

Reflecting on a Perfect Homecoming by Stephanie Edmonds
























"We have put out four more issues than last year and I feel that they have been much bigger and better," Editor Tyler Whaley said.


A change in progress is the addition of four new computers to the program. The old computers are extremely difficult to work with and cause much stress for the staff-they

No matter what obstacles stood in the way for the 2001-2002 Tenderfoot Times newspaper staff, they always seemed to pull together and succeed. Just look at their















Kudos go to the ladies including Sr. Kelsie Holmes who holds new records of her own now. It will be tough to replace these young women, but many are waiting to make their mark.
















