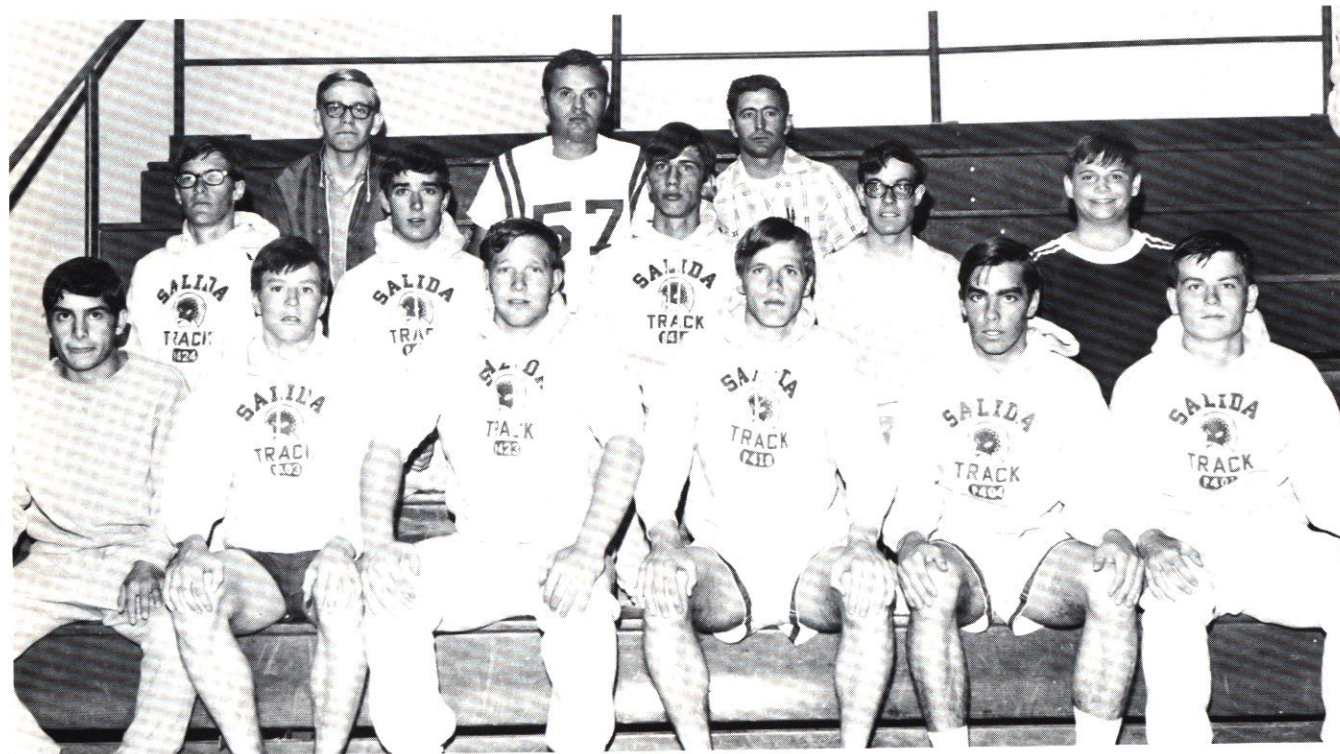

The track squad had one of its best seasons in many years, as Coach Gary Lyons' boys added four trophies to the Salida High Collection. The Spartans took first place in the Western State College Invitational and won the Salida Invitational. They took second in a meet at Rocky Ford, and third in the Pueblo Invitational. Mike Lewis, who took second in the pole vault at state, qualified for the state meet in four events: the 220 yard dash, the pole vault, and the 880 and mile relay teams. 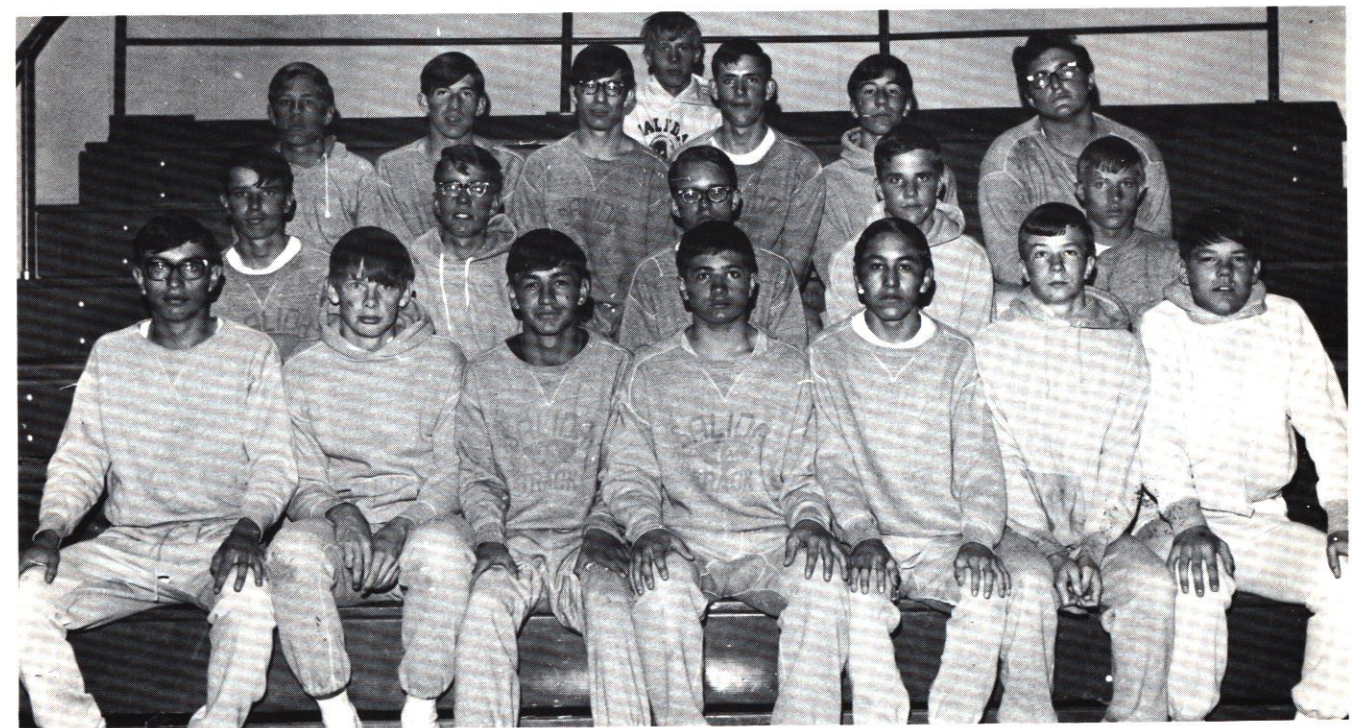

Steve Russell served as president for the group during the 1968-69 school year. Mike Coan was vice-president and Terry Witty acted as secretary-treasurer.

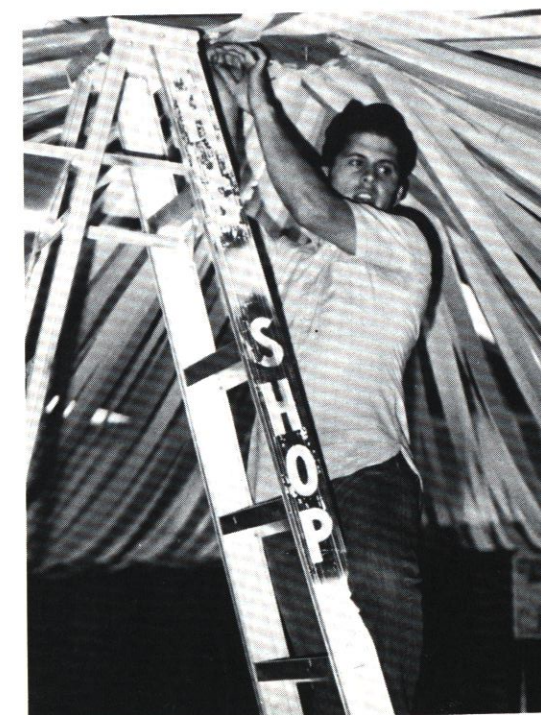
