Mr. Kapushion's Playlist

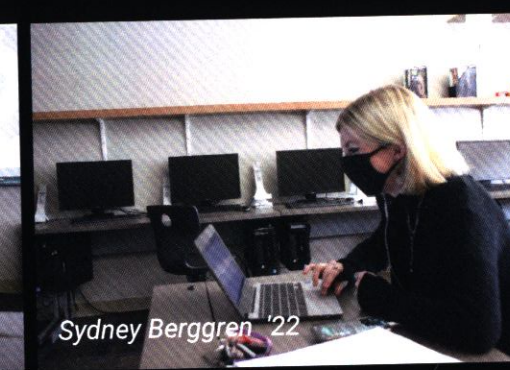

Our Spanish Playlist



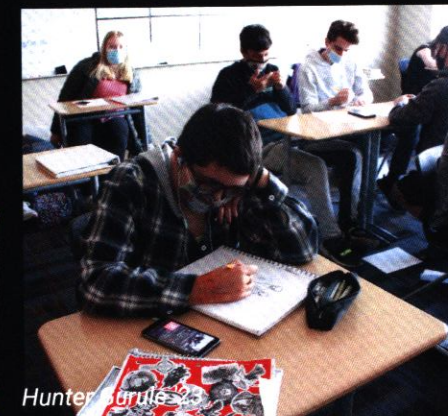

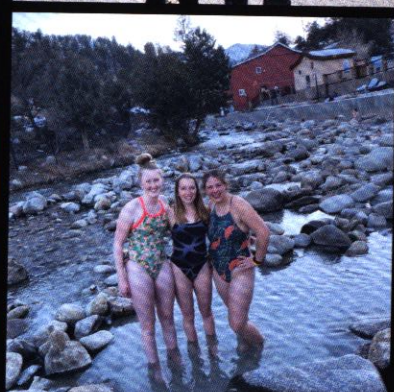
Our Wrestling Playlist

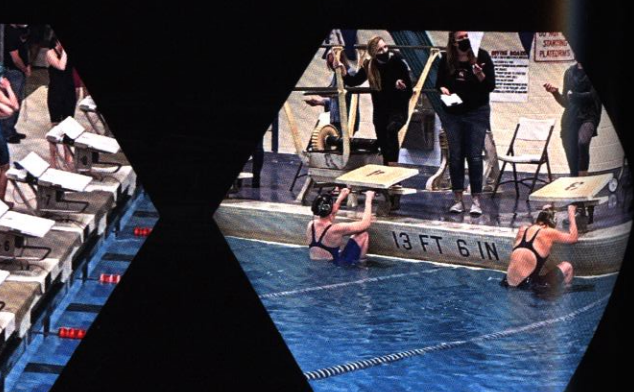
Our Swimming Playlist
